

Whitehall, September 16, 1907.

The KING has been pleased to confer the Albert Medal of the Second Class upon Mr. Frank Hughes, for gallantry in saving life at a flooded Mine at Bonnievale, Western Australia, in the month of March last, as detailed below:—

On the 19th March, 1907, an exceedingly heavy and sudden downpour of rain in the Bonnievale District caused a flood, and the inundation of the Westralia and East Extension Mine from the lower level (1,354 feet from the surface) to the No. 9 (900 feet) level.

With the exception of an Italian named Modesto Varischetti all the miners effected their escape. He was working by himself in a rise 28 feet above the No. 10 (1,000 feet) level, and was cut off by the flood waters and imprisoned, as in a diving bell, the air in the rise unable to escape keeping the water at a lower level than in the main shaft, and in the stopes above the No. 10 level, where the surface of the water was 50 feet above the point where Varischetti was imprisoned.

It was at first thought that the entombed miner must have lost his life, but efforts were made to communicate with him by knocking on the rock, and after a time his signals were heard in response. It was at once decided to attempt his rescue by the aid of divers, seeing that by making use of all the available means of draining the Mine at least ten days would have elapsed before the water could have been lowered to the No. 10 level.

Diving dresses were telegraphed for to Perth, and through the energetic assistance of the Chief Harbourmaster at Fremantle were obtained without delay, so that in less than eight hours from the time of the despatch of the telegraphic message a special train was on its way to the Goldfields with two divers, Messrs. Curtis and Hearne, with their assistants and diving outfits. Meantime two other divers, Messrs. F. Hughes and Fox, of Kalgoorlie, who had lately followed

the occupation of miners, and were familiar with the local mining practice, had volunteered their services and had gone to the flooded mine. The first-mentioned divers arrived early on the

The first-mentioned divers arrived early on the morning of the 22nd March, and it was considered advisable that Hughes and Fox, on account of their mining experience, should make the first attempt at rescue. They would have to descend through an ore-pass from the No. 9 to the No. 10 level, a distance of 100 feet, then turn at right angles along the latter level, and go along it 250 feet to reach the foot of the rise where the man was imprisoned. Both divers would bave to go down the ore-pass, and one would then remain at the bottom of it to pass his comrade's air-pipe and lines round the angle so as to prevent them from fouling. The work was of a difficult and dangerous nature, having to be performed without knowledge of the shape of the cavities to be passed through, and often in very cramped space, and subject to the continual danger that the flooding might have displaced timbers or so loosened the "filling" in the worked out ground as to make it liable to run into the pass or the level and overwhelm the rescuers.

Hughes led the way and after some difficulty reached the bottom of the pass, where he found the shoot into the level choked with about half a ton of ore; he cleared this out, took the door off the shoot, and got down into the level, but then had to return twice to No. 9 as the other diver did not come down to him. It proved that Fox had been unable to get down, and on making his second attempt he sustained an injury to his leg which caused him to retire from further participation in the work. Diver Hearne then took his place, and Hughes and he went down to the No. 10 level, but both had to return to arrange certain matters. They then descended again, and Hughes struggled along the level, knee deep in sludge, to the rise, where he was able to find the air hosepipe leading to Varischetti's rock-drill, and after shaking it

several times obtained a signal in reply from the imprisoned man. Hughes was then so exhausted that he had to return after fixing a

guide-line for future use.

After a rest of  $3\frac{1}{3}$  hours Hughes and Hearne again descended, the descent being the fifth that Hughes had made that day. He succeeded in reaching Varischetti, shook hands with him, and supplied him with an electric lamp, food, and other necessaries. Next day he again made a visit. Hearne as before staying at the angle at the foot of the ore-pass; and daily visits were repeated until the 28th March, when the water had been lowered sufficiently to make it just possible for a man to wade along the No. 10 level from the ore-pass with his head out of the water. Diver Hughes then went in twice without his diving dress and talked to Varischetti, and then made a third trip and brought him out, carrying him portion of the way, the entombed man's strength having failed him.

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment to the office of District Auditor of the said Henry Duckle Wraith (hereinafter referred to as "the District Auditor"), and do Order and Prescribe as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers; namely,—

- (1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order.
- (2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said several Unions.
- (3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said Unions, and whose Accounts are not subject to audit by any other District Auditor.
- (4.) The Urban District Council of Rothwell (Yorkshire).
- (5.) The Luddenden Foot Joint Sewerage Board.
- (6.) The Rothwell, Methley, and Hunslet Joint Isolation Hospital Committee.
- (7.) The Joint Committee appointed for the purposes of the joint appointment of a Medical Officer of Health by the Rural District Councils of Keighley, Sedbergh, Settle, and Skipton, and the Urban District Councils of Haworth, Oakworth, Oxenhope, Silsden, and Skipton.
- (8.) Such other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may by Order hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the District Auditor shall act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him for the performance of his duties under this Order, shall be termed "The West Yorkshire Audit District," and shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order, the Districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of the Authorities mentioned in Paragraphs (4), (5), (6), and (7) of Article I of this Order, or of any such Authority as is mentioned in Paragraph (8) of the said Article.

ARTICLE IV.—Nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the existing duties and powers of any District Auditor or Assistant Auditor as regards any Audit, or any matters or proceedings already commenced.

ARTICLE V.—In this Order the term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.

ARTICLE VI.—This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seven.

## Extent of Application of Order.

 This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto.

## Alteration of Place of Detention.

2.—(1.) Where under the Yorkshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906 (No. 2) swine have been moved from a market or saleyard specified in the Second Schedule hereto to a place of destination in the Area to which this Order applies and are in the Area to which this Order applies and are required to be there detained and isolated from application to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture other swine for twenty-eight days, the swine and Fisheries, 4, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

may with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which that place of destination is situate be moved therefrom to another place of destination, not being a market, fair, or saleyard, specified in the licence, and shall in such case be there detained and isolated for the residue of the period of twentyeight days in accordance with the provisions of the said Order.

(2.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Article.

(3.) A copy of a licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place of destination

specified in the licence.

(4.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

Production of Licences: Names and Addresses.

3.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other

officer.

## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 16TH SEPTEMBER 1907.)

RYDE AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1907 (No. 3).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

## Movement with Licence direct to Bacon Factory or Slaughterhouse.

 The Ryde and District (Swine-Fever) Prohibition of Movement Order of 1907 shall not, after the commencement of this Order, apply to, or be deemed to prohibit, the movement of swine direct to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the bacon factory or slaughterhouse is situate, and subject to the following conditions, namely:-

(i.) The swine shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches

(ii.) The swine shall, so far as is practicable, be moved by railway, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked under this Article;

(iii.) The swine shall, while being moved along, over, or across any highway or thoroughfare,

be confined in a van or float;

(iv.) The swine shall after their arrival at the bacon factory or slaughterhouse be there detained until they are slaughtered.

## Licences after the Completion of Movement.

2. Where swine are moved with a Licence under this Order to any bacon factory or slaughterhouse the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

## General Provisions as to Movement.

- 3.—(1.) Swine being moved under this Order shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the Licence, and not elsewhere.
- (2.) This Order does not authorise movement of swine in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, or of swine the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

## Production of Licences: Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, shall on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and application to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture

movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

#### Offences.

- 5.—(1.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig, as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any person fail to deliver up or send a Licence as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of

## Interpretation.

6. In this Order, unless the context otherwise.

"Bacon factory" means premises in which the business of a curer of bacon is carried

"Slaughterhouse" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered:

"Swine-Fever Infected Place" means a place for the time being declared to be infected with swine-fever under any Order of the

"Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector:

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries :

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

## Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of September, nineteen hundred and seven.

#### Short Title.

8. This Order may be cited as the RYDE AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVE-MENT ORDER OF 1907 (No. 3), and shall be read as one with the Ryde and District (Swine-Fever) Prohibition of Movement Order of 1907, and the Ryde and District (Swine-Fever) Prohibition of Movement Order of 1907 (No. 2).
