### A PROCLAMATION

Declaring that the Colony of New Zealand shall be called and known by the title of the Dominion of New Zealand.

EDWARD R. & I.

Whereas We have on the Petition of the Members of the Legislative Council and House of Representatives of Our Colony of New Zealand determined that the title of the Dominion of New Zealand shall be substituted for that of the Colony of New Zealand as the designation of the said Colony, We have therefore by and with the advice of Our Privy Council thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation and We do ordain, declare and command that on and after the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seven, the said Colony of New Zealand and the territory belonging thereto shall be called and known by the title of the Dominion of New Zealand. And We hereby give Our Commands to all Public Departments accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this ninth day of September, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seven, and in the seventh year of Our Reign.

## Whitehall, September 9, 1907.

The KING has been pleased to confer the Albert Medal of the First Class upon Mr. William Henry Pearce, of Islington, near Newcastle, New South Wales, for conspicuous gallantry in saving life on the railway between Maitland and Newcastle, on the 4th December, 1905, as detailed below:—

On the morning of the day mentioned, while the passenger train running between Maitland and Sydney was approaching Thornton Railway Station, at the rate of 45 miles an hour, a boiler plate of the engine collapsed, and through the opening, about 12 inches square, steam and boiling water were ejected with great force. Both the driver of the engine, James Pead, who has since succumbed to his injuries, and the fireman, Pearce, were severely scalded. Pead was quite incapacitated, and was still exposed to the full force of the escaping steam when Pearce, at great personal risk, lifted him to a place of safety behind the bunker tank.

Pearce having endeavoured, without success, to close the throttle valve, climbed over the cab of the engine, along the boiler, to the front of the engine, exposing himself again to the escaping water and steam, and having reached the footplate of the engine, and placed one leg in the draw hook for support, he reached under the buffer plank for a distance of about 18 inches, and opened the cock of the air pipe, thus applying the automatic brake and bringing the train to a standstill.

The presentation of the medal, in the name of His Majesty, was performed by His Excellency the Governor-General of Australia, at Government House, Sydney, on the 16th July.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Norfolk) Order, 1907.

Dated 9th September, 1907.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Norfolk, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Norfolk) Order, 1907."

BIRDS.

Close Time extended.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the County of Norfolk, so far as regards all Birds mentioned in the schedule to that Act, or added thereto by Clause III of this Order, except the Snipe, Teal, and all species of Wild Duck, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of September in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the county of Norfolk to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act :-

Great Bustard, Crossbill, Sand Martin, Bearded

Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant).

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 2nd day of March following the killing or taking of the Bittern, Little Bittern, Great Bustard, Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Owl (all species), and Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), is prohibited throughout the County of Norfolk.

All Birds protected on Sundays in certain Areas.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Act of 1880, and by Clause II of this Order, does not extend, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited within the areas described in Article VI. paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), and (e) of this Order.

## EGGS.

All Eggs protected in certain Areas.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited during the period expiring on the last day of February, 1912,

within the following areas:-

(a.) Hickling Broad, Whitesley and Heigham Sounds, Blackfleet Broad, Horsey Mere, Martham and Somerton Broads, and the rands, skirts, and walls thereof, and fens and reed grounds appertaining thereto respectively, and the islands therein, and the dykes communicating therewith, including the Hundred Stream or Thurne River and ancient bed, and the rands and walls thereof from Heigham Bridge to the sea at Winterton, and all the marshes and low-lying and uncultivated lands, fens, reed grounds, warrens, marram or sand hills and sea shore, to the line of high-water mark, in the several parishes of Waxham, Horsey, Potter Heigham, and Hickling, and such part of the parish of Catfield as lies to the east of the Midland and Great Northern Joint Railway.

(b.) The warrens, marram or sand hills and sea shore, to the line of high-water mark, in the parish of Winterton.

(c.) Such parts of the Rivers Yare and Wensum as are within the Administrative County of Norfolk, and the streams communicating therewith; the River Bure and the streams communicating therewith; and Rockland and Surlingham Broads and the rands, skirts, and walls of each river and broad, and fens and reed grounds appertaining thereto respectively, and the islands therein, and the dykes communicating therewith.

(d.) The series of Broads known as Ormesby Rollesby, Hemsby, Filby, and Burgh Broads, and the rands, skirts, and walls thereof, and the dykes communicating therewith, and the fens,

reed grounds, and low-lying lands, marshes, and pastures adjacent thereto, including Lady Broad or Hard Fen Water, in the parish of Filby, Brandyke Broad, in the parish of Burgh St. Margaret, and Muckfleet Dyke, and the marshes and low-lying lands and pastures near or adjacent thereto respectively.

(e.) The whole of the foreshore of the County of Norfolk, including the shingle, sand hills, salt marshes, creeks, and other unenclosed lands extending from high-water mark to the first boundary of enclosed or cultivated land separat-

ing the foreshore from them.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Norfolk:-Bittern, Little Bittern, Great Bustard, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Norfolk Plover, Thick-Knee), Great Crested Grebe or Loon, Kingfisher, Sand Martin, Owl (all species), Oyster Catcher (Sea Pie), Ringed Plover (Ringed Dotterel, Stone Runner), Ruff or Reeve, Terns, Sea Swallows, Pearls, or Dip Ears (all species), Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Wild Duck and Teal (all species).

Repeal of former Order.

VIII. The Order of the 6th November, 1905, is hereby repealed.

## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 10TH SEPTEMBER 1907.)

## WARWICKSHIRE (GOOSEBERRY MILDEW) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

## Application of the Order.

1. This Order shall apply to the administrative county of Warwick and the county boroughs of Birmingham and Coventry and the boroughs of Royal Leamington Spa and Warwick.

## Definitions.

- 2. In this Order-
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "The Local Authority" means as regards any District described in the first column of the schedule hereto, the council mentioned in the second column of that schedule:
- "Disease" means the disease affecting gooseberry and currant bushes which is known as Sphaerotheca mors-uvae or American gooseberry mildew; and "diseased" means affected with disease:
- "Bush" includes a cutting, seedling, or other plant.

## Notification of Disease.

- 3.—(1.) The occupier of any premises on which there is a bush which is diseased or suspected of being diseased shall forthwith notify the fact to the clerk to the Local Authority, or to some person authorised by the Local Authority to receive such notices, and where practicable a specimen showing the disease or suspected disease shall accompany the notice.
- (2.) If any person knowingly fail to give a notice required by this Order to be given by him he shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

### Measures for Prevention of the Spread of Disease.

- 4.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving in any manner notice of the existence or supposed existence of disease shall take such steps as may be necessary to determine whether the disease exists, and the area covered by diseased bushes, or by bushes to which the disease is likely to spread, and shall cause a notice to be served on the occupier of any land within that area requiring him to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the disease as are authorised by this Article.
  - (2.) A notice under this Article shall require—
  - (i.) the immediate spraying of all diseased bushes which have not shed their leaves and of all bushes in contact with such diseased bushes with a solution of liver of sulphur (containing not less than 1 oz. of liver of sulphur to two gallons of water) or with

behalf of the Local Authority for that pur-

pose;

(ii.) as soon as is practicable after such spraying the burning or other effective destruction of all diseased bushes, including the

fruit on such bushes (if any);

(iii.) the thorough spraying as soon as possible with a solution of copper sulphate (containing at least one pound of copper sulphate to a gallon of water) or with some other fungicide approved by or on behalf of the Local Authority for that purpose of the site of any bush that has been destroyed;

(iv.) the thorough spraying of all gooseberry and current bushes on the area defined in the notice with a fungicide approved by or on behalf of the Local Authority for that purpose and so that the spraying shall be carried out at such time or times as an inspector of the Local Authority shall direct and to his satisfaction;

(v.) that no gooseberry or current bush or any part of any such bush shall be removed or permitted to be removed out of the area defined in the notice except with, and subject to the conditions (if any) of, a licence authorising such removal, but this restriction shall not apply to fruit of a bush that is not diseased.

(3.) Any notice may be altered or withdrawn by the Local Authority if and when they are satisfied that this may be done without risk of the spread of disease.

(4.) If any person fail to adopt any measure for prevention of the spread of the disease required by a notice served on him under this Article he shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

## Returns of Proceedings.

5. The Local Authority shall in a form to be provided by the Board notify the Board of any outbreak of disease, and shall as soon as may be after the expiration of each year report to the Board the proceedings taken by the Local Authority under this Order in the preceding year.

## Powers of Entry.

6. Any inspector or other officer appointed in that behalf by the Local Authority, and any

some other fungicide approved by or on | inspector of the Board, may upon production if so required of his appointment or authority enter any land on which he has reason to believe that disease exists or has recently existed and examine any gooseberry or currant bush on such land and any person who wilfully obstructs or impedes any inspector or other officer in the course of his duties under this Order shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

## Notification of Order.

7. This Order shall be published by the Local Authority by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district of the Local Authority or in such other manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to insure publicity for the

## Execution of the Order.

8.—(1.) The Local Authority of each District mentioned in the schedule hereto shall carry into effect this Order within that District, and shall appoint such inspectors or other officers for that

purpose as may be necessary.

(2.) For the purposes of this Order a notice shall be deemed to be served on a person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there, and a notice or other document purporting to be signed by the clerk of a Local Authority shall be prima facie evidence that it was signed by him and duly authorised by the Local Authority.

#### Commencement.

9. This Order shall come into operation on the sixteenth day of September, nineteen hundred and seven.
