The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated October 22, from His Majesty's Representative at Constantinople, intimating that the Constantinople Board of Health have recently decided on the following quarantine measures:—

1. Arrivals from Port Said are subjected to 48 hours observation, disinfection and application of the rat destruction circular. This is in consequence of the occurrence of two cases of plague in that port.

2. The quarantine of passengers from Taganrog has again been raised to five days, some further cases of cholera having occurred there.

3. In consequence of the continued prevalence of cholera in Russia and the increasing number of pilgrims arriving here from Russian ports, and the difficulty that exists in distinguishing them from ordinary passengers, the Board has decided as follows:—

For the present all Moslem passengers leaving Russian for Turkish ports will be considered as pilgrims. Ships carrying more than five such passengers for each 100 tons of their nett register will do five days quarantine with disinfection at Sinope. Ships with not more than five per cent. of such passengers will continue to do at Sinope the three days quarantine with disinfection already in force. Ships without passengers will undergo only a medical visit at the first Turkish port where there is a sanitary officer. All the aforesaid ships will undergo a second medical visit on arriving at Cavak at the northern entrance to the Bosphorus.

The arrangements for the transit of pilgrims through the Straits in quarantine, as set forth in the first part of the circular issued on September 9th, are consequently annulled.

# FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 21st October, 1907, he made the following Order :—

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section 130 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, I hereby direct that the occupier of every factory, workshop and laundry shall, on or before the 1st day of March, 1908, send to the Chief Inspector of Factories a correct return specifying, with respect to the period from 1st January to the 31st December, 1907, the number of persons employed in the factory, workshop or laundry, with the particulars as to age, sex, or occupation which are shown in the First Schedule hereto.

And I also further direct that the occupier of every factory where china or earthenware is manufactured and where special rules are in force shall, on or before the 1st day of March, 1908, send to the Chief Inspector of Factories, in addition to the particulars mentioned in the first paragraph hereof, a correct return specifying for the same period the number of persons employed in the factory in every process involving exposure to lead, with the particulars as to age, sex and occupation which are shown in the form of return in the Second Schedule hereto.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 28TH OCTOBER 1907.)

CAMBRIDGESHIRE AND HUNTINGDON-  
SHIRE (GOOSEBERRY MILDEW) ORDER  
OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Application of the Order.*

1. This Order shall apply to the administrative counties of Cambridge and Huntingdon.

*Definitions.*

2. In this Order—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“The Local Authority” means as regards any District described in the first column of the schedule hereto, the council mentioned in the second column of that schedule:

“Disease” means the disease affecting gooseberry and currant bushes which is known as *Sphaerotheca mors-uvae* or American gooseberry mildew; and “diseased” means affected with disease:

“Bush” includes a cutting, seedling, or other plant.

*Notification of Disease.*

3.—(1.) The occupier of any premises on which there is a bush which is diseased or suspected of being diseased shall forthwith notify the fact to the clerk to the Local Authority, or to some person authorised by the Local Authority to receive such notices, and where practicable a specimen showing the disease or suspected disease shall accompany the notice.

(2.) If any person knowingly fail to give a notice required by this Order to be given by him he shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

*Measures for Prevention of the Spread of Disease.*

4.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving in any manner notice of the existence or supposed existence of disease shall take such steps as may be necessary to determine whether the disease exists, and the area covered by diseased bushes, or by bushes to which the disease is likely to spread, and shall cause a notice to be served on the occupier of any land within that area requiring him to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the disease as are authorised by this Article.

(2.) A notice under this Article shall require—

(i.) the immediate spraying of all diseased bushes which have not shed their leaves and of all bushes in contact with such diseased bushes with a solution of liver of sulphur (containing not less than 1 oz. of liver of sulphur to two gallons of water) or with

some other fungicide approved by or on behalf of the Local Authority for that purpose;

(ii.) as soon as is practicable after such spraying the burning or other effective destruction of all diseased bushes, including the fruit on such bushes (if any);

(iii.) the thorough spraying as soon as possible with a solution of copper sulphate (containing at least one pound of copper sulphate to a gallon of water) or with some other fungicide approved by or on behalf of the Local Authority for that purpose of the site of any bush that has been destroyed;

(iv.) the thorough spraying of all gooseberry and currant bushes on the area defined in the notice with a fungicide approved by or on behalf of the Local Authority for that purpose and so that the spraying shall be carried out at such time or times as an inspector of the Local Authority shall direct and to his satisfaction;

(v.) that no gooseberry or currant bush or any part of any such bush shall be removed or permitted to be removed out of the area defined in the notice except with, and subject to the conditions (if any) of, a licence authorising such removal, but this restriction shall not apply to fruit of a bush that is not diseased.

(3.) Any notice may be altered or withdrawn by the Local Authority if and when they are satisfied that this may be done without risk of the spread of disease.

(4.) If any person fail to adopt any measure for prevention of the spread of the disease required by a notice served on him under this Article he shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

*Returns of Proceedings.*

5. The Local Authority shall in a form to be provided by the Board notify the Board of any outbreak of disease, and shall as soon as may be after the expiration of each year report to the Board the proceedings taken by the Local Authority under this Order in the preceding year.

*Powers of Entry.*

6. Any inspector or other officer appointed in that behalf by the Local Authority, and any inspector of the Board, may upon production if so required of his appointment or authority enter any land on which he has reason to believe that disease exists or has recently existed and examine any gooseberry or currant bush on such land and any person who wilfully obstructs or impedes any inspector or other officer in the course of his duties under this Order shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

*Notification of Order.*

7. This Order shall be published by the Local Authority by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district of the Local Authority or in such other manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to insure publicity for the same.

*Execution of the Order.*

8.—(1.) The Local Authority of each District mentioned in the schedule hereto shall carry into effect this Order within that District, and shall



appoint such inspectors or other officers for that purpose as may be necessary.

(2.) For the purposes of this Order a notice shall be deemed to be served on a person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there, and a notice or other document purporting to be signed by the clerk of a Local Authority shall be *prima facie* evidence that it was signed by him and duly authorised by the Local Authority.

*Commencement.*

9. This Order shall come into operation on

the second day of November, nineteen hundred and seven.

*Short Title.*

10. This Order may be cited as the CAMBRIDGESHIRE AND HUNTINGDONSHIRE (GOOSEBERRY MILDEW) ORDER OF 1907.

Subject to the doubt expressed in my certificate on the accounts for the year ending 31st December, 1904, as to the legality of a charge of £30,000 therein mentioned to capital account, I am of opinion that the foregoing accounts correctly represent the transactions of the Company as shown in the books. But there are certain further items in the transactions of the past year to which I deem it right to call attention, viz. :—

1. Of the shares stated to have been issued and paid up during the year 1905, 12,600 representing a sum of £126,000 were issued as fully paid to certain contractors and to the consulting engineers of the Company, in respect of work which they had contracted to do, or services which they had contracted to render, but which were not done or rendered at the date of the issue. The transactions took the form of a payment to the contractors, &c., by means of cheques drawn by the Company, and of a payment by the contractors, &c., to the Company by means of cheques of corresponding amount for the nominal amount of the shares issued by the latter, but the basis of the transaction was the work to be done subsequent to the date of the issue, in erecting a generating station, laying mains, constructing buildings

and supplying plant and machinery, &c., or in connection therewith. Whether as a matter of law these transactions constituted "payment" of the amount of the shares under section 21 of the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, or otherwise, at the date of their issue might raise a difficult question of legal construction, but the matter does not appear to be of material importance in view of the fact that a certificate by a Justice of the Peace under section 31 of the Company's Special Act to the effect that the requirements of that section as to the amount of the paid up capital (which certificate is declared by the section to be sufficient evidence of the facts) has been obtained by the Company.

2. The sum of £7,595 16s. 1d. charged to capital account in respect of preliminary and formation expenses during the year 1905 includes a sum of £7,387 3s. 9d. paid as discount or commission on the issue of shares and debenture stock, viz. :—
