**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.**

(DATED 26TH AUGUST 1907.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The provisions of the Dorsetshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1907 relating to the regulation of exhibitions shall not apply to the exhibitions mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Dorsetshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1907, or of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or any Order by which such provisions are applied to any scheduled area, swine may be moved to any exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto and from any such exhibition to any place of destination in Great Britain situate in any such scheduled area, if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement.

3.—(1.) In the case of movement to any such exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by some person authorised in that behalf by the Dorsetshire County Council on a Declaration by the owner of the swine or his authorised agent stating the number and description of the swine to be moved and declaring :

- (i.) That to the best of his knowledge and belief the swine are not affected with swine-fever, and have not been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever; and
- (ii.) That the swine are not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and that the movement of the swine is not prohibited by notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(2.) The declaration as to swine to be moved shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the District where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
