be simplified and improved, and the system of Government better adapted both to meet the requirements and promote the welfare of the different provinces, and, without impairing its strength and unity, to bring the executive power into closer touch with local conditions:

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these Presents authorize and appoint you, the said Sir Henry William Primrose (Chairman); Sir Frederic Styles Philpin Lely; Sir Steyning William Edgerley; Romesh Chunder Dutt; William Stevenson Meyer; and William Lionel Hitchens to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said enquiry.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power, at any place in Our said United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or in India, to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also, whether in Our said United Kingdom, or in India, to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid.

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this, Our Commission, shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof; and of every matter and thing therein

contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint George, situate at Heap Bridge, as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Arbutnott, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint James, Heywood, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint George, situate at Heap Bridge, as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint George, Heap Bridge.'

"And with the like consent of the said Edmund Arbutnott, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint George, situate at Heap Bridge, as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint George, Heap Bridge, being:—

"All that part of the new parish (sometime particular district) of Saint James, Heywood, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, which is bounded upon the north partly by the new parish of Birkle, otherwise Birtle, and partly by the new parish of Saint Paul, Bury, upon the west partly by the last named new parish, partly by the new parish of Saint Thomas, Bury, and partly by the new parish of Saint Peter, Bury, upon the greater part of the south by the new parish of Saint George, Unsworth, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint George, Unsworth, from the said new parish of Saint James, Heywood, at the point known as Three-lane Ends where the road leading from Heap Bridge to Birch is joined by Heywood-road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Heywood-road for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with Harwood's-road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Harwood's-road for a distance of eleven chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where it

And whereas the Right Honourable Herbert John Gladstone, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State did, in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament, by warrant given under his hand and seal at Whitehall, on the twenty-fifth

day of February, one thousand nine hundred and seven, duly appoint me, Edward Thornton Hill Lawes, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of, and apportioning the Councillors among, the wards of the said Borough of Richmond:

Now I the said Edward Thornton Hill Lawes, in pursuance of the powers given to me by virtue of the said appointment under the said Act, do hereby determine as hereinafter mentioned the boundaries of the said six wards into which the said borough is divided, which wards are hereinafter named and numbered as follows, that is to say:—

- No. 1. North Ward.
- No. 2. West Ward.
- No. 3. East Ward.
- No. 4. South Ward.
- No. 5. North Sheen Ward.
- No. 6. Kew Ward.

No. 1.—North Ward.

I do hereby determine that North Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Richmond as is contained within a line commencing at a point on the municipal borough boundary in the River Thames at the bridge where the London and South Western Railway (Windsor Line) crosses the said river and running thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of the said railway to a point opposite the corner of the Old Deer Park wall near Park-lane, thence to and along the said Deer Park wall as far as the private road leading to Kew Observatory, thence along the centre of such private road and Clarence-street in a south-easterly direction to the centre of Kew-road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Kew-road to the junction of Lower Mortlake-road, continuing thence along the centre of Lower Mortlake-road to the point where the same passes over the centre of the London and South Western Railway from Richmond to Kensington, thence along the centre of the said railway in a northerly direction past Kew Gardens Station to the point where the Kew parish boundary intersects the said railway, thence following the said Kew parish boundary in a south-westerly direction intersecting Mortlake-road to a point at the junction of Sandycombe-road, Station-road, Kew Gardens-road, and Broomfield-road, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Broomfield-road to the centre of Kew-road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Kew-road aforesaid to a point near Hatherley-road, thence in a westerly direction across Kew Gardens, still following the said Kew parish boundary across the lake to a point where the same meets the municipal borough boundary in the river, and thence in a south-westerly and southerly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid at the said railway bridge.

No. 2.—West Ward.

And I do hereby determine that West Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point on the municipal borough boundary at the said railway bridge over the River Thames, and running thence along part of the southern boundary of North Ward as hereinbefore described along the centre of the said railway, along the Old Deer Park wall and along the centre of the said private road and Clarence-street to the point in the centre of Kew-road aforesaid, thence intersecting Kew-road and running in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Church-road

over the railway and continuing to a point where Church-road meets the Vineyard, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of the Vineyard to a point in Hill Rise opposite Compass Hill and along the centre of Compass Hill to Petersham-road, thence northerly for a short distance along the line of the present boundary in Lower-road below the West and South Wards and thence in a straight line to the municipal borough boundary in the River Thames, thence in a north-westerly direction following the said municipal borough boundary in the river past Richmond Bridge and Corporation Island to the point of commencement aforesaid at the said railway bridge.

No. 3.—East Ward.

And I do hereby determine that East Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point in Kew-road opposite Clarence-street thence following part of the southern boundary of North Ward as hereinbefore described along the centre of Kew-road and Lower Mortlake-road to the aforesaid point where the same passes over the centre of the London and South Western Railway from Richmond to Kensington, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Manor-road intersecting the London and South Western Railway (Windsor Line) thence continuing along the centre of Manor-road in a southerly direction intersecting Sheen-road to a point on the south side of Sheen-road opposite the centre of Manor-road, thence in a south-westerly direction to the centre of Queen's-road near the Black Horse Inn, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Queen's-road to the point where an ancient boundary crosses the said road at the southern end of Pest House Common, thence along the said ancient boundary in a westerly direction intersecting Denbigh-gardens and along the southern wall of the garden of Holy Trinity Vicarage to a point in King's-road opposite Audley-road, thence along the centre of Audley-road and Albert-road, crossing Albany-passage, still following the said ancient boundary along the centre of Preston-place to the centre of Church-road opposite the Vineyard, thence along the centre of Church-road in a north-westerly direction following the eastern boundary of West Ward as hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid in Kew-road.

No. 4.—South Ward.

And I do hereby determine that South Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point on the municipal borough boundary in the River Thames where the southern boundary of West Ward meets the same, thence following the said southern boundary of West Ward intersecting Hill Rise along the centre of the Vineyard and continuing along the ancient boundary forming the southern boundary of East Ward as hereinbefore described to the aforesaid point where the same crosses the centre of Queen's-road at the southern end of Pest House Common, thence along the centre of Queen's-road in a northerly direction following the eastern boundary of East Ward as hereinbefore described to the aforesaid point on the south side of Sheen-road opposite the centre of Manor-road, thence leaving the eastern boundary of East Ward and continuing along the south side of Sheen-road to the point where it meets the municipal borough boundary, thence following the said municipal borough boundary in a southerly and westerly direction to and through Richmond Park and

Sudbrook Park, across Petersham-road, and thence still following the municipal borough boundary to a point in the River Thames near Ham House, thence following the said municipal borough boundary in the River Thames to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 5.—North Sheen Ward.

No. 6.—Kew Ward.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the seventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted,

inter alia, that all pay, pensions and other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Royal Marine Forces to a person being or having been an Officer, seaman or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council.

"And whereas the crews of Your Majesty's Ships are at present victualled according to the scale of dietary laid down in Appendix X of the regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service, and are allowed the option of receiving, in lieu of provisions not taken up in kind, a money payment according to the scale of prices for savings laid down in Appendix XI of those regulations;

"And whereas we are of opinion that the comfort and well-being of Your Majesty's Navy will be promoted by a revision of these arrangements;

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the introduction of the following arrangements for the victualling of the crews of Your Majesty's ships, in lieu of the system now in force, as from the first October, one thousand nine hundred and seven, or in the case of any of Your Majesty's ships serving on distant stations, from such later date as we may deem advisable:—

"(1.) All persons borne on the books of Your Majesty's ships to be victualled according to the scales of dietary contained in the first schedule attached hereto, and to receive the messing allowance mentioned therein.

"(2.) Officers, Commissioned Warrant Officers, or Warrant Officers of Your Majesty's Navy, or Royal Marines borne on ships' books, and domestics, to receive at our discretion in lieu of the victuals and messing allowance mentioned in the said schedule, an inclusive messing allowance at the rate of tenpence per diem; subject to a deduction at the rate of halfpenny per diem in the case of any Commissioned Warrant Officer or Warrant Officer of Your Majesty's Navy or Royal Marines, or domestic, who elects to receive the ration of spirit in kind.

"Whereas, also, we are of opinion that it is desirable to make improved provision for the supply of soft bread in Your Majesty's ships when at sea;

"We would further beg leave to recommend that, when the exigencies of the Service render it necessary for bread to be baked by the cooks in the ship's galley, extra pay shall be allowed to the cooking staff for undertaking bread-making in addition to their ordinary duties, according to the scale set forth in the second schedule attached hereto.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

(2.) Grog money is to be paid, in addition to the above messing allowance, under the same regulations as at present.

(3.) Messes are to be allowed (subject to such regulations as may from time to time be laid down), the option of taking up no rations of meat on one day in the week and of receiving, in lieu of the same, an additional money allowance at the rate of 2d. per ration.

(4.) In time of war, or under other arduous conditions, the dinner rations of fresh, salt, and preserved meat may, under the authority of the Commander-in-Chief, or senior officer present, be increased as follows:—

(4.) The work of removing and reburying the said remains, and of removing and disposing of the earth, gravel, or other materials aforesaid, shall be carried out under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer of Health for the rural district of Amersham.

And whereas the Local Government Board, after ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representation had been duly given to the churchwardens of the parish of Saint Mary, Amersham, in the county of Buckingham, have

made a representation stating that they are of opinion that the said Order in Council of the 22nd day of October, 1906, should be varied in the manner hereinafter set forth.

That notwithstanding anything in the said Order in Council, it shall be lawful to reinter in the portion of the said churchyard which is situate on the north side of the said church, at or below the depth of five feet below the surface of the ground, certain human remains which have been or are about to be removed from beneath the clergy vestry of the said church; and

(b.) That, except as hereinafter provided, burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in every part of the said church, provided that in the vault belonging to the Drake family situate at the east end of the church burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin interred therein shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the twenty-sixth day of October next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said twenty-sixth day of October.

WHEREAS it is expedient to make further provision for the exercise of the power and jurisdiction vested by Treaty in His Majesty the King in and over the Island of Cyprus:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy

Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. There shall be a High Commissioner and Commander-in-Chief (hereinafter called "the High Commissioner") in and over the said Island of Cyprus (hereinafter called "the Island"), and the person who shall fill the said office of High Commissioner shall be from time to time appointed by Commission under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet.

II. The High Commissioner shall administer the Government of the Island in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, and shall do and execute in due manner all things that shall belong to his said office, according to the tenour of any Orders of His Majesty in Council relating to the Island, and of such Commission as may be issued to him under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such instructions as may from time to time be given to him, under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, or by Order of His Majesty in Council, or by His Majesty through one of His Principal Secretaries of State, and to such laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in the Island.

III. The High Commissioner shall keep and use the public seal of the Island for the sealing of all things whatsoever that shall pass the said public seal.

IV. In the event of the death, incapacity, removal, or absence from the Island of the High Commissioner for the time being, all and every the powers and authorities herein granted to him shall, until His Majesty's further pleasure is signified therein, be vested in such person as may be appointed by an instrument under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet to administer the government of the Island; or if there be not in the Island any person so appointed, then in the person for the time being lawfully discharging the functions of Chief Secretary to the Government of the Island. Provided that no such powers or authorities shall vest in any such person until he shall have taken the oath or oaths directed to be taken by the High Commissioner by any instructions under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet in the manner therein prescribed.

V. The High Commissioner may make and execute in His Majesty's name and on His behalf, under the public seal of the Island, grants and dispositions of any lands which may be lawfully granted or disposed of by His Majesty within the Island.

VI. The High Commissioner may constitute and appoint all such Judges, Justices of the Peace, and other necessary officers in the Island as may lawfully be appointed by His Majesty, all of whom shall hold their offices during His Majesty's pleasure.

VII. The High Commissioner may, as he shall see occasion, in His Majesty's name and on His behalf, grant to any offender convicted of any crime in any Court, or before any Judge, Justice, or Magistrate within the Island, a free and unconditional pardon, or a pardon subject to such conditions as may at any time be lawfully thereunto annexed, or any respite of the execution of the sentence of any such offender for such period as to him may seem fit.

VIII. The High Commissioner may, as he shall see occasion, in His Majesty's name and on His behalf, remit any fines, penalties, or forfeitures which may accrue or become payable to Him provided the same do not exceed the sum of fifty pounds sterling in any one case, and may suspend the payment of any such fine, penalty, or forfeiture exceeding the said sum of

fifty pounds, until His Majesty's pleasure thereon shall be made known and signified to him.

IX. The High Commissioner may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, suspend from the exercise of his office any person holding any office within the Island. Every such suspension shall continue and have effect only until His Majesty's pleasure therein shall be signified to the High Commissioner. In proceeding to any such suspension, the High Commissioner is strictly to observe the directions in that behalf given to him by any instructions under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet that may from time to time be addressed to him.

X. There shall be in the Island, for the purpose of advising the High Commissioner, an Executive Council, which shall be composed of such persons and constituted in such manner as may be directed by any instructions which may from time to time be addressed to the High Commissioner by His Majesty, under His Sign Manual and Signet, and all such persons shall hold their places in the said Council during His Majesty's pleasure: and the said Executive Council shall observe such rules in the conduct of business as may from time to time be contained in any such instructions as aforesaid.

XI. There shall be in the Island a Legislative Council constituted as hereinafter mentioned.

XII. It shall be lawful for the High Commissioner, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, to make all such laws as may from time to time be necessary for the peace, order, and good government of the Island, with this qualification, that it shall not be lawful for the High Commissioner and the Legislative Council to make any law altering the constitution of the Legislative Council. Full authority is nevertheless hereby reserved to His Majesty, His heirs and successors, through one of His or their Principal Secretaries of State, to confirm or disallow any such laws in the whole or in part, and to make and establish from time to time, with the advice of His or their Privy Council, all such laws as to Him or them may appear necessary for the peace, order, and good government of the Island, as fully as if this Order had not been made.

Any law, or any part thereof, which shall be disallowed by His Majesty, His heirs and successors, shall cease to be of any force or effect so soon as the disallowance thereof shall be notified by proclamation by the High Commissioner.

XIII. Whenever any law is presented to the High Commissioner for his assent he may declare that he assents to such law, or that he refuses his assent thereto, or that he reserves the same for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure.

No law—other than a law reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure—made by the High Commissioner, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, shall take effect until the High Commissioner shall have assented thereto in the name of His Majesty, and on His behalf, and shall have signed the same in token of such assent.

No law so reserved shall take effect until His Majesty's pleasure that it shall take effect shall have been published in the Island.

XIV. The High Commissioner shall not assent to any law whereby any of the taxes, imposts, or duties at present levied shall be altered or discontinued unless His Majesty's approval of such alteration or discontinuance shall have previously been signified.

XV. The Legislative Council shall consist of the High Commissioner and eighteen Members,

of whom twelve shall be elective and six non-elective.

The Council shall not be disqualified from the transaction of business by reason of any vacancies among the elective or non-elective Members thereof.

XVI. The non-elective Members of the Legislative Council shall be the persons for the time being discharging the duties of such public offices in Cyprus as shall from time to time be designated by any instruction under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet (who shall be styled "ex-officio" Members), and such other persons holding for the time being public offices in Cyprus as may from time to time be appointed by His Majesty by any instruction or warrant under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet or through one of His Principal Secretaries of State.

The non-elective Members other than *ex-officio* Members shall hold their seats until the next dissolution of the Legislative Council after their appointment or until they shall previously cease to hold any public office in Cyprus, or be removed by virtue of instructions or warrants under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet or suspended by the High Commissioner.

The High Commissioner may, by an instrument under the public seal of the Island, suspend any non-elective Member other than an *ex-officio* Member from the exercise of his functions as a Member. Every such suspension shall forthwith be reported by the High Commissioner to one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and shall remain in force unless and until it is either removed by the High Commissioner by an instrument under the public seal of the Island, or disallowed by His Majesty through one of His Principal Secretaries of State.

XVII. If any non-elective Member of the Legislative Council shall by writing under his hand resign his seat in the Council, or shall die, or from any cause cease to be or become incapable of acting as a Member of the Council, or be suspended from the exercise of his functions as a Member, or be temporarily absent from the Island, or shall either permanently or temporarily become an *ex-officio* Member, the High Commissioner may, by an instrument under the public seal of the Island, appoint any fit person to be provisionally a Member of the Council in the place of such Member. Every such provisional appointment may be disallowed by His Majesty through one of His Principal Secretaries of State, or may be revoked by the High Commissioner by any such instrument as aforesaid.

A Member provisionally appointed shall forthwith cease to be a Member if his appointment is disallowed by His Majesty, or if the Member in whose place he was appointed shall return to the Island, or be declared by the High Commissioner capable of exercising his functions as a Member of the Council.

XVIII. The non-elective Members of the Legislative Council shall take precedence of the elective Members, and shall have seniority and rank among themselves in the order of precedence of their respective public offices, or, in case of any doubt, as His Majesty shall direct through one of His Principal Secretaries of State.

XIX. Of the twelve elective Members of the Legislative Council three shall be elected by the Mahometan and nine by the non-Mahometan voters.

XX. The island shall be divided into three electoral districts, each returning four Members, one elected by the Mahometan and three by the non-Mahometan voters.

Until the High Commissioner shall otherwise order by proclamation, the said districts shall consist of the following Cazas, namely:—

1st District, Nikosia and Kyrenia.

2nd District, Famagusta and Larnaca.

3rd District, Limassol and Papho.

Every non-Mahometan voter may vote for as many candidates in each district as there are Members to be elected for whom he is entitled to vote; he may only give one vote for any candidate, but he need not vote for the full number to be elected.

XXI. Every male person, being either an Ottoman or a British subject, or having resided in the island not less than five years, who has attained the age of twenty-one years, and who is a payer of any class of the taxes called Verghi, and has on or before the thirteenth day of January ("new style") in any year paid in respect of any electoral district all Verghi payable by him up to that date, shall be entitled to be registered in following year as a voter, and when so registered, to vote at the election of Members for such district:

Provided that any such male person who, on or after the fourteenth day of January ("new style") in any year, and before the time appointed for making the lists of voters in that year, shall have paid all Verghi payable by him up to the thirteenth of January ("new style") shall be entitled to apply to the officer appointed to make the list for the Claimant's Nahieh to insert his name therein, and the said Officer, on production of the receipt for such payment, shall insert the name of such person in the list.

XXII. Such officer of the Government in every Nahieh as the High Commissioner shall by proclamation appoint shall, at such time in each year as may be fixed by the High Commissioner, make a true list of all persons, being payers of Verghi in respect of such Nahieh, who shall be at such time qualified to be registered as voters at the election of Members of the Legislative Council for the electoral district in which such Nahieh is situated.

The said officer shall forthwith transmit such list to the President of the District Court of the Caza in which such Nahieh is situated; and the President of the District Court shall as soon as conveniently may be cause every list so transmitted to him to be published, together with a notice in English, Greek, and Turkish, that all objections thereto will be heard and determined by him at a time or times to be specified in such notice, being such time or times as shall be appointed for that purpose by the High Commissioner.

The President of the District Court, after hearing any objections which may be made, shall strike out of the lists all names which shall, in his opinion, have been improperly inserted therein, and shall insert all names which shall, in his opinion, have been improperly omitted therefrom, and shall take care that the name of the same person is not retained in more than one of the said lists. Provided that no objection to the insertion of the name of a voter shall be entertained unless the person objecting first deposits, in respect of such objection, the sum of five shillings with the Registrar of the District Court, as a guarantee of good faith, which shall be forfeited to His Majesty if the objection fails from any cause.

Every person whose name shall be in any list of voters so revised as aforesaid shall be deemed to be registered as a voter within the meaning of this Order, and the revised lists shall be conclusive evidence of the right of the persons therein named to vote at any election that may take

place prior to the making of the lists of voters in the next succeeding year.

XXIII. Every person who is for the time being registered as a voter in any electoral districts for the election of Members of the Legislative Council, and who is not subject to any of the disqualifications hereinafter mentioned, shall be eligible as a Member of the Council for any electoral district.

The following persons shall be disqualified for being elected and for sitting or voting as Members of the Council; that is to say,

Judges of any Court in the Island.

Public contractors.

Uncertificated bankrupts.

Persons convicted of any offence and sentenced to imprisonment for a term of not less than six months, until the expiration or remission of such sentence or of the unexpired residue thereof.

If any person who is not eligible under this Order as a Member of the Council shall be returned as a Member at any election, such election shall be void as regards such person, but not as regards any other person elected at the same time, and a new writ shall be issued in the same manner as if such person had been duly elected, and his seat had been vacated by death, resignation, or otherwise.

Every person who having been ineligible at the time of his election, or whilst subject to any of the disqualifications hereinbefore mentioned, shall sit or vote in the Council as an elective Member, shall, for every day on which he sits or votes, forfeit the sum of fifty pounds, to be recovered by action in any District Court by any person who shall sue for the same.

For the purposes of this Order the term "public contractor" means and includes any person who is in any way whatsoever beneficially interested in any contract or agreement for or on account of the public service of the Island, otherwise than as a shareholder in an incorporated or joint stock company, or as a shareholder or partner in any company or partnership of the description specified in Article 10 of the Ottoman Commercial Code, where such incorporated or joint stock company, or other company or partnership, shall consist of more than twenty persons; and the term "uncertificated bankrupt" includes any person who has made a declaration of inability to pay his debts, under Article 148 of the Ottoman Commercial Code, or who has been declared a bankrupt under the provisions of either Article 289 or Article 290 of the same Code, and who has not obtained the benefit of Article 305 of the same Code, and any person declared bankrupt under Article 292 of the same Code.

XXIV. In case an election is disputed by an unsuccessful candidate on the ground that the majority of a successful candidate was made up by illegal or informal votes, or was obtained by bribery, treating, or intimidation, or that the successful candidate was not eligible as a Member of the Council, or on the ground that the provisions of any proclamation under Clause XXVI. of this Order, determining the manner in which the election is to be conducted, have not been observed or have been disobeyed in some particular whereby according to the directions of such proclamation the election is rendered subject to enquiry, on petition, he may present a petition to the Supreme Court, praying an enquiry, and the matter shall be enquired into by a Judge of the Supreme Court, whose decision shall be final. Until the Legislative Council otherwise provide, the law in force in England for the time being relating to corrupt practices at elections, and

disputed elections, shall, so far as practicable, be applied by the Judge to the adjudication of such cases. The Judges of the Supreme Court may make, alter, and repeal rules for the conduct of such election inquiries.

XXV. For the purpose of every general election of Members of the Council, and in the case of any vacancies among the elective Members by death, resignation, or otherwise, the High Commissioner shall issue writs of election, under the public seal of the Island, addressed to the Returning Officers of the respective electoral districts for which Members are to be returned.

Such writs may be in the form in the Schedule to this Order.

XXVI. The High Commissioner may, from time to time, by proclamation, provide for the formation, revision, and custody of voters' lists, and for the appointment and duties of Returning Officers, and for determining the time and place for holding elections, and the manner in which elections shall be conducted and a poll taken when required, and the manner in which votes shall be given and the result ascertained, and for the return of the writs, and for all other matters necessary to the orderly and impartial conduct of elections.

Every such proclamation shall take effect from such date as shall be named therein, or, if no date be named therein, from the date thereof, and shall have the force of law, but shall be subject to disallowance in whole or in part by His Majesty, signified through one of His Principal Secretaries of State. The High Commissioner shall, by proclamation, give notice of any such disallowance, and thereupon the provisions so disallowed shall cease to be of any force or effect.

XXVII. Any elective Member may resign his seat in the Council by writing under his hand addressed to the High Commissioner, and upon the receipt of such resignation by the High Commissioner the seat of such Member shall become vacant.

If any elective Member fails to give his attendance in the Council for one whole session without the leave of the Council entered in its journals, or if he is appointed a Judge of any Court in the Island, or becomes a public contractor or an uncertificated bankrupt, or is convicted of any offence and sentenced to any term of imprisonment amounting to six months or more, the seat of such Member shall thereby become vacant.

XXVIII. There shall be a session of the Council once at least in each year, so that a period of twelve calendar months do not intervene between the last sitting in one session and the first sitting in the next session.

The High Commissioner shall, by proclamation, appoint the place and time for holding each session of the Council, and every such session shall be holden accordingly.

XXIX. The High Commissioner in person or by proclamation may prorogue or dissolve the Council whenever he thinks fit, and, unless the Council be sooner dissolved, the elective Members shall hold their seats until the expiration of five years from the date of the return of the first writs at the last preceding general election. At the expiration of such five years, the High Commissioner shall dissolve the Council.

A general election shall be held within two calendar months after a dissolution, and in case of a vacancy by death, resignation, or otherwise, an election shall be held as soon as possible after the vacancy occurs.

XXX. The High Commissioner when present shall preside at all meetings of the Council, and in his absence such non-elective Member as he

shall from time to time appoint for that purpose, and in default of such appointment the senior non-elective Member of the Council present shall preside.

XXXI. No business (except that of adjournment) shall be transacted unless there be present six Members of the Council besides the High Commissioner or presiding Member.

XXXII. The Council shall, in the mode of transaction of business, whether for the passing of laws or other matters, conform as nearly as may be to such instructions under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet as may from time to time be addressed to the High Commissioner in that behalf.

Subject to such instructions, the Council shall, as soon as convenient after its first meeting, and from time to time afterwards as occasion may require, make standing Rules and Orders for the regulation or their own proceedings. And such Rules and Orders shall take effect when confirmed by the High Commissioner.

XXXIII. No vote, resolution, or law for the appropriation of any part of the public revenue, or for the imposition of any tax or impost, shall be proposed except by the High Commissioner or by his direction; but with the foregoing exceptions, any Member may propose any question for debate in the Council, and such question, if seconded by any other Member, shall be debated and disposed of according to the standing Rules and Orders.

The elective Members shall have the right to put questions to the non-elective Members on matters of public concern affecting the administration of their several departments.

XXXIV. Either the English, Greek, or Turkish language may be used in the debates of the Council. In taking down the Minutes and in Bills laid before the Council the English language shall be used, and Greek and Turkish translations shall be appended to the Minutes and Bills when printed for the use of Members.

XXXV. All questions proposed for debate in the Council shall be decided by the majority of the votes of the Members present, and if upon any question the votes are equal, the High Commissioner if presiding shall have a casting vote, and if a non-elective Member be presiding, such non-elective Member shall have a casting vote in addition to his own original vote.

XXXVI. The several sums required for the undermentioned services shall be permanently charged on the consolidated revenue of the Island, and shall be payable to His Majesty, His heirs and successors, every year until it shall be otherwise ordered by His Majesty, His heirs or successors, with the advice of His or their Privy Council:—

Ninety-two thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine pounds eleven shillings and three pence, being a sum equal to the sums payable under the annex, dated the first of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, to the Convention of Defensive Alliance between Great Britain and Turkey, signed on the fourth of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and under an agreement respecting Cyprus lands signed by the representatives of Great Britain and Turkey on the third February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy nine.

Four thousand pounds for the High Commissioner's salary.

Six hundred pounds for the High Commissioner's establishment.

Thirteen thousand pounds for salaries of judges, magistrates, village judges, and

officers of the Law Courts, and for the allowances and expenses of the said courts.

Five thousand pounds for salaries of public offices the holders of which are non-elective Members of the Legislative Council.

XXXVII. For the purposes of this Order the term "High Commissioner," unless inconsistent with the context, shall include every person for the time being administering the Government of the Island.

XXXVIII. His Majesty hereby reserves unto Himself, His heirs and successors, full power with the advice of His or their Privy Council to revoke, alter, or amend this Order as to Him or them shall seem fit.

XXXIX. So much of the Order in Council, of the fourteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, as has not already been revoked, and the Orders in Council of the thirtieth November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the fourteenth February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, the third August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six (making an additional permanent charge on the Consolidated Revenue of Cyprus), and the twenty-sixth February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, relating to the Island, are hereby revoked, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder.

XL. This Order shall commence and come into operation on publication in "The Cyprus Gazette."

And the Right Honourable the Earl of Elgin, K.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Brecon) Order, 1907."

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Brecon to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Chiffchaff, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Turtle Dove, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldcrest, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kite, Skylark, Woodlark, House Martin, Sand Martin, Nightingale, Richard's Pipit (Richard's Lark), Rock Pipit (Rock Lark), Tree Pipit, Quail, Water Rail, Robin, Redstart, Roller, Great Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Woodchat Shrike, Barn Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wren.

The Kite protected during the whole of the year.

III. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the Kite is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Brecon.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

IV. MONMOUTHSHIRE AUDIT DISTRICT.

To Mortimer David Probert, District Auditor;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised within the said Unions respectively:—

To the Authorities referred to in Article I. (3) of this Order;—

To the Urban District Councils of Ebbw Vale, Rhymney, and Tredegar;—

Whereas by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas the said Mortimer David Probert is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment to the office of District Auditor of the said Mortimer David Probert (hereinafter referred to as "the District Auditor"), and do Order and Prescribe as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and of their Officers; namely,—

(1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order.

(2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said several Unions.

(3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said Unions, and whose Accounts are not subject to audit by any other District Auditor.

(4.) The Urban District Councils of Ebbw Vale, Rhymney, and Tredegar.

(5.) The Joint Committee appointed to exercise the powers and duties of a Burial Board by the Urban District Councils of Glyncoedwg and Maesteg, and the Parish Councils of the Parishes of Lower Llangonoyd and Middle Llangonoyd.

(6.) The Western Valleys (Monmouthshire) Sewerage Board.

(7.) Such other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may by Order prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the District Auditor shall act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him for the performance of his duties under this Order, shall be termed "The Monmouthshire Audit District," and shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order, the Districts of the District Councils named in Paragraph (4) of Article I of this Order, the areas subject to the jurisdiction of the Joint Committee and of the Sewerage Board named in Paragraphs (5) and (6) of the said Article, and the Districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in Paragraph (7) of the said Article.

ARTICLE IV.—Any Order in force assigning a District to the District Auditor for the discharge of his duties or prescribing his duties, shall, from and after the date upon which this Order shall come into operation, be rescinded, but nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the existing duties and powers of the District Auditor or of any Assistant Auditor as regards any Audit, or any matters or proceedings already commenced.

ARTICLE V.—In this Order the term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.

LONDON (NOTIFICATION OF
GLANDERS) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Order.

1. This Order applies to the administrative county of London and to the city of London.

Notice of Disease.

2.—(1.) Every person having or having had in his possession or under his charge any diseased or suspected horse, ass, or mule shall with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being or having been so diseased or suspected, either to an Inspector of the Local Authority, or to a constable of the police force for the police area wherein the diseased or suspected horse, ass, or mule is or was.

(2.) Every person licensed to slaughter horses who has in his possession a carcass of any diseased or suspected horse, ass, or mule shall with all practicable speed give notice of that fact, either to an Inspector of the Local Authority, or to a constable of the police force for the police area wherein the carcass is.

(3.) A constable receiving a notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(4.) A veterinary surgeon employed to examine any horse, ass, or mule, or the carcass of any such animal, on becoming aware that the animal is diseased, or was diseased when it died or was slaughtered, shall with all practicable speed give notice of the fact to an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(5.) An Inspector of the Local Authority who receives information of the existence or suspected existence of disease shall forthwith report the fact to the Local Authority, and also to the Medical Officer of Health of the Sanitary District in which the animal died or was slaughtered or in which the carcass was at the time of the notice.

(6.) Where the notice of disease relates to a carcase of an animal that has died or been slaughtered in the district of a Local Authority other than the Local Authority which receives the notice, the latter shall forthwith inform the other Local Authority of the receipt of the notice.

(7.) This Article shall be substituted for Article 3 (*Notice of Disease*) of the Glanders or Farcy Order of 1907 in the application of that Order to the administrative county of London and to the city of London.

Definition of "Disease", "Diseased" and "Suspected."

3.—(1.) For the purposes of this Order disease means glanders, and includes that form of glanders which is commonly known as farcy.

(2.) A diseased horse, ass, or mule means for the purposes of this Order a horse, ass, or mule in which the clinical symptoms are definite evidence of disease, or in which the application of the mallein test has resulted in definite evidence of disease.

(3.) An animal shall be deemed to be "suspected" if it shows clinical symptoms of disease but such symptoms are insufficient to make the

animal a diseased animal within the definition in this Article.

Revocation of Order.

4. The Order described in the Schedule hereto is hereby revoked.

Commencement.
