No. 1263.—SCOTLAND, WEST COAST—THE
SMALL ISLES.*Sandy Island—Light Established.*

Information has been received from the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses, dated 9th September, 1907, that, on or about the 15th October, 1907, an unwatched flashing light, 105 feet above high water, exhibiting a flash of about two seconds' duration every six seconds, will be established on the east end of Sandy Island.

Approximate position, lat. 57° 2' 45" N., long. 6° 28' W.

Shoal Replaced.*

Cambrian, dated 2nd August, 1907, that the beacon marking Amédée shoal has been replaced.

Also, that the buoy marking Thisbé shoal is coloured red and is surmounted by a cone.

No. 1265.—SWEDEN—EAST COAST.

*Sandhamn to Stockholm—Alteration in Character
of Lights.*

With reference to Notices to Mariners No. 617 of 1907:—

The Swedish Government has given notice¹ dated 4th September, 1907, that the under-mentioned lights between Sandhamn and Stockholm will shortly be altered as follows:—

Lights on the port hand when entering will be altered to white flashing every three seconds.

Port hand lights:—

1. Adkubben in approximately lat. 59° 16' N., long. 18° 54' E.
2. Skötkubben in approximately lat. 59° 17¼' N., long. 18° 54' E.
3. Yxhammarskubben in approximately lat. 59° 19' N., long. 18° 49' E.
4. Galnöport in approximately lat. 59° 23½' N., long. 18° 36¾' E.
