RAILWAY AND CANAL TRAFFIC ACT, 1888.

Whereas application has been made to the Board of Trade on behalf of all the Railway Companies in the United Kingdom to amend the classification of merchandise traffic and Schedules of Maximum Rates and Charges fixed in pursuance of the above mentioned Act, by adding to the said classification the following articles, matters, or things, viz.:--

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers in them vested by the provisions of section 24, sub-section (11), of the above mentioned Act, do hereby determine and order that the classification of merchandise traffic and Schedules of Maximum Rates and Charges confirmed by the Acts of Parliament set out in the Schedule to this Order be amended in mauner following, that is to say, by adding to

Class 5.—Calculating Machines.

LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

Clacton-on-Sea and St. Osyth Light Railway (Extension of Time) Order, 1907.

The Light Railway Commissioners have sub-mitted to the Board of Trade for confirmation, under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made

by them reviving the powers granted aud extending the periods limited by the Clacton-on-Sea and St. Osyth Light Railway Order, 1904, for the compulsory purchase of lands and for the completion of the railway and works by that Order authorised, and for other purposes.

Now, therefore, I, Sir William Cospatrick Dunbar, Bart., C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

by notice given by an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries given under any Order of that Board :

- (iii.) a licence authorising movement under this Order must be obtained from the Clerk of the Local Authority of the District, or of any Committee of the Local Authority, or from any person appointed by the Local Authority to act as Chief Inspector for the purposes of the above mentioned Acts, and any such licence shall state the period for which the licence is available and shall be in the Form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, and may be determined at any time by a notice given or sent by post to such occupier by any person authorised by this Order to issue licences; and
- (iv.) the swine must be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay and must be accompanied by the licence authorising the movement. 3. This Order shall cease to operate on the

first day of December, nineteen hundred and seven.
