HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners VV for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirtysecond years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-fifth day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirtythird and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called "the said benefice") of Long Compton, in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Worcester.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Long Compton is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession in the Provost of the | of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 1st | College Royal of the Blessed Mary of Eton, near unto Windsor, in the county of Bucks, commonly called The King's College of our Blessed Lady of Eton, nigh or by Windsor, in the said county of Bucks and the same College.

"And whereas the said Provost and College are desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Long Compton, now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Worcester.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Huyshe Wolcott, now Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them is made necessary, he the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester, has executed this scheme as hereafter mentioned.

"And whereas it appears to us that the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Long Compton which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereafter recommended and proposed will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as

aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Long Compton. "Now therefore, with the consent of the said Provost and College of Eton (in testimony whereof they have sealed this scheme with their corporate or common seal) and with the consent of the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Long Compton now vested in them, the said Provost and College of Eton as aforesaid, shall be transferred from them to the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester, and his successors, Bishops of the same diocese, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester, and by his successors, Bishops of the same diocese, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Worcester.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninetyfour, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the sixteenth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

words and figures following, that is to say: "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninetyfour, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint James, Milton, and of the new parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, both in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order in Council of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, bearing date the fourth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five, and published in the London Gazette

on the second day of May in the same year, part of the parish of Portsea, in the said county of Southampton and in the said diocese of Winchester, was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of All Saints, situate in the said parish of Portsea, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of All Saints, Portsea.'

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the eighth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and published in the London Gazette on the fiftcenth day of the same month, part of the said parish of Portsea was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint James, situate at Milton, in the said parish of Portsea, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint James, Milton.'

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the seventeenth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and published in the London Gazette on the nineteenth day of the same month, part of the said parish of Portsea was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Mark, situate at North End, in the said parish of Portsea, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint James, Milton, and the said district chapelry of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, have under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become new parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint James, Milton, and the said new parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, shall be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint James, Milton, and of the said new parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, shall be altered so that (firstly) all those portions of the said district chapelry of All Saints, Portsea, of the said new parish of Saint James, Milton, of the parish of Wymering and of the extra parochial place called Great Salterns, both in the said county and diocese, which are described in the first schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, and (secondly) all those portions of the said parish of Wymering

annexed and are thereon coloured green shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the , said new parish of Saint James, Milton.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester, being :-

"I. All that portion of the district chapelry of All Saints, Portsea, in the said county and diocese, which is bounded upon the west, upon the north, and upon the east by the new parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, partly by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Stephen, Portsea, in the said county and diocese and partly by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Stephen, Portsea, from the said district chapelry of All Saints, Portsea, at the junction of Gamble-road with the road called Kingston-crescent, and extending thence first north-westward and then south-westward along the middle of Kingston-crescent for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Twyford-avenue upon the boundary which divides the said district chapelry of All Saints, Portsea, from the said new parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea.

"II. And also all those contiguous portions of the parish of Wymering, of the new parish of Saint James, Milton, and of the extra parochial place called Great Salterns, all in the said county and diocese, which taken together lie to the east of an imaginary line drawn along the middle of Tipner Lake, to the south of a similar line drawn along the middle of Hilsea Creek otherwise known as Port Creek, and to the west of a similar line drawn along the middle of the London and South Western and London Brighton and South Coast Joint Railway.

"The Second Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the said new parish of Saint James, Milton, being :-

"All those contiguous portions of the said parish of Wymering, of the said extra parochial place called Great Salterns which taken together lie to the west and south of an imaginary line drawn along the middles of Broom Channel and Hilsea Creek, otherwise known as Port Creek, and to the east of a similar line drawn along the middle of the said London and South Western and London Brighton and South Coast Joint Railway."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation,

every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.

' HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirtyseven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixteenth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say :-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the parish of Kingsthorpe and partly out of the new parish (some-time district) of Saint Paul, Northampton, both in the county of Northampton and in the diocese of Peterborough.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said parish of Kingsthorpe and the said new parish of Saint Paul, Northampton, are cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Kingsthorpe and of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Northampton, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas the trustees of the will of the late John Beck Wickes, formerly of Boughton in the said county of Northampton, Clerk ingHoly Orders, have contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of four thousand three hundred pounds towards the endowment of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said new parish and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being, and we and to order and direct that the same and have in respect of such sum agreed and have undertaken to provide and pay by equal quarterly payments on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each and every year to such Minister or Incumbent as aforesaid when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the lastly mentioned Act the sum of one hundred and twenty-nine pounds per annum so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands.

"And whereas the said capital sum of four thousand three hundred pounds sterling has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a capital sum of seven hundred pounds sterling in respect of which there shall be paid by us to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish when duly licensed as before mentioned a yearly sum of twenty-one pounds, and upon the further understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas the said grant of seven hundred pounds sterling will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us the said Commissioners under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven.

"And whereas the contributors of the said sum of four thousand three hundred pounds have nominated the Bishop of Peterborough for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall be assigned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Honourable and Right Reverend Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Kingsthorpe and of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Northampton, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Holy Trinity, Northampton.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough, and his successors, Bishops of Peterborough, for ever. "And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or any of them or any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Holy Trinity, Northampton, comprising :----

"I. All that portion of the new parish (some-time district) of Saint Paul, Northampton, in the county of Northampton, and in the diocese of Peterborough, which is bounded upon the northeast and upon the north-west by the parish of Kingsthorpe, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upou the south-west and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said parish of Kingsthorpe from the said new parish of Sain Paul, Northampton, crosses the middle of the road called Queen's Park Parade, and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the middle of Queen's Park Parade for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to the point where such road is crossed by the Parliamentary boundary of the borough of North-ampton, and extending thence first north-eastward, then north-westward, and then again northeastward along the said Parliamentary borough boundary for a distance of thirty-seven chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of the Kingsthorpe Grove where the road called boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Northampton, the new parish of Saint Matthew Northampton, in the said county and diocese, and the said parish of Kingsthorpe all meet.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said parish of Kingsthorpe which is bounded upon the north-east by the parish of Abington, in the said county and diocese, upon the south-east by the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Northampton, upon the south by the above described portion of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Northampton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Paul, Northampton, from the said parish of Kingsthorpe, crosses the middle of the said road called Queen's Park Parade, and extending thence northward along the middle of such road for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Mill-lane, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line (thereby passing between the house called Kingsthorpe Lodge and the Kingsthorpe Farmhouse) for a distance of one mile and seven chains or thereabouts to the western angle of that portion of the said parish of Abington which for civil purposes has been annexed to the civil parish of Weston Favell."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Peterborough.

WHEREAS by an Order of His Majesty in Council, dated the eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and one, it was provided that subject to the provisions of such Order the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, should apply as if the territories named in the First Schedule of such Order were a British possession and that Part 2 of the said Act should apply to the colonies, possessions, and territories mentioned in the First and Second Schedules of such Order;

And whereas His Majesty has by treaty, capitulation, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, power and jurisdiction in and over the territory known as Swaziland;

And whereas by virtue of an Order of His Majesty in Council, dated the twenty-fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and three (known as the Swaziland Order in Council, 1903), and of a further Order of His Majesty in Council, dated the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and six (known as the Swaziland Order in Council, 1906), there has been conferred upon and committed by His Majesty to the High Commissioner for South Africa powers and authority in and over the territory of Swaziland;

And whereas by reasons of contiguity or frequent intercommunication with the colonies, possessions, and territories named in the First and Second Schedules of the Order of His Majesty in Council, dated the eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and one aforesaid, it is expedient and conducive to the better administration of justice that Part 2 of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, should apply to the territory of Swaziland as one of the group of colonies, possessions, and territories mentioned in the First and Second Schedules of the said Order, and that subject to the provisions of the said Order in Council of the eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and one, and this Order, the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, should apply as if such territory were a British possession.

Now therefore His Majesty by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The Order of His Majesty in Council, dated the eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and one, is hereby amended by the insertion of Swaziland amongst the territories mentioned in Clause 2 (a) and Schedule 1 of the said Order, and the said Order shall henceforth be read and construed accordingly. 2. The Governor of each of the colonies, possessions, and territories named in the Schedules of the said Order as amended by this Order shall cause this Order to be proclaimed therein, and the same shall come into operation in each such colony, possession, or territory on a day to be fixed by such Proclamation.

3. This Order shall be read as one with the Order in Council, dated the eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and one.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, viz. :--

words following, viz.:---"Whereas by the twentieth section of an Act passed in the twenty-ninth year of Her late Majesty's reign, chapter eighty-nine, entitled the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is among other things enacted that the Admiralty may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council), fix the salaries of officers appointed for the service of Greenwich Hospital.

"And whereas by the eighth section of an Act passed in the thirty-sixth year of Her late Majesty's reign, entitled the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of the twentieth section of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind.

"And whereas Mr. James Baker, one of the Masters at the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, will retire from the service of Greenwich Hospital on the twenty-fifth May, one thousand nine hundred and seven, when he will attain sixty-five years of age.

"We beg leave to humbly recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize the grant to Mr. Baker of a pension at the rate of seventyfive pounds a year from the funds of Greenwich Hospital, to take effect from the date of retirement."

His Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the eleventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, viz. :--

"Whereas by section three of the Naval and

Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Royal Marine Forces to a person being or having been an Officer, seaman or marine therein shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

"And whereas a War Course College has been established at Portsmouth on the footing of a Naval Technical Training Establishment:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representation had been duly given to the churchwardens of the parish of Saint Margaret, Edgware, in the county of Middlesex, have made a representation, stating that they are of opinion that for the purpose of preventing the burial places beneath the parish church of Saint Margaret, Edgware, from becoming or continuing dangerous or injurious to the public health, an Order in Council should be made for the adoption of the measures hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, II Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said churchwardens or such other person or persons as may have the care of the burial places beneath the said church, shall do or cause to be done the following acts, that is to say :---

Subject to the authority and direction of the Consistory Court of London under a faculty to be issued in that behalf:

1. All human remains beneath the floor of the said church shall be removed therefrom and forthwith buried in some consecrated burial ground in which burials can legally be made.

2. Any earth, gravel, or other material, around, above, or beneath the coffins containing such remains, which may be found to be impregnated with offensive matter, shall be removed and disposed of in such a manner as not to create nuisance or danger to health.

3. After the removal of the human remains and any earth, gravel or other material as aforesaid, the spaces left shall be filled in with hard core, the whole of the ground beneath the said church shall be properly drained by means of drains laid with open joints, and the surface of the ground beneath the said church shall be entirely covered with a layer of concrete not less than six inches thick.

4. The work of removing and burying the said remains, of removing and disposing of the earth, gravel, or other material aforesaid, and of filling in the spaces left and draining the ground beneath the church shall be carried out under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer of Health for the rural district of Hendon.
