

be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely) :—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the WARWICKSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1907.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction consisting of a certain ground rent of twenty pounds per annum which has been permanently secured by deed dated the twenty-sixth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, as an addition to the endowments of the consolidated chapelry and benefice of Bishop Latimer Memorial Church, Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Birmingham, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant out of our common fund to the said consolidated chapelry and benefice of Bishop Latimer Memorial Church, Birmingham, to meet such benefaction, one capital sum of five hundred and twenty pounds, in respect of which, so long as the same capital sum, or any part thereof, shall remain in our hands, there shall be paid by us to the Incumbent for the time being of the said consolidated chapelry and benefice one yearly sum of fifteen pounds and twelve shillings, or such part thereof as shall be proportionate to any balance of the same capital sum which shall so remain in our hands; the above-mentioned yearly payments to commence as from the twenty-sixth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, and to be receivable in equal quarterly portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and on the first day of November in each and every year.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction consisting of a piece or parcel of land comprising nine hundred and one square yards or thereabouts which has been permanently secured by deed dated the twenty-fourth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, as a site for a parsonage or house of residence for the consolidated chapelry and benefice of Saint Simon and Saint Jude, Bolton-le-Moors, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester; and in consideration also of a sum of four hundred pounds sterling which has been paid to us in favour of the same consolidated chapelry and benefice, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said consolidated chapelry and
