ORDER of the Local Government Board: Motor Car Act, 1903: Regulations under Section 9 (1):—

COUNTY OF ESSEX.

URBAN DISTRICT OF ILFORD.

To the County Council of Essex;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of with a view to the safety of the public, on the the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to a application of the local authority of the area in as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any which the limits or place are situate, a person

limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

And whereas the County Council of Essex, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned Sub-section putting the provisions of that Subsection in force within the limits comprising certain roads and parts of roads situate within the Urban District of Ilford, in the county of Essex, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the parts of roads within the Urban District of Ilford, which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the seventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and seven.

SCHEDULE.

So much of Cranbrook-road as extends from its junction with Wellesley-road to its junction with High-street.

So much of Barking-lane as extends from its junction with High-street to its junction with Bedford-road;

So much of Ilford Hill as extends from its junction with Barking-lane to its junction with Mill-road.

So much of the Romford Main Road (including the part thereof known as High-street) as extends from its junction with Barking-lane to its junction with Sunnyside-road.

THE MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

THE FERTILISERS AND FEEDING STUFFS (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, in pursuance of the provisions of the Fertilisers and Feeding Stuffs Act, 1906, hereby make the following Regulations:-

REGULATION AS TO THE ANALYST TO WHOM Samples are to be sent.

1. Where under the Fertilisers and Feeding Stuffs Act, 1906, any person desires that a sample shall be analysed by the agricultural analyst, the sample, or parts of the sample, as the case may 4, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

- be, shall be sent to such agricultural analyst as is hereby prescribed, that is to say:-
 - (1) if the sample is taken in a county, or in a county borough or a burgh of which the council have appointed or concurred in appointing an agricultural analyst, then to the analyst appointed for the county or borough or burgh;
 - (2) if the sample is taken in a county borough of which the council have not appointed or concurred in appointing an agricultural analyst, then to the analyst appointed for the county in which for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1888, the borough is deemed to be situate; and
 - (3) if the sample is taken in a burgh of which the council have not appointed or concurred in appointing an agricultural analyst, then to the analyst appointed for the county within which the burgh is situated or with which it has the longest common boundary.

COMMENCEMENT.

2. These Regulations shall take effect on the 1st day of January, 1908, and remain in force until altered or revoked by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

SHORT TITLE.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Fertilisers and Feeding Stuffs (General) Regulations, 1907.

SOUTH METROPOLITAN GAS COMPANY.

Scheme for the Election of Employees' Directors made under the provisions of the South Metropolitan Gas Act, 1896, and the South Metropolitan Gas Act, 1897.

1. Whereas provision was made by section 19 of the South Metropolitan Gas Act, 1896, authorizing the Directors to prepare a scheme for the election of one or more directors by the shareholding employees of the Company, as follows:—

Section 19.

- (1) "At any time after the total investments of the employees of the Company in the ordinary stock of the Company dating from the distribution of the first profit-sharing bonus in July one thousand eight hundred and ninety shall exceed the nominal amount of forty thousand pounds of such stock the directors of the Company may as and when they deem expedient prepare a scheme for the purpose of enabling employees holding ordinary stock of the Company to, elect one or more of their number but not exceeding three to be a director or directors of the Company."
- (2) "The scheme shall be submitted to a special general meeting of the Company duly called with notice of the business to be considered thereat and the meeting may adopt the scheme either without alteration or with such alterations (not being inconsistent with the provisions of this Act) as the directors may assent to."
- (3) "The scheme so adopted shall be submitted for the approval of the Board of Trade and that Board may consider the same and may either approve the same without alteration or may suggest any alterations therein or may disapprove the same and if the directors assent to the alterations (if any) so suggested the Board of Trade may approve the scheme as altered."
- (4) "The scheme when approved shall be published in the London Gazette and (subject as hereinafter provided) shall for the period of three years and no longer from the date of such publication have effect: Provided that if at any time during that period the amount of the investment of the employees in the stock of the Company shall fall below the nominal

amount of forty thousand pounds the scheme shall cease to be in force."

- (5) "On the cesser of such scheme and subject to the provisions of this Act and to the like submission adoption and approval a new scheme may at any time be adopted for any period that may be in that scheme prescribed and so from time to time."
- (6) "The qualification of an employees' director shall be fixed by the scheme for the time being subject to the following limitations. The employees' director shall have been not less than seven years in the constant employ of the Company and shall have held for not less than twelve months prior to the date of election and shall continue to hold not less than two hundred and fifty pounds nominal value of the ordinary stock of the Company."
- (7) "The fees to be paid to an employees' director for his attendance at the Board shall be fixed by the scheme. The fees shall bear some proportion to the amount of the qualification not being less than his ordinary day's pay nor more than four times that amount."
- (8) "The scale and method of voting for and the mode of election of employees' directors shall be settled by the scheme and may be varied by successive schemes from time to time."

And whereas by the South Metropolitan Gas Act, 1897, the qualification of an employees' director was reduced from the said sum of £250 to the sum of £100.

And whereas in 1898 the total investments of the employees in the ordinary stock of the Company amounted to £55,000 nominal, and a scheme for the election of three employee directors for a period of three years was adopted, but only two workmon were elected, the salaried officials not exercising their option.

And whereas in 1901 the total investments of the employees in the ordinary stock of the Company amounted to £89,000 nominal, and a similar scheme for nine years was adopted with power to determine it by the shareholders in 1904 and 1907, and one clerk and two workmen directors were elected, and the working having proved in every way satisfactory, it was in 1907 considered desirable to supersede the scheme of 1901 by one for a very much longer period.

And whereas the total investments of the employees in the ordinary stock of the Company now exceed the nominal amount of £200,000.

Now, therefore, the Directors of the Company, acting in pursuance of the powers conferred on them in that behalf by the said Acts, have prepared the following scheme, that is to say:—

- 1. In this scheme
- "The Company" means the South Metropolitan Gas Company.
- "Employees" means persons in the employ of the Company and holding stock in the capital of the Company.
- "Employees' director" means a director elected by the employees.
- 2. This scheme, which repeals and supersedes the scheme of 1901, shall come into operation as soon as it has been adopted by the shareholders of the Company in manner provided by the South Metropolitan Gas Act, 1896, and approved by the Board of Trade, and shall continue in force until 1950, or short of that year, so long as the shareholders approve (see section 14) and the aggregate investment of the employees in the stock of the Company shall not fall below the nominal amount or amounts set forth in section 4.
- 3. The number of employee directors shall not exceed three, of whom one shall be a salaried officer, and the other two employees in receipt of weekly wages.
- 4. Following the rule of Joint Stock Companies that the owners of the stock shall elect the directors, the object of this scheme is to confer similar power on the employee shareholders. The nominal value of the ordinary paid-up stock of the Company is at this date £6,430,000, of which the employees own £200,000 or thereabouts, say $\frac{1}{32}$ part. The other shareholders, owning $\frac{31}{32}$ of the stock, elect seven directors. Under this scheme the employee shareholders are empowered to elect three employee directors. The Company's Act of 1896 fixed the minimum aggregate holding for the election of employee directors at the very low figure of £40,000 of stock for the purpose of giving the employees a direct share in the responsibility of management as soon as possible, and not as indicating that so small a proportion of the total stock should confer the right. The Employee Director Scheme of 1901 for nine years, which lapses in 1910, is superseded by the present

scheme, with an aggregate holding of £200,000 nominal of stock, which also fixes the number of employee directors at three, subject to the following conditions: The essence of the copartnership is that the employees' holding of stock shall increase year by year by the investment of their copartnership bonus. If at any time the aggregate investment of the employees should fall back by 10 per cent, of its amount below any figure it may have attained less than one-tenth part of the paid-up capital, the number of employee directors shall be reduced to two by lot, provided the reduction of the aggregate holding of stock is general with the salaried staff and the weekly wage earners. If it is entirely or mainly in either section, justice requires that section to lose a director. If the reduction should amount to 20 per cent the number of employee directors shall be reduced to one by lot. Provided that if the aggregate investment should be restored to the original maximum the directors lost by the first and second reductions shall be restored. A reduction of 30 per cent. shall disqualify the remaining employee director, and then only as provided in section 14 can the employee directors be restored. So long as the aggregate holding exceeds one-tenth part of the ordinary nominal capital, the above provisions as to reductions shall not apply.

5. Every employee shall have for this purpose one vote for every ten pounds of stock held in his own name, or jointly with that of his wife or child, up to £100, 10 votes.

One vote for every £25 above the first £100 up to £300, eight additional votes.

One vote for every £50 above the first £300.

6. - (3) "The scheme so adopted shall be submitted for the approval of the Board of Trade and that Board may consider the same and may either approve the same without alteration or may suggest any alterations therein or may disapprove the same and if the directors assent to the alterations (if any) so suggested the Board of Trade may approve the scheme as altered."
- (4) "The scheme when approved shall be published in the London Gazette and (subject as hereinafter provided) shall for the period of three years and no longer from the date of such publication have effect: Provided that if at any time during that period the amount of the investment of the employees in the stock of the Company should fall below the nominal amount of ten thousand pounds the scheme shall cease to be in force."
- (5) "On the cesser of such scheme and subject to the provisions of this Act and to the like submission adoption and approval a new scheme may at any time be adopted for any period that may be in that scheme prescribed and so from time to time."
- (6) "The qualification of an employees' director shall be fixed by the scheme for the time being subject to the following limitations. The employees' director shall have been not less than seven years in the constant employ of the Company and shall have held for not less than twelve months prior to the date of election and shall continue to hold not less than one hundred pounds nominal value of the ordinary stock of the Company."
- (7) "The fees to be paid to an employees' director for his attendance at the Board shall be fixed by the scheme. The fees shall bear some proportion (to be fixed by the scheme) to the amount of the qualification not being less than his ordinary day's pay nor more than four times that amount."
- (8) "The scale and method of voting for and the mode of election of employees' directors shall be settled by the scheme and may be varied by successive schemes from time to time."

And whereas in 1904 the aggregate investment of the employees in the Company's ordinary stock exceeded £10,000 nominal, a scheme was adopted for a period of three years for the election of two employee directors, a workman and a salaried official, but the option for the latter not being exercised, two workmen directors were elected.

And whereas the scheme of 1904, which expires on the 12th of October next, proved satisfactory and the total investments of the employees in the ordinary stock of the Company exceed the nominal amount of £20,000, the directors consider a renewal for a lengthened period desirable.

Now, therefore, the directors of the Company, acting in pursuance of the powers conferred on them in that behalf by the said Act, have prepared the following scheme, that is to say:—

Following the rule of Joint Stock Companies that the owners of the stock shall elect the directors, the the owners of the stock shall elect the directors, the object of this scheme is to confer similar power on the employee shareholders. The nominal value of the ordinary paid-up stock of the Company is at this date £605,000, of which the employees own £20,000, say $\frac{1}{80}$ part. The other shareholders owning $\frac{28}{80}$ of the stock elect six directors. Under this scheme the employee shareholders are empowered to elect three employee directors. The Company's Act of 1904 fixed the minimum aggregate holding for the election of employee directors at the very low figure of £10,000 of stock for the purpose of giving the employees a direct share in the responsibility of management as soon as possible, and not as sindicating that so small a proportion of the total stock should confer the right.
