and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Long Compton now vested in them, the said Provost and College of Eton as aforesaid, shall be trans-ferred from them to the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester, and his successors, Bishops of the same diocese, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester, and by his successors, Bishops of the same diocese, for

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Worcester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninetyfour, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the sixteenth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the

words and figures following, that is to say:
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninetyfour, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint James, Milton, and of the new parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, both in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order in Council of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, bearing date the fourth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five, and published in the London Gazette and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto

on the second day of May in the same year, part of the parish of Portsea, in the said county of Southampton and in the said diocese of Winchester, was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of All Saints, situate in the said parish of Portsea, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of All Saints, Portsea.

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the eighth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and published in the London Gazette on the fifteenth day of the same month, part of the said parish of Portsea was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint James, situate at Milton, in the said parish of Portsea, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint James, Milton.'

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the seventeenth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and published in the London Gazette on the nineteenth day of the same month, part of the said parish of Portsea was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Mark, situate at North End, in the said parish of Portsea, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea.

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint James, Milton, and the said district chapelry of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, have under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become new parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint James, Milton, and the said new parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, shall be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint James, Milton, and of the said new parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, shall be altered so that (firstly) all those portions of the said district chapelry of All Saints, Portsea, of the said new parish of Saint James, Milton, of the parish of Wymering and of the extra parochial place called Great Salterns, both in the said county and diocese, which are described in the first schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, and (secondly) all those portions of the said parish of Wymering
