WHEREAS by an Order made by the late Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, on the eighteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, Her Majesty did, by and with the advice of the said Council, order that William John Courthope, Esquire, and Francis Hervey, commonly called The Lord Francis Hervey, or such other persons as Her Majesty might from time to time approve in the stead of them or any of them, should be Her Majesty's Commissioners for testing, in conformity with Her Majesty's Order in Council, dated the fourth June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, or such further Order or Orders as Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, had issued or might issue in that behalf, the qualifications of persons proposed to be appointed to situations or employments in Her Majesty's Civil Establishments, and also for testing, in conformity with regulations to be from time to time issued by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for War, the literary qualifications of candidates for first Commissions in the Army, and for admission to the Royal Military College at Woolwich, and should hold their

offices during the pleasure of Her Majesty; the said William John Courthope, Esquire, being the First Commissioner; and should have power, subject to the approval of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, to appoint from time to time such Assistant Examiners and others as might be required to assist them in the performance of the duties thereafter assigned to them:

And whereas by an Order made by the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council on the seventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and five, the hereinbefore recited words of the Order first mentioned "first Commissions in the Army and for admission to the Royal Military College at Woolwich" were cancelled and in lieu thereof were inserted the words "admission by means of competitive examinations to the Royal Military College at Sandhurst and to the Royal Military Academy at Woolwich."

And whereas, since the date of the Order first above mentioned, the said William John Courthope, Esquire, Companion of the Bath, has retired.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered that the said Francis Hervey, commonly called The Lord Francis Hervey, and Stanley Mordaunt Leathes, Esquire, or such other persons as His Majesty may from time to time approve in the stead of them, or any of them, shall be His Majesty's Commissioners for testing, in conformity with the said Order in Council dated the fourth June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, or such further Order or Orders as His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, has issued or may issue in that behalf, the qualifications of persons proposed to be appointed to situations or employments in His Majesty's Civil Establishments, and also for testing, in conformity with regulations to be from time to time issued by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for War, the literary qualifications of Candidates for admission by means of competitive examinations to the Royal Military College at Sandhurst and to the Royal

Military Academy at Woolwich, and shall hold their offices during the pleasure of His Majesty; the said Francis Hervey, commonly called The Lord Francis Hervey, being first Commissioner; and shall have power, subject to the approval of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, to appoint from time to time such Assistant Examiners and others as may be required to assist them in the performance of their duties.

WHEREAS by an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council dated the eighteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, Her late Majesty did by and with the advice of the said Council appoint Commissioners for testing the qualifications of persons proposed to be appointed to situations in Her late Majesty's Civil Service Establishments and of candidates for Commissions in the Army and for admission to the Royal Military Academy at Woolwich.

And whereas it is deemed expedient that any Commissioner now holding that office or hereafter to be appointed for the like purpose may, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, authorize the Secretary for the time being of the Civil Service Commission to act temporarily as a Commissioner in the circumstances and under the conditions hereinafter set forth.

Now therefore His Majesty by and with the advice of His Privy Council doth order and it is hereby ordered that any Commissioner now holding office or hereafter to be appointed for the purposes aforesaid may subject to the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury previously obtained, by writing under his hand authorize the Secretary for the time being to the Civil Service Commission to act as a Commissioner at any time during the absence of any of the Commissioners or during any vacancy in one of the offices of Commissioner or for such period during such absence or vacancy as may be fixed by such authorization.

The Secretary shall when acting in pursuance of such authority have all powers duties and authorities vested in or assigned to or which may by any future Order in Council be hereafter vested in or assigned to the Commissioners for the time being appointed for the purposes aforesaid.

WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, it is provided (inter alia) that if the council of a borough agree to petition the King for the division of the borough into wards or for the alteration of the number and boundaries of its wards it shall be lawful for His Majesty from time to time by Order in Council to fix the number of wards into which the borough shall be divided; and that where an Order has

been so made the Secretary of State shall appoint a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of the wards and for apportioning the Councillors among them; and that in case of alteration of wards the Commissioner shall so apportion among the altered wards the Councillors for those wards as to provide for their continuing to represent as large a number as possible of their former constituents.

And whereas on the twenty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seven, the Right Honourable Herbert John Gladstone, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did in pursuance of the said Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, duly warrant and appoint Archibald Bence Bence-Jones, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the wards of the borough of Eastbourne, the number of such wards having been fixed by the Order of His Majesty in Council made in that behalf on the seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seven.

Now, I, the said Archibald Bence Bence-Jones, do hereby, in pursuance of the said warrant and appointment, declare this to be my scheme for the purposes of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; and I hereby fix and determine that the boundaries of the wards of the said borough of Eastbourne shall be as follows, namely:—

No. 1.—Saint Mary's Ward

shall contain so much of the said borough of Eastbourne as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at the point in the centre of Upperton-road opposite Moatcroft-road, and proceeding thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Moatcroft-road to the junction of Moatcroft-road and the Goffs, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of the Goffs to Southfields-road, thence in a south-westerly direction following the line of the wall on the south-eastern side of Gildredge Park (so far as the said wall extends in a south-westerly direction), and continuing in a straight line to the boundary between the hitherto existing West Ward and Saint Mary's Ward at Compton-place-road, thence in a south-westerly direction following the hitherto existing boundary of the said wards to the western boundary of the borough at Warren Hill-road, following thence along the western and northern boundary of the borough ultimately in an easterly direction to the centre of Willingdon-road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Willingdon-road and Upperton-road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 2.—Upperton Ward

shall contain so much of the said borough of Eastbourne as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at the point aforesaid in the centre of Upperton-road opposite Moatcroft-road and following the eastern and south-eastern boundary of No. 1, Saint Mary's Ward, as hereinbefore defined as far as Compton-place-road, thence following in a south-easterly direction the centre of Compton-place-road to its junction with Meads-road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Meads-road and Grove-road to the junction of Grove-road and Terminus-road, thence in north-easterly and northerly directions successively along the south-eastern and eastern sides of the London Brighton and South Coast Railway Company's line to the northern boundary of the borough, thence along the northern boundary of the borough in westerly, northerly, westerly and

southerly directions successively, and in a southerly direction following the eastern boundary of No. 1, Saint Mary's Ward, as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 3.—Meads Ward

shall contain so much of the said borough of Eastbourne as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the southern boundary of No. 2, Upperton Ward, as hereinbefore defined at the intersection of Compton-place-road and Meads-road, following thence southwards the centre of Granville-road to the intersection of Granville-road and Carlisle-road, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Carlisle-road to the boundary of the borough on the foreshore, thence along the south-eastern southern and western boundaries of the borough successively to Warren Hill-road, thence following in an easterly direction the southern boundary of No. 1, Saint Mary's Ward, as hereinbefore defined to Compton-place-road, thence in a south-easterly direction following the south-western boundary of No. 2, Upperton Ward, as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 4.—Devonshire Ward

shall contain so much of the said borough of Eastbourne as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at the point aforesaid at the intersection of Compton-place-road and Meads-road and following thence in southerly and easterly directions successively the eastern and northern boundaries of No. 3 Meads Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point in the south-eastern boundary of the borough on the foreshore opposite Carlisle-road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the boundary of the borough on the foreshore to a point opposite Victoria-place, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Victoria-place and Terminus-road to the intersection of Terminus-road and Grove-road on the south-eastern boundary of No. 2, Upperton Ward, as hereinbefore defined, following thence in a south-westerly direction the south-eastern boundary of No. 2, Upperton Ward, to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 5.—Central Ward.

shall contain so much of the said borough of Eastbourne as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at the point of intersection aforesaid of Terminus-road and Grove-road, following thence in a south-easterly direction the north-eastern boundary of No. 4, Devonshire Ward, as hereinbefore defined to the point aforesaid in the boundary of the borough on the foreshore opposite Victoria-place, thence in a north-easterly direction the boundary of the borough on the foreshore to a point opposite Cavendish-place, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Cavendish-place to the boundary of No. 2, Upperton Ward, thence following in a south-westerly direction the south-eastern boundary of No. 2, Upperton Ward, to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 6.—Cavendish Ward

shall contain so much of the said borough of Eastbourne as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the eastern boundary of No. 2, Upperton Ward, where Cavendish-place abuts on the line of the London Brighton and South Coast Railway Company, following thence in a south-easterly direction the north-eastern boundary of No. 5, Central Ward, to the point in the boundary of the borough on the foreshore opposite Cavendish-place, following thence in a

north-easterly direction the boundary of the borough on the foreshore to a point in the said boundary opposite to Cambridge-road, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Cambridge-road and Firle-road to Whitley-road, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Whitley-road to the boundary of No. 2, Upperton Ward, thence in a south-westerly direction following the eastern boundary of No. 2, Upperton Ward, to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 7.—Roselands Ward

shall contain so much of the said borough of Eastbourne as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the eastern boundary of No. 2, Upperton Ward, where Whitley-road abuts on the line of the London Brighton and South Coast Railway Company, following thence in an easterly direction the northern boundary of No. 6, Cavendish Ward, as far as the intersection of Firle-road and the road named Seaside, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Seaside to the northern boundary of the borough, thence in northerly and westerly directions successively along the northern boundary of the borough to the line of the London Brighton and South Coast Railway Company, following thence in a southerly direction the eastern boundary of No. 2, Upperton Ward, to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 8.—Redoubt Ward

shall contain so much of the said borough of Eastbourne as is comprised within an imaginary line commencing at a point on the northern boundary of No. 6, Cavendish Ward, as hereinbefore defined at the intersection of Firle-road and the road named Seaside, following thence in an easterly direction the northern boundary of No. 6, Cavendish Ward, to the boundary of the borough on the foreshore, following thence in a north-easterly direction the boundary of the borough on the foreshore and in a westerly direction the boundary of the borough to the road named Seaside, following thence in a south-westerly direction the south-eastern boundary of No. 7, Roselands Ward, as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

And, I, the said Commissioner, in further pursuance of the terms of the said warrant and for the purposes aforesaid, do hereby assign and apportion all the existing Councillors of the Borough of Eastbourne aforesaid among the wards as hereinbefore defined as follows, namely:—

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council from time to time, by Order in Council, to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act, and to make regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary, with a view to the proper protection of His Majesty's vessels, dockyards, or property, or to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service:

And whereas, in pursuance of the said Act, certain Regulations and Rules were made by Order in Council, dated the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and one, with reference to the Dockyard Port of Berehaven:

And whereas it appears expedient that the Regulations and Rules before mentioned should be amended:

And whereas the provisions of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, is pleased, on the recommendation of the Admiralty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Preliminary.

1. This Order shall take effect from the date hereof.

2. On this Order taking effect, the before-mentioned Order in Council of the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and one, shall cease to operate, and in lieu thereof the Rules and Regulations set forth in the schedule to this Order are hereby made and shall have effect in relation to the Dockyard Port of Berehaven.

3. In this Order, unless the context shall otherwise require, the terms "Vessel," "Master," and "Justice" shall have the same meaning as in the said Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, and the term "the said Dockyard Port" shall mean the Dockyard Port of Berehaven, as described in paragraph four hereof.

Dockyard Port of Berehaven.

4. For the purposes of the said Act and of this Order, the limits of the Dockyard Port of Berehaven shall be as follows:—

All the waters, bays, and creeks so far as the tide flows lying between lines drawn as follows:—

On the east, a line joining Gun Point and the western extremity of Carrigskye;

On the south, a line drawn S. 42° W. (true) from Carrigskye to a position eleven thousand two hundred yards from it, thence to a position south (true) six thousand four hundred yards from the western extreme of Bull Island, thence west (true) to a position south (true) from Clonaghlin Point, and thence to Clonaghlin Point;

On the west, a line drawn from the extremity of Fair Head to the extremity of Shee Head; excepting the area north of a line joining Crowdy Point and Gun Point.

Delineation of Limits.

5. On the chart accompanying this Order are drawn all the limits referred to herein.

SCHEDULE.

General.

(1) Moorings for His Majesty's ships, mark buoys, and other aids to navigation, and such other buoys as may be required for any purpose in connection with Naval or Military operations, shall be placed by the King's Harbour Master as, from time to time, the requirements of His Majesty's Service may demand.

(2) Moorings for private vessels shall not be laid in the said Dockyard Port without the permission, in writing, of the King's Harbour Master, and then only in such positions as he shall deem fit, and such moorings shall be forthwith removed on the requisition of the King's Harbour Master to that effect.

(3) If at any time the anchor of any merchant or other private vessel hooks any Government moorings, or any electric cables or moorings of buoys, the master, or other person having the charge or command of such vessel, shall not proceed to unhook the same, but shall forthwith give notice thereof to the Senior Naval Officer, or to the King's Harbour Master, in order that aid may be given for clearing such moorings or cables without doing damage to the same.

(4) No merchant, or other private vessel, shall make fast to, or lie at, any of the buoys marking the channels or shoals in the Dockyard Port.

(5) No merchant, or other private vessel, shall, without licence in writing from the Senior Naval Officer or the King's Harbour Master, be moored or fastened to any Government moorings, buoys, piles, or vessels, in the Dockyard Port.

(6) The area between Shot Head and Carrigskye, and between the southern boundary of the Dockyard Port and the coast to the northward, is appropriated for Gunnery trials and experiments, from His Majesty's ships; and whenever such trials or experiments are in progress, no merchant or private vessel, or boat, of any description, shall anchor, moor, or carry on fishing operations in, or pass through, the above-mentioned area; and all vessels being in this area shall immediately move to a position outside of it when required to do so by the King's Harbour Master or the Senior Naval Officer present.

(7) Whenever it may be necessary for Mining or Gunnery operations or experiments, dredging operations, or other Naval or Military purposes,

to reserve any area other than that referred to in the foregoing clause, for such operations or purposes, the area will be marked by buoys coloured green and white, or by posts coloured red; and after twenty-one days' warning notice has been issued by the Admiralty, and published in the "Dublin Gazette," no vessel shall anchor, moor, or be within, or pass through, the area so marked, unless compelled to do so by stress of weather, or to avoid accident, nor when such area is uncovered or nearly uncovered at low water shall any person pass through it, or remain in it, unless by permission of, and under such arrangements as may be from time to time made by, the officer in charge of such operations.

(8) No merchant, or other private vessel, shall anchor on the lines of any electric cable laid down in the Dockyard Port when such line is indicated by whitewashed posts, or other discernible marks erected on shore, and a warning has been conveyed to Mariners by notice issued by the Admiralty and published in the "Dublin Gazette."

(9) Whenever practice is taking place at the Naval Rifle Range on Bere Island, a red flag will be hoisted at the flagstaff east of Rerrin, to warn vessels not to cross the range, the danger area of which extends in an easterly direction from the peninsula south of Lonehort Harbour for a distance of a mile and a half.

When such red flag is hoisted, no vessel shall approach the east entrance until the perch on Carrigavaddra bears westward of N. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. magnetic.

(10) Whenever it may be necessary for Naval purposes to obstruct either entrance of the port by mines, booms, or other obstacles, no vessel shall use, or attempt to use, such entrance. Warning will be given that the west entrance is forbidden to ships entering, as follows:—

By day by three red balls shown vertically at Fair Head;

By night by three red lights shown vertically at Fair Head;

and that the east entrance is forbidden by similar signals shown from the flagstaff just east of Rerrin.

Anchorage Regulations.

(11) All merchant or other private vessels shall be subject to the direction of the King's Harbour Master.

(12) The anchorage in Berehaven from the east entrance to a line drawn north and south (true) through the western extreme of Minane Island shall be for the exclusive use of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels of War, and no merchant or other private vessels shall anchor to eastward of the above-mentioned line without the permission of the Senior Naval Officer or of the King's Harbour Master, and no vessel shall be anchored in such a position as to obstruct the fairway by the west entrance.

(13) The master of every merchant or private vessel to which this Order relates shall observe, and cause to be observed, the said Regulations as far as relates to his vessel, and if any master or other person acts in any respect in contravention of any of the said Regulations, or fails to observe, and cause the same to be observed, he shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of ten pounds.

LOCOMOTIVE.

Petroleum.

REGULATIONS dated 31st July, 1907, made by the Secretary of State under Section 5 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, as to the Keeping and Use of Petroleum for the Purposes of Light Locomotives.

Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (59 and 60 Vict. c. 36, s. 5).

In promulgating the following Regulations relating to the keeping, conveyance and use of petroleum in connection with light locomotives, the Secretary of State for the Home Department desires to direct public attention to the dangers that may arise from the careless use of the more volatile descriptions of petroleum, commonly known as petroleum spirit. Not only is the vapour therefrom, which is given off at ordinary temperatures, capable of being easily ignited, but it is also capable, when mixed with air, of forming an explosive atmosphere. It is, therefore, necessary, in dealing with and handling the spirit, to take strict precautions by the employment of thoroughly sound and properly closed vessels to prevent leakage of the spirit, and by avoiding the use of naked lights in dangerous proximity to prevent the contact of any form of artificial light with the highly inflammable vapour which it is always evolving.

REGULATIONS.

By virtue of the powers conferred on me by the Fifth Section of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, I hereby make the following Regulations for the keeping and use of petroleum for the purposes of light locomotives.*

In these Regulations the expression "petroleum spirit" shall mean the petroleum to which the Petroleum Acts, 1871 and 1879, apply, provided

* Under the Seventh Section of the Act, a breach of these Regulations may, on summary conviction, be punished by a fine not exceeding ten pounds.

that when any petroleum other than that to which the said Petroleum Acts apply, is on or in any light locomotive, or is being conveyed or kept in any place on or in which there is also present any petroleum spirit as above defined, the whole of such petroleum shall be deemed to be petroleum spirit.

In these Regulations the expression "storehouse" shall mean any room, building, coachhouse, lean-to, or other place in which petroleum spirit for the purposes of light locomotives is kept in pursuance of these Regulations and shall include an open-air place of storage, when and so long as due precautions for the prevention of unauthorized persons having access to the petroleum spirit are taken in pursuance of No. 13 of these Regulations.

1. The following shall be exempt from licence under the Petroleum Act, 1871, namely:—

(a.) Petroleum spirit which is kept for the purpose of, or is being used on, light locomotives when kept or used in conformity with these Regulations.

(b.) Petroleum spirit which is kept for the purpose of, or is being used on, light locomotives by, or by authority of, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Admiralty, or other department of the Government.

2. These Regulations shall apply to petroleum spirit which is kept for the purpose of, or is being used on, light locomotives, and for which (save as hereinafter provided) no licence has been granted by the Local Authority under the Petroleum Act, 1871, and shall not apply to petroleum spirit which is kept for sale, or partly for sale and partly for use on light locomotives, and which must be kept in accordance with the provisions of the Petroleum Acts as heretofore, except that Regulations 13 and 14 shall apply to petroleum spirit which is kept partly for sale and partly for use on light locomotives.

These Regulations shall not apply to the keeping or use of petroleum spirit by or under the control of any Government Department. Such keeping or use may be the subject of Regulations to be made by the Department concerned.

3. Where for any special reason a person keeping petroleum spirit for the purpose of light locomotives applies for a licence under the Petroleum Act, 1871, and the Local Authority see fit to grant such licence, such petroleum spirit shall be subject only to Regulations 8 to 15 and the conditions of such licence, in so far as the said conditions are not contrary to the said Regulations 8 to 15.

4. Where a storehouse forms part of, or is attached to, another building, and where the intervening floor or partition is of an unsubstantial or highly inflammable character, or has an opening therein, the whole of such building shall be deemed to be the storehouse, and no portion of such storehouse shall be used as a dwelling or as a place where persons assemble. A storehouse shall have a separate entrance from the open air distinct from that of any dwelling or building in which persons assemble.

5. The amount of petroleum spirit to be kept in any one storehouse, whether or not upon light locomotives, shall not exceed 60 gallons at any one time.

6. Where two or more storehouses are in the same occupation and are situated within 20 feet of one another, they shall for the purposes of these Regulations be deemed to be one and the same storehouse, and the maximum amount of petroleum spirit prescribed in the foregoing

Regulation shall be the maximum to be kept in all such storehouses taken together. Where two or more storehouses in the same occupation are distant more than 20 feet from one another, the maximum amount shall apply to each storehouse.

7. Any person who keeps petroleum spirit in a storehouse which is situated within 20 feet of any other building whether or not in his occupation, or of any timber stack or other inflammable goods not owned by him, shall give notice to the local authority under the Petroleum Acts for the district in which he is keeping such petroleum spirit, that he is so keeping petroleum spirit, and shall renew such notice in the month of January in each year during the continuance of such keeping, and shall permit any duly authorized officer of the local authority to inspect such petroleum spirit at any reasonable time. This Regulation shall not apply to petroleum spirit kept in a tank forming part of a light locomotive.

8. Every storehouse shall be thoroughly ventilated.

9. Petroleum spirit shall not be kept, used, or conveyed except in metal vessels so substantially constructed as not to be liable, except under circumstances of gross negligence or extraordinary accident, to be broken or become defective or insecure. Every such vessel shall be so constructed and maintained that no leakage, whether of liquid or vapour, can take place therefrom.

10. Every such vessel, not forming part of a light locomotive, when used for conveying or keeping petroleum spirit shall bear the words "petroleum spirit highly inflammable" conspicuously and indelibly stamped or marked thereon, or on a metallic or enamelled label attached thereto, and shall be of a capacity not exceeding two gallons.

Provided that this limitation of capacity shall not apply in any place of storage which is licensed under the Petroleum Act, 1871, unless such limitation is required by the conditions of the licence.

11. Before repairs are done to any such vessel, that vessel shall, as far as practicable, be cleaned by the removal of all petroleum spirit and of all dangerous vapours derived from the same.

12. The filling or replenishing of a vessel with petroleum spirit shall not be carried on, nor shall the contents of any such vessel be exposed in the presence of fire or artificial light, except a light of such construction, position or character, as not to be liable to ignite any inflammable vapour arising from such spirit, and no fire or artificial light capable of igniting inflammable vapour shall be brought within dangerous proximity of the place where any vessel containing petroleum spirit is being kept.

13. In the case of all petroleum spirit kept or conveyed for the purpose of, or in connection with, any light locomotive, (a) all due precautions shall be taken for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion, and for the prevention of unauthorised persons having access to any petroleum spirit kept or conveyed, and to the vessels containing or intended to contain, or having actually contained, the same; and (b) every person managing, or employed on, or in connection with, any light locomotive shall abstain from every act whatever which tends to cause fire or explosion, and which is not reasonably necessary, and shall prevent any other person from committing such act.

14. In the storehouse or in any place where a

light locomotive is kept or is present, petroleum spirit shall not be used for the purpose of cleaning or lighting, or as a solvent or for any purpose other than as fuel for the engine of a light locomotive.

Provided that where due precaution is taken to prevent petroleum spirit from escaping into a sewer or drain and provision made for disposing safely of any surplus petroleum spirit and where no fire or naked light is present, quantities not exceeding one gill may be used for the cleaning of a light locomotive at a safe distance from any building, place of storage of inflammable goods, or much frequented highway, or for the repair of tyres, under suitable precautions.

This Regulation shall apply to premises on which petroleum spirit is kept for the purpose of, or is being used on, light locomotives, whether such premises are licensed or not, unless the Local Authority see fit, in the case of licensed premises, to grant an exemption by a special term of the licence.

15. Petroleum shall not be allowed to escape into any inlet or drain communicating with a sewer.

16. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 15th August, 1907, from which date all previous Regulations made under the Fifth Section of the said Act are hereby repealed.

NOTE.—From the above Regulations it will be seen that there are two methods in which petroleum spirit required for use in motor cars may be kept. The first of these will be the usual method, namely, to keep in accordance with these Regulations; but where a person finds that for some special reason he cannot observe one of the Regulations 4, 5, or 6, he may resort to the second method, namely, to apply to the Local Authority for a licence. In such cases the place will be examined by the Local Authority Officer, who will advise the Local Authority as to its suitability for licence. Where a licence has been granted Regulations 4 to 7 no longer apply.

In no case is petroleum spirit kept wholly or partly for sale exempt from the necessity of a licence.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Northampton) Order, 1907.

Dated 9th August, 1907.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application to the County Council of the Administrative County of Northampton, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Northampton) Order, 1907."

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall, so far as regards the Heron, be extended so as to be between the last day of February and the 2nd day of September in each year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the whole of the county of Northampton to the following species of Wild Birds, in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Heron, Hawks (Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Hen Harrier, Hobby, Kestrel, Merlin, Osprey), Kingfisher, Nuthatch, Owl (all species), Wryneck—Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird.

The Kingfisher and Owl protected during the whole of the year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the Kingfisher and the Owl (all species) is prohibited throughout the County of Northampton.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

V. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Northampton:—

Goldfinch, Hawks (Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Hen Harrier, Hobby, Kestrel, Merlin, Osprey), Kingfisher, Nightingale, Nightjar—Goatsucker, Night Hawk, or Fern Owl, Nuthatch, Owl (all species), Sandpiper—Summer Snipe, Woodpeckers, Wryneck—Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird.

Repeal of Former Order.

VI. The Order of the 15th January, 1896, is hereby repealed.

(REMISSIONS AND PUNISHMENTS.)

RULES made by the Secretary of State for the Home Department, under the Prison Acts, 1877 and 1898, with respect to Remissions and Punishments.

37(A). A convicted prisoner sentenced to imprisonment, whether by one sentence or cumulative sentences, for a period exceeding one calendar month, shall be eligible, by special industry and good conduct, to earn a remission of a portion of his imprisonment, not exceeding one-sixth of the whole sentence.

81(A). For any offence with which the Governor is competent to deal he may order a prisoner to be punished by forfeiture of remission of sentence or of the privileges of any stage for a period not exceeding fourteen days.

83(A). The Visiting Committee may order a prisoner to be punished by forfeiture of the privilege of remission of sentence or of the privileges of any stage for a period not exceeding twenty-eight days, or may recommend to the Prison Commissioners a longer period of forfeiture.

Rule 37 and sub-section (e) of Rule 81 of the Rules made by the Secretary of State on the 21st April, 1899, are hereby revoked.

The foregoing Rules shall take effect from the 1st September, 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall in their application to any Infected Area comprising the whole or any part of a District specified in the First Schedule to this Order be modified in manner declared by this Order.

2. Swine may between the fifteenth day of August and the thirtieth day of November next (including both those days), be moved between different parts of a farm in the same occupation for the purpose of stubbling or of feeding acorns, mast, or other like food, along, over, or across any highway or thoroughfare in the Infected Area in which the farm is situate, subject to the following conditions:—

- (i.) swine affected with or suspected of swine-fever may not be moved under this Order;
- (ii.) swine may not be moved under this Order into or out of a Swine-Fever Infected Place, or if the movement of the swine is prohibited by notice given by an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries given under any Order of that Board;

(iii.) a licence authorising movement under this Order must be obtained from the Clerk of the Local Authority of the District, or of any Committee of the Local Authority, or from any person appointed by the Local Authority to act as Chief Inspector for the purposes of the above mentioned Acts, and any such licence shall state the period for which the licence is available and shall be in the Form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, and may be determined at any time by a notice given or sent by post to such occupier by any person authorised by this Order to issue licences; and

(iv.) the swine must be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay and must be accompanied by the licence authorising the movement.

3. This Order shall cease to operate on the first day of December, nineteen hundred and seven.

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall in their application to the Infected Area described in the Schedule hereto be modified in manner declared by this Order.

Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

2.—(1.) The Local Authority may grant a Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition of swine in the Infected Area if they are satisfied that the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held in a market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition which is capable of being thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, and thereupon the market fair sale or exhibition may be held accordingly.

(2.) A Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market fair sale or exhibition (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets fairs sales or exhibitions on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding three months, but the Licence may be renewed from time to time or revoked at any time by the Local Authority.

(3.) A Licence shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to ensure publicity for the same, and a copy of the Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition where such market fair sale or exhibition is held.

(4.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article.

(5.) A fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local Authority and named in the Licence for the purpose of receiving Licences authorising movement of swine to the market fair sale or exhibition, and for granting Licences for movement of swine therefrom in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(6.) No swine shall be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare into a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Article unless accompanied by a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order.

Licences for Movement out of Licensed Markets, &c.

3.—(1.) Swine exposed at a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order may be moved from the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition along over or across a highway or thoroughfare in an Infected Area if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement—in the Form set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect—granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the market fair sale or exhibition is held.

(2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.

(3.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where the place of destination specified in the Licence is in an Infected Area, the swine shall be moved to such place and not elsewhere.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

4.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to a market fair sale or exhibition in an Infected Area, the Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition by the person in charge of the swine to the person appointed under this Order to receive the same.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to any other premises in an Infected Area, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

Attendance at Markets, &c.

5. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order.

Revocation by Board of Licences.

6. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

9.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving

or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved; shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order—

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

"Infected Area" means an area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area:

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of August, nineteen hundred and seven.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the EAST KENT (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1907.

(1) If the sample is taken in a county, or in a county borough or a burgh of which the council have appointed or concurred in appointing an agricultural analyst, then to the analyst appointed for the county or borough or burgh;

(2) If the sample is taken in a county borough of which the council have not appointed or concurred in appointing an agricultural analyst, then to the analyst appointed for the county in which for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1888, the borough is deemed to be situate; and

(3) If the sample is taken in a burgh of which the council have not appointed or concurred in appointing an agricultural analyst, then to the analyst appointed for the county within which the burgh is situated or with which it has the longest common boundary.
