

with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons comprised in class (g) will not be qualified for appointment until the consent of the Board of Inland Revenue, given with the like sanction, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

V. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

VI. A fee of £3 will be required from every Candidate attending an Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination for the situation of Valuer and Surveyor (Second Section) in the Department of the General Valuation and Boundary Survey of Ireland, will be held in London and Dublin, under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 8th October, 1907.

The number of situations to be filled will be the number vacant at the time of the Examination.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 19th September, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

GLOUCESTERSHIRE AND WORCESTERSHIRE (GOOSEBERRY MILDEW) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of the Order.

1. This Order shall apply to the administrative counties of Gloucester and Worcester, and the county boroughs of Bristol, Gloucester, and Worcester.

Definitions.

2. In this Order—

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

"The Local Authority" means as regards any District described in the first column of the schedule hereto, the council mentioned in the second column of that schedule:

"Disease" means the disease affecting gooseberry and currant bushes which is known as

Sphaerotheca mors uvae, or American gooseberry mildew; and "diseased" means affected with disease:

"Bush" includes a cutting, seedling, or other plant.

Notification of Disease.

3.—(1.) The occupier of any premises on which there is a bush which is diseased or suspected of being diseased shall forthwith notify the fact to the clerk to the Local Authority, or to some person authorised by the Local Authority to receive such notices, and where practicable a specimen showing the disease or suspected disease shall accompany the notice.

(2.) If any person knowingly fail to give a notice required by this Order to be given by him he shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Measures for Prevention of the Spread of Disease.

4.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving in any manner notice of the existence or supposed existence of disease shall take such steps as may be necessary to determine whether the disease exists, and the area covered by diseased bushes, or by bushes to which the disease is likely to spread, and shall cause a notice to be served on the occupier of any land within that area requiring him to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the disease as are authorised by this Article.

(2.) A notice under this Article shall require—

(i.) the immediate destruction by burning or other effective method of all diseased bushes, including the fruit on such bushes;

(ii.) the thorough spraying as soon as possible with a solution of copper sulphate (containing at least one pound of copper sulphate to a gallon of water) or with some other fungicide approved by or on behalf of the Local Authority for that purpose of the site of any bush that has been destroyed;

(iii.) the thorough spraying of all gooseberry and currant bushes on the area defined in the notice with a fungicide approved by or on behalf of the Local Authority for that purpose and so that the spraying shall be carried out at such time or times as an inspector of the Local Authority shall direct and to his satisfaction;

(iv.) that no gooseberry or currant bush or any part of any such bush shall be removed or permitted to be removed out of the area defined in the notice except with, and subject to the conditions (if any) of, a licence authorising such removal, but this restriction shall not apply to fruit of a bush that is not diseased.

(3.) Any notice may be altered or withdrawn by the Local Authority if and when they are satisfied that this may be done without risk of the spread of disease.

(4.) If any person fail to adopt any measure for prevention of the spread of the disease required by a notice served on him under this Article he shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Returns of Proceedings.

5. The Local Authority shall in a form to be provided by the Board notify the Board of any outbreak of disease, and shall as soon as may be
