ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 24th June, 1907.)

Whereas by the twenty-first section of the
Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is
enacted that the Registrar-General, with the
sanction of the Local Government Board, may
from time to time alter Registration Sub-
Districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient that Forest
Gate and Stratford Sub-Districts of West Ham
Registration District should be reconstituted so
that each Sub-District may comprise entire Wards
of West Ham County Borough as follows:—
(a) Forest Gate Sub-District to consist of Forest
Gate, Park, and Upton Wards; and (b) Strat-
ford Sub-District to consist of High-street,
Broadway, and New Town Wards.

2. Now therefore I, Sir William Cospatrick
Dunbar, Bart., C.B., Registrar-General of Births,
Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise
of the powers given me by the above mentioned
Act, and with the sanction of the Local Govern-
ment Board, do hereby order and declare that
the foregoing alteration shall take effect
accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the
first day of July, nineteen hundred and seven.
