'The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Order of the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, dated the eleventh day of February, one thousand nine hundred and seven, His Majesty, in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in him by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, did, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, fix the number of wards into which the Borough of Richmond, in the county of Surrey, should be thenceforth divided, and did order and direct that the number of the said wards should

And whereas the Right Honourable Herbert John Gladstone, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did, in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament, by warrant given under his hand and seal at Whitehall, on the twenty-fifth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and seven, duly appoint me, Edward Thornton Hill Lawes, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of, and apportioning Councillors among, the wards of the said Borough of Richmond:

Now I the said Edward Thornton Hill Lawes, in pursuance of the powers given to me by virtue of the said appointment under the said Act, do hereby determine as hereinafter mentioned the boundaries of the said six wards into which the said borough is divided, which wards are hereinafter named and numbered as follows, that is to say :

No. 1. North Ward. No. 2. West Ward.

No. 3. East Ward.

No. 4. South Ward.

No. 5. North Sheen Ward.

No. 6. Kew Ward.

"No. 1.-North Ward.

"I do hereby determine that North Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Richmond as is contained within a line commencing at a point on the municipal borough boundary in the River Thames at the bridge where the London and South Western Railway (Windsor Line) crosses the said river and running thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of the said railway to a point opposite the corner of the Old Deer Park wall near Park-lane, thence to and along the said Deer Park wall as far as the private road leading to Kew Observatory, thence along the centre of such private road and

Clarence-street in a south-easterly direction to the centre of Kew-road, thence in a northeasterly direction along the centre of Kew-road to the junction of Lower Mortlake-road, continuing thence along the centre of Lower Mortlake-road to the point where the same passes over the centre of the London and South Western Railway from Richmond to Kensington, thence along the centre of the said railway in a northerly direction past Kew Gardens Station to the point where the Kew parish boundary intersects the said railway, thence following the said Kew parish boundary in a south-westerly direction intersecting Mortlake-road to a point at the junction of Sandycombe-road, Station-road, Kew Gardens-road, and Broomfieldroad, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Broomfield-road to the centre of Kewroad, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Kew-road aforesaid to a point near Hatherley-road, thence in a westerly direction across Kew Gardens, still following the said Kew parish boundary across the lake to a point where the same meets the municipal borough boundary in the river, and thence in a southwesterly and southerly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid at the said railway bridge.

"No. 2.—West Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that West Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point on the municipal borough boundary at the said railway bridge over the River Thames, and running thence along part of the southern boundary of North Ward as hereinbefore described along the centre of the said railway, along the Old Deer Park wall and along the centre of the said private road and Clarence-street to the point in the centre of Kew-road aforesaid, thence intersecting Kew-road and running in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Church-road over the railway and continuing to a point where Church-road meets the Vineyard, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of the Vineyard to a point in Hill Rise opposite Compass Hill and along the centre of Compass Rill to Petersham-road, thence northerly for a short distance along the line of the present boundary in Lower-road below the West and South Wards and thence in a straight line to the municipal borough boundary in the River Thames, thence in a north-westerly direction following the said municipal borough boundary in the river past Richmond Bridge and Corporation Island to the point of commencement aforesaid at the said railway bridge.

"No. 3.—East Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that East Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point in Kew-road opposite Clarencestreet thence following part of the southern boundary of North Ward as hereinbefore described along the centre of Kew road and Lower Mortlake-road to the aforesaid point where the same passes over the centre of the London and South Western Railway from Richmond to Kensington, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Manor-road intersecting the London and South Western Railway Windsor Line) thence continuing along the centre of Manor-road in a southerly direction intersecting Sheen-road to a point on the south side of Sheen-road opposite the centre of Manorroad, thence in a south-westerly direction to the centre of Queen's-road near the Black Horse Inn, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Queen's-road to the point where an ancient boundary crosses the said road at the southern end of Pest House Common, thence along the said ancient boundary in a westerly direction intersecting Denbigh-gardens and along the southern wall of the garden of Holy Trinity Vicarage to a point in King's-road opposite Audley-road, thence along the centre of Audley-road and Albert-road, crossing Albany-passage still following the said ancient boundary along the centre of Preston-place to the centre of Church-road opposite the Vineyard, thence along the centre of Church-road in a north-westerly direction following the eastern boundary of West Ward as hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid in Kew-road.

"No. 4 .- South Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that South Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point on the municipal borough boundary in the River Thames where the southern boundary of West Ward meets the same, thence following the said southern boundary of West Ward intersecting Hill Rise along the centre of the Vine-yard and continuing along the ancient boundary forming the southern boundary of East Ward as hereinbefore described to the aforesaid point where the same crosses the centre of Queen's-road at the southern end of Pest House Common, thence along the centre of Queen's-road in a following northerly direction the eastern boundary of East Ward as hereinbefore described to the aforesaid point on the south side of Sheenroad opposite the centre of Manor-road, thence leaving the eastern boundary of East Ward and continuing along the south side of Sheen-road to the point where it meets the municipal borough boundary, thence following the said municipal borough boundary in a southerly and westerly direction to and through Richmond Park and Sudbrook Park, across Petersham-road, and thence still following the municipal borough boundary to a point in the River Thames near Ham House, thence following the said municipal borough boundary in the River Thames to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 5.-North Sheen Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that North Sheen Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point where the Lower Mortlake-road passes over the centre of the London and South Western Railway from Richmond to Kensington, thence following the centre of that railway in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of North Ward as hereinbefore described to the aforesaid point where the Kew parish boundary intersects the said railway, thence following the said Kew parish boundary in a south-easterly direction till the same meets the municipal borough boundary, thence following the said municipal borough boundary in a westerly and southerly direction past Gipsy Corner along the eastern side of Mortlake-road to the Lower Richmond-road, thence along the northern side of Lower Richmond-road in a westerly direction till the said municipal borough boundary crosses the said road, thence following the said boundary in a southerly direction and intersecting the London and South Western Railway (Windsor Line) past King's Farm Lodge to the south side of Sheenroad, thence still following the said boundary in a south-westerly direction to the point where the same leaves the Sheen-road and turns to the l south, thence continuing along the south side of Sheen-road to the aforesaid point in the same opposite the centre of Manor-road, thence along the centre of Manor-road in a northerly direction intersecting the London and South Western Railway (Windsor Line) and following the eastern boundary of East Ward to the point of commencement aforesaid where the Lower Richmond-road passes over the centre of the London and South Western Railway from Richmond to Kensington.

"No. 6.-Kew Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Kew Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is contained within the old parish boundaries of Kew, that is to say: within a line commencing at the aforesaid point in the River Thames where the northern boundary of North Ward meets the municipal borough boundary, thence following the said municipal and parish boundary in the River Thames in a north-easterly direction intersecting King Edward VIIth Bridge, and in a south-easterly direction intersecting the London and South Western Railway from Richmond to Kensington aforesaid to a point in the said river opposite Gipsy Corner, thence to the point in the Kew Marshes where the Kew parish boundary leaves the municipal borough boundary, thence leaving the municipal borough boundary and following the Kew parish boundary in a north-westerly direction to the point herein-before described where the said Kew parish boundary intersects the said railway, thence in. a south-westerly and westerly direction, still. following the Kew parish boundary and following the northern boundary of North Ward as hereinbefore described, to and along the centre of Broomfield-road, and the centre of Kew-road as far as Hatherley-road, and thence across the Kew Gardens as hereinbefore described to the point, of commencement aforesaid in the River Thames.

"And I do further declare that the wards hereinbefore determined and defined are shown upon the plan hereunto annexed and signed by me, and that the boundaries of the said wards are clearly set forth by red lines thereon.

"And I do hereby assign and apportion six Councillors of the said borough to the North Ward, West Ward, East Ward and South Ward respectively, and three Councillors of the said borough to North Sheen Ward and Kew Ward respectively, as follows, that is to say:—

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 3RD OCTOBER 1907.)

NORFOLK (SWINE-FEVER) (MOVEMENT FROM MARKETS) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extent of Application of Order.

1. This Order applies to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled Area."

Regulation of Movement of Swine from Markets and Saleyards.

2.—(1.) The movement of swine from any market or saleyard (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Area) in the Scheduled Area, shall be subject to the following provisions of this Order.

(2.) If the market or saleyard is specially authorised by the Local Authority under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or under the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, the movement of the swine exposed at the market or saleyard

shall be subject to the provisions of the Order under which the market or saleyard is so authorised.

- (3.) In the case of any other market or saleyard, the movement of the swine exposed thereat shall be subject to the following conditions:—
 - (i.) The swine shall be accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market or saleyard is situate. The licence shall state the name and address of the person who moved the swine into the market or saleyard, and the number and description of the swine to be moved, and shall contain a description of the market or saleyard from which, and of the premises to which, the swine are to be moved.
 - (ii.) The swine shall be moved to the premises specified in the licence and not elsewhere and shall in any case where such premises are situate in the Scheduled Area be there detained and isolated from other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or unless they are moved from such premises (not being premises in a Swine-Fever Infected Area) in accordance with the following provisions.
 - (iii.) The swine may with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which such premises as aforesaid are situate be moved to other premises (not being a market fair or sale-yard) situate in the Scheduled Area and specified in the licence, and shall in such case be there detained and isolated for the residue of the period of twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such other premises before the expiration of that period.
 - (iv.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Article.
 - (v.) A copy of a licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which are situate the premises specified in the licence as the place of destination.
 - (vi.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

General Provisions as to Movement.

3. This Order does not authorise movement of swine in a Swine-Fever Infected Place or Swine-Fever Infected Area, or of swine the movement of which is prohibited or regulated by any other Order of the Board or Regulation of a Local Authority, or by notice of an Inspector of the Board or of a Local Authority given under any such Order or Regulation.

Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

4.—(1.) An exhibition of swine may be held in any place (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Area) in the Scheduled Area with a licence of the

- Local Authority, on such conditions, if any, as they think expedient, and not otherwise.
- (2.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, by such licence authorise the sale at such exhibition of the swine exhibited thereat on such conditions, if any, as they think expedient.
- (3.) The Local Authority shall not grant a licence for an exhibition under this Article unless they are satisfied that the proposed exhibition is a bonâ fide agricultural show, and that the swine are to be exhibited thereat for competition.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 5.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

6. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

7. If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of October, nineteen hundred and seven.

Short Title.

9. This Order may be cited as the Norfolk (Swine-Fever) (Movement from Markets) Order of 1907.
