Novorossisk Bay-Alteration in Buoyage.

Mariupol-Depth in Channel and Harbour, Signals Altered.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 871 of 1905 :---

The Russian Government has given further notice, dated 28th June, 1907, that the depth of water above 16 feet (not 14 feet) in the channel, and in the dredged part of the harbour of Mariupol, will be signalled from a mast on the southwestern mole head by means of balls and cones during the day, and white and red fixed lights at night, each ball or white light representing 1 foot more than 16 feet, and each cone or red light signifying one quarter of a foot more; the cones or red lights being hoisted above the ball or white light, thus :- a depth of 161 feet is indicated by one cone or one red light, 161 feet by two cones or two red lights, 17 feet by one ball or one white light, $17\frac{1}{4}$ feet by one cone over one ball, or one red light over one white light, and so on. No signal will be made when the depth is less than 16 feet.

Chemulpho Approach—Non-Existence of Shoals.

The Japanese Government has given notice, dated 18th May, 1907, that a careful but unsuccessful search has been made for the undermentioned shoals in the approach to Chemulpho:—

a. The shoal marked "dries 2 feet" on the chart, and shown as situated at a distance of 3 cables S. 44° E. from Warren Island. A depth of 7 fathoms, rocky bottom, was found in this position, and from 10 to 14 fathoms around it.

b. The shoal marked on this chart "dries," and shown as situated at a distance of 3 cables N. 81° E. from Warren Island. A depth of 10 fathoms, rocky bottom, was obtained in this position, and from 10 to 12 fathoms around it.

No indication of any danger was observed in these positions, and the local inhabitants have no knowledge of them; it is therefore considered that they have no existence, and they have in consequence been erased from the charts.
