WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who

are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twenty-sixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His Majesty the King of Sweden and Norway, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, in the case of which Treaty the Extradition Acts of 1870 and 1873 were applied by Order in Council of the thirtieth September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three:

And whereas an Agreement was concluded on the second day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seven, between the British and Swedish Governments, providing that the said Treaty shall remain in force between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Kingdom of Sweden, in so far as its provisious apply to the Kingdom of Sweden alone; and also declaring that certain additions shall be made to the offences set out in Article II of the said Treaty, which Agreement is in the terms following :-

The British and Swedish Governments, who agree that the Treaty signed at Stockholm on the 26th of June, 1873, between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Kingdoms of Sweden and Norway for the mutual surrender of fugitive criminals shall remain in force between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Kingdom of Sweden, in so far as its provisions apply to the Kingdom of Sweden alone, and who deem it desirable to make certain additions to the said Treaty, have authorized the Undersigned to declare that the following additions should be made to the offences set out in Article II of the said Treaty for which, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the said Treaty, extradition is to be granted:-

19. Perjury and subornation of perjury.

20. Receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or embezzled.

21. Malicious wounding or inflicting grievous

bodily harm.
22. Unlawful carnal knowledge of a girl under the age of fifteen years.

23. Bigamy.

24. Indecent assault.

25. Administering drugs or using instruments apt to procure the miscarriage of women, with intent to procure such miscarriage.

26. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any person travelling or

being upon a railway.

27. Knowingly making, without lawful authority, any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of the coin of the realm.

28. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.

In witness whereof the Undersigned have signed the present Agreement and have affixed thereto the seals of their arms.

Brittiska och Svenska regeringarne, som äro ense därom att det i Stockholm den 26 Juni 1873 undertecknade fördrag mellan Förenade Konungariket Storbritannien och Irland samt Konungarikena Sverige och Norge angående ömsesidigt utlämnande of förrymda förbrytare skall till den del dess bestämmelser äro tillämp-liga på Konungariket Sverige enbart fortfara att gälla mellan Förenade Konungariket Storbritannien och Irland och Konungariket Sverige, och som finna önskvärdt att göra vissa tillägg i sagda fördrag, hafva bemyndigat underte knade att förklara, att till den uti Artikel II af sagda fördrag förekommande lista å brott, för hvilka under de i fördraget angifna omständigheter och villkor utlämnande skall beviljas, skall göras följande tillägg:-

19. Mened och anstiftan af mened.

20. Mottagande af penningar, värdepapper eller annan egendom med vetskap att det mottanga åtkommits genom stöld eller försnillning.

26. Hvarje handling foretagen i uppsåt att åstadkomma fara för dens säkerhet, som reser

eller eljest befinner sig å järnväg. 27. Förlärdigande utan behörigt uppdrag af verktyg, form eller maskin, som kan och är afsedd att användas till förfalskning af rikets mynt, för såvidt gärningsmannen haft vetskap om afsikten med förfärdigandet.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to him by the said Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the twenty-sixth day of August, 1907, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Sweden under and in accordance with the said Treaty as supplemented by the said Agreement above set forth:

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada, being Part I of chapter 155 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twenty-fifth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and six, between His Majesty and the President of the Republic of Panamá, for the

extradition of criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following :-

Extradition Treaty between the United Kingdom and Panamá.

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the President of the Republic of Panamá, having determined, by common consent, to conclude a Treaty for the extradition of criminals, have accordingly named as their Plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India.

Claude Coventry Mallet, Esquire, Companion of His Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, and His Consul for the Republic of Panamá, and

The President of the Republic of Panamá,

His Excellency Ricardo Arias, Secretary of State for the Department of Government and Foreign Affairs;

Who, after having exhibited to each other their respective full powers and found them in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:

#### ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under certain circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article II, committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party.

## ARTICLE II.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences:—

1. Murder, or attempt or conspiracy to murder.

2. Manslaughter.

3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.

4. Rape.

5. Carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have unlawful carnal knowledge of a girl under the age of 16 years, so far as such acts are punishable by the law of the State upon which the demand is made.

6. Indecent assault.

Tratado de Extradición entre la Gran Bretaña y Panamá.

Habiendo Su Majestad el Rey del Reino Unido de la Gran Bretaña é Irlauda, y de los Dominios Británicos de Ultramar, Emperador de la India, y el Presidente de la República de Panamá, determinado, de comun acuerdo, celebrar un Tratado para la extradición de criminales, han nombrado, con este objeto, Plenipotenciarios:

Su Majestad el Rey del Reino Unido de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, y de los Dominios Británicos de Ultramar, Emperador de la India,

Al señor Claude Coventry Mallet, Caballero de la Muy Distinguida Orden de San Miguel y San Jorge, y Consul de Su Majestad Británica en la República de Panamá, y

El Excelentísimo señor Presidente de la Re-

pública de Panamá.

A Su Excelencia el señor Don Ricardo Arias, Secretario de Estado en el Despacho de Gobierno y Relaciones Exteriores;

Quienes después de haberse comunicado recíprocamente sus respectivos plenos poderes y halládolos en buena y debida forma, han convenido en los siguientes Artículos:

## ARTICULO I.

Las Altas Partes Contratantes convienen en entregarse mutuamente, con arreglo á las estipulaciones del presente tratado las personas acusadas ó convictas de cualquiera de los delitos ó crimenes especificados en el Artículo II, y cometidos en el territorio de una de las Partes, que se encontraren en el territorio de la otra.

#### ARTICULO II.

Se concederá la extradición por los siguientes crimenes ó delitos:—

1. Asesinato, tentativa de asesinato, ó conjuración para cometerlo.

2. Homicidio.

3. Administración de drogas ó uso de instrumentos con el objeto de producir aborto.

Fuerza y violencia.

- 5. Abuso deshonesto ó tentativa de cometerlo con mujer menor de 16 años, siempre que tales actos sean de los que castiga la ley del país donde se cometan.
  - 6. Atentado contra el pudor.

- 7. Kidnapping and false imprisonment, child stealing.
  - 8. Abandoning, exposing, or detaining children.
  - 9. Abduction.
- 10. Bigamy.11. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
- 12. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm.
  13. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of
  - 14. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
  - 15. Arson or attempt to commit arson.
- 16. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny, or embezzlement.
- 17. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any Company.
- 18. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.
- 19. (a) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.
- (b) Knowingly making without lawful authority any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of the coin of the
- 20. Forgery, or knowingly uttering what is forged.
  - 21. Crimes against bankruptcy law.
- 22. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any persons travelling or being upon a railway.
- 23. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.
- 24. Piracy and other crimes or offences committed at sea against persons or things which, according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are extradition offences.
- 25. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute a criminal offence against the laws of both States.

Extradition shall also be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both Contracting Parties.

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the State applied to in respect of any other crime for which, according to the law of both the Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

## ARTICLE III.

Neither Party is obliged to surrender its own subjects or citizens to the other Party.

## ARTICLE IV.

Extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of His Britanuic Majesty's Government, or of the Government of Panama, has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is waiting trial in the territory of the United Kingdom or in the Republic of Panamá respectively, for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

- 18. Estafa y engaño, entendiéndose por tal obtener dinero, valores ú objetos con fin doloso; recibir dinero, valores ó bienes de cualquier clase á sabiendas de que sean robados ó adquiridos ilegalmente.
- 19. (a) Falsificación ó alteración de la moneda ó hacer circular la moneda falsificada ó alterada.
- (b) Construir á sabiendas, y sin autorización legal, instrumentos ó maquinarias que sirvan y se destinen á falsificar la moneda del Estado.
- 20. Falsificar ó poner en circulación documentos falsificados, á sabiendas.
  - 21. Quiebra fraudulenta.
- 22. Cualquier acto contra un ferrocarril con el propósito de atentar contra la vida de las personas que viajan en los trenes ó se encuentran en ellos.
- 23. Daños contra la propiedad (siempre que den lugar á enjuiciamiento).
- 24. Piratería y otros crimenes y delitos cometidos en el mar, contra personas y propiedades (y que, según las leyes de las Altas Partes Contratantes, den lugar á la extradición).
- 25. Tráfico de esclavos en forma que constituya un delito contra las leyes de ambos Estados.
- Tambien se concederá la Extradición por la complicidad en cualquiera de los delitos expresados, siempre que la complicidad según las leyes de ambas Partes Contratantes, sea castigada por la ley.

Podrá igualmente concederse la extradición, por cualquier otro crimen ó delito, por el cual con arreglo á las leyes de ambas Partes Contratautes, á la sazón en vigor, pueda concederse la demanda á discreción del Estado á quien se hace la solicitud.

#### ARTICULO III.

Ninguna de las Altas Partes Contratantes, está obligada á entregar sus propios súbditos ó ciudadanos á la otra Parte.

#### ARTICULO IV.

No se efecturá la entrega, si la persona reclamada de parte del Gobierno de Su Majestad Británica ó del Gobierno de Panamá, ha sido ya juzgada y absuelta ó castigada, ó está sometida á juicio en el territorio del Reino Unido ó en la República de Panamá respectivamente, por el crimen que motiva la demanda de Extradición.

If the person claimed on the part of His Britannic Majesty's Government, or of the Government of Panamá, should be awaiting trial or undergoing sentence for any other crime in the territory of the United Kingdom, or in the Republic of Panamá respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until after he has been discharged, whether by acquittal or on expiration of sentence or otherwise.

#### ARTICLE V.

Extradition shall not be granted if exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applying or applied to.

Neither shall it be granted if, according to the law of either country, the maximum punishment for the offence charged is imprisonment for less than one year.

#### ARTICLE VI

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he proves that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

### ARTICLE VII.

A person surrendered shall in no case be kept in prison or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made for any other crime, or on account of any other matters, thau those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored, or has had an opportunity of returning to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

## ARTICLE VIII.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the Diplomatic Agents or Consuls-General of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by a copy of the judgment passed on the convicted person by the competent Court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed in contumaciam is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

#### ARTICLE IX.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

#### ARTICULO V.

No se concederá la extradición, cuando haya transcurrido el tiempo de la prescripción, según las leyes del Estado solicitante ó solicitado.

#### ARTICULO VI.

El fugitivo criminal no será entregado si el delito por el cual se solicita la extradición, es de carácter político, ó si él probare que la demanda de entrega ha sido hecha con la mira de juzgarlo ó castigarlo por un delito de esa naturaleza.

## ARTICULO VII.

La persona entregada no podrá ser encarcelada ó juzgada, en el Estado al cual se ha hecho la entrega, por ningún otro crimen ó delito distinto del que ha motivado la entrega, hasta que no haya regresado ó haya tenido oportunidad de regresar al país que lo entregó.

Esta estipulación no se aplicará á los crimenes cometidos después de la extradición.

## ARTICULO VIII.

La demanda de extradición será hecha por medio de los Agentes Diplomáticos ó Cónsules Generales de las Altas Partes Contratantes.

La demanda de extradición de un acusado deberá 'ir acompañada de la orden de arresto expedida por las autoridades competentes del Estado que pide la extradición, y de pruebas que, según las leyes del país donde se encuentre el acusado, justificarian su aprehensión, si el crimen hubiera sido cometido allí.

Si la demanda se refiere á una persona ya convicta, se presentará la copia de la sentencia condenatoria dictada por el Tribunal competente del Estado que formula la demanda de extradición.

No se tendrá como convicto al reo contra quien se haya proferido sentencia en rebeldia, pero la persona asi sentenciada se considerará como acusada.

#### ARTICULO IX.

Siempre que la demanda de extradición esté de acuerdo con las estipulaciones citadas, las autoridades competentes del Estado á quien se hace la solicitud procederán á la aprehensión del fugitivo.

## ARTICLE X.

A criminal fugitive may be apprehended under a warrant issued by any competent authority in either country, on such information or complaint, and such evidence, or after such proceedings, as would, in the opinion of the authority issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime had been committed or the person convicted in that part of the dominions of the two Contracting Parties in which the said authority exercises jurisdiction; provided, however, that in the United Kingdom the accused shall, in such case, be sent as speedily as possible before a competent Magistrate.

He shall, in accordance with this Article, be discharged, as well in the Republic of Panamá as in the United Kingdom, if within the term of sixty days a requisition for extradition shall not have been made by the Diplomatic Agent or Consul-General of his country in accordance with the stipulations of this Treaty. The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences specified in this Treaty, and committed in the high seas on board any vessel of either country which may come into a port of the other.

#### ARTICLE XI.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime had been committed in the territory of the same State, or if extradition is claimed in respect of an offence of which the fugitive has been already convicted, to prove that the prisoner is the person convicted, and that the crime of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to.

#### ARTICLE XII.

The extradition of fugitives under the provisions of this Treaty shall be carried out in His Britannic Majesty's Dominions and in the Republic of Panamá, respectively, in conformity with the laws regulating extradition for the time being in force in the surrendering State.

## ARTICLE XIII.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the Authorities of the State applied to shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in the other State, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating the fact of a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

- 1. A warrant must purport to be signed by a Judge, Magistrate, or Officer of the other State.
- 2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified, under the hand of a Judge, Magistrate, or Officer of the other State, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be true copies thereof, as the case may require.
- 3. A certificate of or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction must purport to be

### ARTICULO X.

Un criminal fugitivo podrá aprehenderse mediante orden de arresto expedida, por cualquier autoridad competente de uno de los dos paises, en virtud de demandas, quejas ó pruebas ó después de procedimientos que, á juicio de la autoridad que expida la orden, justificarían el arresto si el crimen hubiese sido cometido, ó la persona hubiese sido convicta en aquella parte de los dominios de las dos Partes Contratantes en que dicha autoridad ejerce jurisdicción; siempre que, en el Reino Unido, tan pronto como el acusado sea aprehendido, se le ponga á disposición de un Magistrado competente.

El preso, de acuerdo con este Artículo, será puesto en libertad, tanto en la República de Panamá como en el Reino Unido, si la demanda de extradición no es formalizada por el Agente Diplomático ó Cónsul General de su país, dentro del plazo de sesenta días, de acuerdo con las estipulaciones de este Tratado. Esta misma regla regirá en casos de personas acusadas ó convictas de cualquiera de los crimenes ó delitos mencionados en este Tratado, cometidos en alta mar, á bordo de cualquier barco, perteneciente á una de las Partes que llegue á un puerto de la otra.

#### ARTICULO XI.

## ARTICULO XII.

## ARTICULO XIII.

Al procederse al examen que debe tener lugar de conformidad con las estipulaciones que preceden, las autoridades del Estado á quien se hace la solicitud aceptarán como pruebas válidas las declaraciones juradas ó afirmaciones de testigos tomadas en el otro Estado, ó copias de las mismas, asi como las órdenes de arresto y sentencias consiguientes, y los certificados ó documentos judiciales que comprueben el delito, siempre que sean autenticados como sigue:—

- 1. La orden de prisión deberá ser firmada por un Juez, Magistrado, ó funcionario del otro Estado.
- 2. Las declaraciones ó afirmaciones, ó copias de las mismas, deberán ser certificadas con la firma de un Juez, Magistrado ó funcionario del otro Estado, acreditando que son declaraciones ó afirmaciones originales, ó que son copias fieles de las mismas, según lo requiere el caso.
- 3. El certificado ó documento judicial que compruebe un delito, deberá ser autenticado por

certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or Officer of the other State.

4. In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice or some other Minister of the other State; but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law of the country where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

If the individual claimed by one of the High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to the State whose demand is earliest in date.

ARTICLE XIV.

#### ARTICLE XV.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within ninety days from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to. or the proper Tribunal thereof, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

#### ARTICLE XVI.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery of such articles, be given up when the extradition takes place; and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

### ARTICLE XVII.

All expenses connected with extradition shall be borne by the demanding State.

## ARTICLE XVIII.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the colonies and foreign possessions of His Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws in such colonies and foreign possessions respectively will allow.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of such colonies or foreign possessions shall be made to the Governor or chief authority of such colony or possession by the chief Consular officer of the Republic of Panamá in such colony or possession.

Such requisition may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such colony or foreign possession will allow, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any Colony or foreign possession of His Britannic Majesty shall be governed by rules laid down in the preceding

Articles of the present Treaty.

#### ARTICLE XIX.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties by a notice not

exceeding one year, and not less than six months.

It shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Panamá as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and affixed thereto their respective seals.

Done in duplicate in the Spanish and English languages at Panamá the twenty-fifth day of August, nineteen hundred and six.

HEREAS by the forty-sixth section of "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862," which section is re-enacted by section six hundred and fifty-five of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894" it is provided that if any lighthouse, buoy or beacon is erected or placed or reconstructed, repaired or replaced by any local authority having jurisdiction in the matter of lighthouses, buoys or beacons, His Majesty may, on the application of the said local authority, by Order in Council fix such dues to be paid to the said local authority in respect of every ship which enters the port or harbour under the jurisdiction of such local authority or the estuary wherein such lighthouse, buoy or beacon is situate, and which passes the said lighthouse, buoy or beacon and derives benefit therefrom as His Majesty may deem reasonable: And whereas Her late Majesty by Order in

Council dated twenty-third October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, on the application of the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of King's Lynn in the county of Norfolk thereinafter called the Corporation of King's Lynn as Conservators of the Port and Harbour of King's Lynn and being the local authority having jurisdiction in the matter thereinafter mentioned, fixed the dues to be paid in respect of the Floating Light placed by the Corporation of King's Lynn in the roads in the said port and near the Wisbech Bar Buoy by the vessels therein referred to with the exceptions mentioned therein:

And whereas by section thirty-seven of the King's Lynn Conservancy Act, 1897 (sixty and sixty-one Victoria, chapter one hundred and ninety-six), it is among other things provided that on and from the day of the first meeting of the King's Lynn Conservancy Board, a body duly constituted by the said Act, there shall be by virtue of the said Act transferred to and vested in the said Board subject to the provisions of the said Act, all the powers, rights, privileges and duties of the Corporation as conservators of the port subsisting at the passing of this Act including the powers under the Act 10 George the Fourth, chapter five, the powers for the removal of wrecks under the King's Lynn Corporation Act, 1894, the powers of lighting and buoying

HEREAS by section one hundred and three of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, as amended by section six of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks (Amendment) Act, 1885, it is enacted as follows:-

1. If His Majesty is pleased to make any arrangement with the Government or Governments of any foreign State or States for mutual protection of inventions, designs and trade marks, or any of them, then any person who has applied for protection for any invention, design or trade mark in any such State shall be entitled to a patent for his invention or to registration of his design or trade mark (as the case may be) under this Act, in priority to other applicants and such patent or registration shall have the same date as the date of the application in such foreign State.

Provided that his application is made in the case of a patent within seven months and in the case of a design or trade mark within four months from his applying for protection in the foreign State with which the arrangement is in

force:

Provided that nothing in this section contained shall entitle the patentee or proprietor of the design or trade mark to recover damages for infringements happening prior to the date of the actual acceptance of his complete specification or the actual registration of his design or trade

mark in this country as the care may be.
2. The publication in the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man during the respective periods aforesaid of any description of the invention or the use therein during such periods of the invention or the exhibition or use therein during such periods of the design or the publication therein during such periods of a description or representation of the design or the use therein during such periods of the trade mark

shall not invalidate the patent which may be granted for the invention or the registration of the design or trade mark.

- 3. The application for the grant of a patent or the registration of a design or the registration of a trade mark under this section must be made in the same manner as an ordinary application under this Act provided that in the case of trade marks any trade mark the registration of which has been duly applied for in the country of origin may be registered under this Act.
- 4. The provisions of this section shall apply only in the case of those foreign States with respect to which His Majesty shall from time to time by Order in Council declare them to be applicable and so long only in the case of each State as the Order in Council shall continue in force with respect to that State.

And whereas by section one hundred and four of the said first-mentioned Act it is enacted as follows:—

- 1. Where it is made to appear to His Majesty that the legislature of any British possession has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions designs and trade marks patented or registered in this country it shall be lawful for His Majesty from time to time by Order in Council to apply the provisions of the last preceding section with such variations or additions if any as to His Majesty in Council may seem fit to such British possession.
- 2. An Order in Council under this Act shall from a date to be mentioned for the purpose in the Order take effect as if its provisions had been contained in this Act; but it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to revoke any Order in Council made under this Act.

And whereas by section one of the Patents Act, 1901, it is enacted as follows:—

- 1.—(1) In the first proviso to sub-section one of section one hundred and three of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883 (which section relates to the time for making applications for protection under international arrangements) the words "twelve months" shall be substituted for the words "seven months."
- (2) An application under that section shall be accompanied by a complete specification which if it be not accepted within the period of twelve months shall with the drawings (if any) be open to public inspection at the expiration of that period.

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty The King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, that the Legislature of Trinidad and Tobago has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs and trade marks patented or registered in this country:

Now, therefore, by virtue of the authority committed to His Majesty by the above enactments, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby declare, and it is hereby declared as follows:—

- 1. The provisions of section one hundred and three of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, as amended by section six of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks (Amendment) Act, 1885, and by section one of the Patents Act, 1901, shall apply to the British Possession of Trinidad and Tobago.
- 2. This Order in Council shall take effect from the twelfth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seven.

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Order so far as it affects the parish of Banbury be varied:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that so much of the Order in Council of the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, as relates to burials in the parish of Banbury, be varied, so that, notwithstanding anything therein, it shall be lawful after the death of the Reverend Father Bowen to bury his body in a vault or walled grave to be constructed in the churchyard of the Roman Catholic church of St. John, Banbury, subject to the condition that the coffin shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it was enacted that, in case it appeared to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground should be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case might require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances might require; provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it should please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, should be published in the London Gazette, and should be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation was so considered; provided also that no such representation should be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation should have been given to the Incumbent and vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish of Saint Bartholomew, Holmer, in the county of Hereford, and of the parish of Saint Stephen, Woodville, in the county of Derby, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representations, made representations stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial grounds should be opened in the civil parishes of Holmer and Shelwick, and Woodville, without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials should be discontinued in the said parishes as hereinafter directed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the first day of June, last, to give notice of such representations, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the fifteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in the said civil parishes without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued as follows, viz.:—

HOLMER.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Bartholomew, Holmer, in the county of Hereford; and in the churchyard, except as follows:—

- (a.) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:
- (b.) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave:
- (c.) In the said churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein.

WOODVILLE.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Stephen, Woodville, in the county of Derby; and, after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the churchyard, except as follows:—

- (a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:
- (b.) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave:
- (c.) In the said churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein.

Motor Car Act, 1903. Regulation under Section 8.

COUNTY OF EAST SUSSEX.
Parish of Alfriston.

To the County Council of East Sussex;—And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We, the Local Government Board, may, by Regulations made under Section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in Our opinion, be especially dangerous;

And whereas the County Council of East Sussex, having applied to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned sections restricting the driving of motor cars on part of a certain highway situate within the parish of Alfriston, in the county of East Sussex, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and an Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, after consideration of the said Report, and of all the circumstances of the case, in pursuance of Our powers in that behalf, We do hereby make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—A person shall not drive a motor car on the part of a highway described in the Schedule hereto, at a speed exceeding five miles per hour.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come

into operation on the twenty-fourth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seven.

SCHEDULE.

So much of the road leading from Alfriston to Seaford as lies between a point opposite the north-eastern boundary of the garden attached to the cottages known as West Hill Cottages, Frog Firle, and a point on the said road 90 feet west of the point at which a footpath which leaves the said road opposite Tile Barn rejoins that road.

## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 12TH AUGUST 1907.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:

- 1. Article 6 (2) of the Sheep-Dipping (England) Order of 1907, which restricts the movement of sheep until they have been dipped, shall not apply in the case of movement of sheep from any premises in the administrative county of Warwick or the county boroughs of Birmingham or Coventry, for the purpose of exposure in a market, fair-ground or saleyard, if the movement of the sheep from those premises is authorised by a licence which may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which those premises are situate.
- 2. The licence shall state the market, fair-ground or saleyard at which the sheep are to be exposed, and shall be granted only if the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fair-ground or saleyard is situate have consented to the issue of such a licence, either generally or in the particular instance.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

SHEFFIELD (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.

1.--(1.) Every person having in his possession

or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from animals not so affected or suspected; and (b) with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected or suspected to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the horse, ass, or mule so affected or suspected is.

(2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

Veterinary Inquiry by Local Authority as to existence of Parasitic Mange.

- 2.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving information of the existence, or supposed existence, of parasitic mange shall forthwith cause inquiry to be instituted as to the correctness of such information with the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector, or of a veterinary practitioner qualified according to the Act of 1894 to be a Veterinary Inspector.
- (2.) The owner and occupier of any premises on which there is a horse affected with, or suspected of, parasitic mange, shall give all reasonable facilities for the inquiry by the Local Authority under this Article, and any person failing to give such facilities shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

## Detention of Animals.

- 3.—(1.) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority may serve a Notice (in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect) on the occupier of any stable, shed, field or other premises in which there is a horse, ass, or mule, which in his opinion is affected with parasitic mange, and thereupon the following restrictions shall take effect:—
  - (i.) The horse, ass, or mule so affected shall not be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises specified in the Notice, except with the written authority, and under the supervision, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and only to some other place of detention; and during the detention it shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, be treated by the owner thereof with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority;
  - (ii.) No other horse, ass, or mule shall be moved out of the stable, shed, field, or other premises, unless on each occasion immediately before the movement it is treated with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority.
- (2.) A Notice under this Order shall remain in force until it is withdrawn by a Notice in writing served on the occupier of the premises by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

- 4.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:
  - (i.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by, and of utensils,

mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about, any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange:

- (ii.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be effected:
- (iii.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect any such place, utensils, mangers, feedingtroughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things, at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee, or occupier:
- (iv.) For requiring the removal by the owner from contact with horses, asses, or mules, of litter used for or about any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange.
- (2.) The mode of disinfection shall be one of those prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (3.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, or to remove any litter, in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority; without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, to be cleansed and disinfected, or to remove such litter, and to recover summarily the expenses thereby incurred from such person.
- (4.) Where the power conferred by the preceding provisions of this Article is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee, or occupier of the place to be cleansed and disinfected shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

- 5.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Order:
- (2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

#### Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

6. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to oftences or procedure.

## Exemption of Army Veterinary Department and Veterinary Colleges.

7. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass, or mule kept in stables of military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Department, or in stables of

any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

## Offences.

- 8.—(1.) If a horse, ass, or mule is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice under this Order, the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the horse, ass, or mule is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894:
- (2.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of this Order, or of any Regulation made thereunder, the owner and the lessee and the occupier and the person in charge of any place or thing in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any owner, occupier, or person in charge of premises requiring to be cleansed and disinfected fails to give the facilities to a Local Authority required under this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894:

#### Interpretation.

- 9. In this Order-
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector:
- "The Act of 1894:" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

## Extent.

10. This Order extends only to the city of Sheffield.

#### Revocation.

11. The Order described in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby revoked as from the commencement of this Order; Provided that all regulations made by the Local Authority under the said revoked Order and in force immediately before the commencement of this Order shall continue in force until altered or revoked by the Local Authority or by the Board and shall have effect as if they had been made under this Order.

## Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of August, nineteen hundred and seven.

## Short Title.

13. This Order may be cited as the Sheffield (Parasitic Mange) Order of 1907.

Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or of any Order by which such provisions are applied to any scheduled area, swine may be moved to the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and from such exhibition to any place of destination in Great Britain situate in any scheduled area, if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement.
- 2. In the case of movement to the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by some person authorised in that behalf by the Lancashire County Council, and in the case of movement from the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.
- 3. The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the exhibition or place of destination specified in the Licence and not elsewhere, and while being so moved shall not be subject to Regulations made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board relating to Swine-Fever.

WALLSEND PIGGERIES (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894

to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

## Premises to which this Order applies.

- 1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the borough of Wallsend to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of that borough and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.
- (2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the said Local Authority.

### Restriction on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies; Provided that this Order shall not affect the movement of swine under and in accordance with a licence granted under any other Order of the Board.

## Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.

- 3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies in a suitable vehicle to a slaughter-house situate in the borough of Wallsend, for the purpose of immediate slaughter with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of that borough, which Licence shall be in force for not more than two days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the slaughter-house to which the swine are to be moved.
- (2.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (3.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and shall be slaughtered after their arrival at the slaughter-house, without unnecessary delay.

## Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicle used for Movement of Swine.

- 4.—(1.) Any vehicle which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article, shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the owner of the vehicle as follows:
  - (i.) The floor of the vehicle and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and

- other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom:; then
- (ii.) The same parts of the vehicle shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then
- (iii.) The same parts of the vehicle shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

## Movement of Swine to Pnemises to which this Order applies.

- 5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of the borough of Wallsend, which Licence shall be in force for not more than six days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the place and premises to which the swine are to be moved, and shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the swine or of his agent authorised in writing for this purpose to the following effect—
  - (a.) that the swine to be moved have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence;
  - (b.) that the swine are not affected with swinefever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever; and
  - (c.) that the swine are not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.
- (2.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (3.) The declaration as to swine to be moved shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
- (4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the Licence thereon.

#### Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand | 10. This as aforesaid, give his name and address to the nineteenth Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer. and seven.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

7. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

## Offences.

- 8.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any vehicle used for the movement of swine, the owner, or other person for the time being in charge of the vehicle, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (5.) If a pig is not slaughtered as required by this Order, the person to whom the Licence is granted, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (6.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1834.

ACCRINGTON CORPORATION TRAMWAYS.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the following Bye-laws have been made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Accrington, acting by the Town Council as the Promoters of the Accrington Corporation Tramways Undertaking, under and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870.

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Accrington and such other Local Authority as may for the time being use the tramways of the Corporation; the word "Tramways" means the tramway system for the time being worked by the Corporation, whether situate in the Borough of Accrington or in any other District; the word

tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car; and the word "Driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car.

Extent of Bye-laws.

2. The Bye-laws hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to every car using the tram-

Entering or Leaving Cars.

3. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

Terminus.

4. No person shall enter or mount, or attempt to enter or mount, any car arriving or standing at a terminus, stopping place, or other place, until such passengers as may be upon the car and as desire to alight shall have alighted.

Entering or leaving Car in Motion.

5. No person shall enter, board, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, board, mount or leave any car whilst in motion.

Smoking.

6. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette inside any car, except in a portion or compartment specially set apart for the purpose.

Musical Instruments.

7. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

bscene or Offensive Language, &c.

8. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or spit, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or tramway station, or premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

#### Intoxicated Persons.

9. No person who is in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder, shall enter or mount upon any car, and if any such person is found in or upon any car it shall be lawful for the conductor, or any other officer or servant of the Corpora-tion, to immediately remove such person from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

Damage to Cars.

10. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws be liable for the amount of any damage so done.

Objectionable Persons.

11. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the seats, linings or cushions of a car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, and no person who, in the opinion of the conductor, "Car" means any carriage or car run upon the | might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall be entitled to enter or remain in any car, and may be prevented from entering any car, and shall not enter or mount any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor: Provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in a car under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Payment of Fares.

12. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation, the fare legally demandable for the journey, and obtain a ticket therefor. No child under three years of age who is sitting on the lap of a passenger shall be liable to pay a fare.

#### Tickets.

13. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to the conductor or any duly authorized officer of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do by the conductor or any duly authorized officer of the Corporation, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger. Tickets shall not be transferable, and any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey.

Artisans.

14. No person not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the tramways, shall use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, or travel or attempt to travel on the tramways as an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer.

Luggage.

15. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not inside or on the roof of any car.

#### Travelling on Steps, &c.

16. No person not being an officer or servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty shall travel or ride on the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car, or shall stand in any case on the outside or except by the express permission of the Conductor first obtained, in the interior of any car.

No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall board a car, and no person shall

hold or hang on to any part of a car.

## Full Number of Passengers.

17. When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided in such interior, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

When any car contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter,

mount, or remain thereon.

### Dogs.

18. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in the interior of any car nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal is offensive or an annoyance to any passenger shall the same be allowed on the outside of any car.

No person shall take a dog or other animal on any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken or being on any car in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

#### Firearms, &c.

19. No person shall enter, mount, or travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement which may, in the opinion of the conductor, be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

#### Obstruction.

20. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any conductor, driver, or other officer or servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

21. No person other than the conductor or driver, or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car or its equipment, or signal a car to start.

#### Disabled Cars.

22. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and, if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car on the same day, for the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or injured car.

#### Bye-laws to be placed in Cars.

23. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of the Bye-laws.

## Enforcing Bye-laws.

24. Every conductor and driver of a car shall to the best of his ability enforce these Bye-laws and prevent the breach thereof, and if any such conductor or driver fails to enforce the same as aforesaid he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

### Penalty.

25. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings

## Power to Remove Passengers Committing Offence.

26. Any person who shall commit, whilst on any car, any legal offence, or any breach of these Bye-laws, shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and, if such person shall have paid his fare, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

## Repeal of Existing Bye-laws.

27. From and after the date of these Bye-laws coming into force the Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Corporation and the Accrington Corporation Steam Tramways Company Limited, which came into force on the 1st day of November, 1886, shall be repealed.

28. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1907.

ACCRINGTON CORPORATION TRANSAUSS.

Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Accrington, acting by the Town Council as the Local Authority, under Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, with respect to the Accrington Corporation Tramways.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "Car" shall mean any carriage or car using any tramway laid down within the said borough, and the terms "Driver" and "Conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car.

charge of a car.

2. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a

less distance than forty yards.

3. Subject to the requirements of Bye-law No. 2, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers at any place appointed as a stopping place by the Corporation, when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by

the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made.

4. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

5. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

6. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

Repeal of Existing Bye-laws.

7. From and after the date of these Bye-laws coming into force the Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Town Council, which came into force on the 1st day of November, 1886, shall be repealed.

8. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1907.
