His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a telegram, dated June 29, from His Majesty's Minister at Peking, informing him that the following places in Manchuria have been opened to international trade, viz.:—Fenghwangcheng, Liaoyang, Ninguta, Hunchun, Sanhsing, Hailar, and Aihun.

The KING has been pleased to grant unto Charles Hesketh Bibby-Hesketh, of Meols Hall, and of The Rookery, both in the parish of North Meols and County Palatine of Lancaster, Esquire, in the Commission of the Peace and a Deputy Lieutenant for the said county, Major. Duke of Lancaster's Own Imperial Yeomanry, Barrister-at-Law of the Society of the Inner Temple and Master of Arts of the University of Cambridge, His Royal licence and authority that he may discontinue the surname of Bibby, and may take in lieu thereof the surname of Fleetwood in addition to and before that of Hesketh, that he may bear the arms of Fleetwood quarterly with those of Hesketh, and that such surnames and arms of Fleetwood-Hesketh may be taken, borne, and used by his issue, the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given, that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under sections 41 and 58 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, prescribing the conditions to be observed in factories and workshops in which women or young persons are employed in the process of cleaning or preparing fruit in pursuance of the special exception allowed by section 41.

LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

Southwold Light Railways (Borrowing Powers, &c.) Order.

The Light Railway Commissioners have re-submitted (with alterations) to the Board of Trade for confirmation, under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made by them amending the borrowing powers of the Southwold Railway Company, and extending the time limited by the Southwold Light Railway Order, 1902, for the completion of certain works by that Order authorised.
