W HEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand nine hundred, and known as "The North-Eastern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1900,' provision was made for the administration of certain territory in Africa within the limits in the said Order in Council described and set forth, and known as North-Eastern Rhodesia:

And whereas by the said Order in Council it was among other things provided that certain powers in relation to the said territory should be exercised by the person for the time being exercising the jurisdiction of His Majesty's Consul-General and Commissioner for the British Central Africa Protectorate:

And whereas by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the sixth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and known as "The Nyasaland Order in Council, 1907," it was provided that the territories theretofore known as the British Central Africa Protectorate should be known as the Nyasaland Protectorate, and that a Governor and Commander-in-Chief should be appointed in and over the said Protectorate in place of a Commissioner:

And whereas it is expedient to amend "The North-Eastern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1900," accordingly:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as "The North-Eastern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1907."

II. The definition of the term "Commissioner" in the Third Article of "The North-Eastern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1900," is hereby repealed, and the following definition of the term "Governor" shall be inserted therein in place thereof:—

"Governor" means the Governor and Commander-in-Uhief, or any other Officer for the time being administering the government of the Nyasaland Protectorate.

III. Wherever in "The North - Eastern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1900," or in any other Order in Council, or in any laws, proclamations, rules, or regulations relating to North-Eastern Rhodesia, the term "Commissioner" is used, the term "Governor" shall be read in place thereof, and wherever in the said instruments the name "British Central Africa" is used, the name "Nyasaland" shall be read in place thereof.

IV. This Order shall be published in the North-Eastern Rhodesia Government Gazette, and shall take effect as from the date of the c ming into operation of "The Nyasaland Order in Council, 1907."

ORDER of the Local Government Board: District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Duties and District (Supplemental): HERTFORDSHIRE AUDIT DISTRICT.

CHELMSFORD UNION.

To Herbert Lyon, District Auditor; To Douglass Horace Boggis-Rolfe, Barrister-

at Law, District Auditor;—
To the Guardians of the Poor of the Chelmsford Union;

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 28th day of April, 1906, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of Herbert Lyon as a District Auditor, and assigned to him the duties therein mentioned and the District in which he should act as Auditor, and which in the said Order was termed "The Hertfordshire Audit District";

And whereas by an Order dated the 28th day of July, 1904, we certified the appointment of Douglass Horace Boggis-Rolfe, Barrister-at-Law, as a District Auditor and assigned to him the duties therein mentioned and the District in which he should act as Auditor, and which in that Order was termed "The Essex Audit District," and it was directed that the said District should, until we otherwise prescribed, comprise, among other areas, the Chelmsford Union;

And whereas it is desirable that the duty of auditing the Accounts of the Authorities comprised in the area included in the Chelmsford Union and of their Officers for the half-years ended in March and September, 1907, or for the year ended in March, 1907, as the case may be, should be assigned to the said Herbert Lyon;

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe as follows:

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the said Herbert Lyon to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and of their Officers for the half-years ended in March and September, 1907, or for the year ended in March, 1907, as the case may be; namely,

(1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the Chelms-

ford Poor Law Union.

(2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several

parishes comprised in the said Union.

(3.) The Parish Councils and the Parish Meetings of the several parishes comprised in the said Union.

(4.) The Chelmsford Joint Hospital Board.

(5.) The Rural District Council of Chelmsford.

(6.) The Joint Committee for the Management of the Sewage Farm appointed by the Town Council of Chelmsford and the Rural District Council of Chelmsford.

ARTICLE II.—The said Herbert Lyon shall audit the said Accounts for the said periods in conformity with the provisions contained in Article II of the said Order, dated the twentyeighth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and six, and for the purposes of the said audits the said Chelmsford Union shall be deemed to be within the Hertfordshire Audit District.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Authorised Exhibition and Sale of Fat Swine.

1. The provisions of the Somersetshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1907 (No. 2) shall not apply to the exhibition and sale of fat swine referred to in the Schedule hereto or to the movement of swine therefrom except that Article 12 (Offences) shall be incorporated in this Order and be read as if this Order were the Order therein referred to.

#### Regulation of Movement of Swine from Exhibition.

- 2.—(1.) Swine exposed at the said exhibition shall not be moved therefrom unless accompanied by a Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Somerset or elsewhere than to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the Licence.
- (2.) The swine shall before being moved from the exhibition be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting, with an indelible com-position of red colour, of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (3.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (4.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay,

practicable, be kept separate from all other swine not being moved under this Order.

- (5.) The Licence under this Order for the movement of swine from the exhibition shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said move-
- (6.) The swine shall be detained at the bacon factory or slaughter-house until they slaughtered.
- (7.) A copy of every Licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District wherein the place of destination of the swine is situate.

#### General Provisions as to Movement.

3. Swine moved with a Licence under this Order shall not be subject to any restriction on movement of swine imposed by Order of the Board or by any Regulation of a Local Authority made under any such Order.

#### Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 4.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

### Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

# Interpretation.

- In this Order -
- "Bacon factory" means premises in which the business of a curer of bacon is carried on:
- "Slaughter-house" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered.
