

ORDER of the Local Government Board:
District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of
Duties and District (Supplemental):—

HERTFORDSHIRE AUDIT DISTRICT.

CHELMSFORD UNION.

To Herbert Lyon, District Auditor;—
To Douglass Horace Boggis-Rolfe, Barrister-
at-Law, District Auditor;—
To the Guardians of the Poor of the
Chelmsford Union;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Section 4 of the District
Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local
Government Board may from time to time assign
to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts
in which such Auditors respectively are to act,
and may from time to time change wholly or in
part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 28th day
of April, 1906, We, the Local Government
Board, certified the appointment of Herbert
Lyon as a District Auditor, and assigned to
him the duties therein mentioned and the Dis-
trict in which he should act as Auditor, and
which in the said Order was termed "The
Hertfordshire Audit District";

And whereas by an Order dated the 28th day
of July, 1904, we certified the appointment of
Douglass Horace Boggis-Rolfe, Barrister-at-Law,
as a District Auditor and assigned to him the
duties therein mentioned and the District in which
he should act as Auditor, and which in that Order
was termed "The Essex Audit District," and it
was directed that the said District should, until
we otherwise prescribed, comprise, among other
areas, the Chelmsford Union;

And whereas it is desirable that the duty of
auditing the Accounts of the Authorities com-
prised in the area included in the Chelmsford
Union and of their Officers for the half-years
ended in March and September, 1907, or for the
year ended in March, 1907, as the case may be,
should be assigned to the said Herbert Lyon;

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers
given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We
hereby Order and Prescribe as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the said
Herbert Lyon to audit the Accounts of the
following Authorities and of their Officers for the
half-years ended in March and September, 1907,
or for the year ended in March, 1907, as the
case may be; namely,—

- (1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the Chelms-
ford Poor Law Union.
- (2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several
parishes comprised in the said Union.
- (3.) The Parish Councils and the Parish Meet-
ings of the several parishes comprised in the
said Union.
- (4.) The Chelmsford Joint Hospital Board.
- (5.) The Rural District Council of Chelmsford.
- (6.) The Joint Committee for the Management
of the Sewage Farm appointed by the Town
Council of Chelmsford and the Rural District
Council of Chelmsford.

ARTICLE II.—The said Herbert Lyon shall
audit the said Accounts for the said periods in
conformity with the provisions contained in
Article II of the said Order, dated the twenty-
eighth day of April, one thousand nine hundred
and six, and for the purposes of the said audits
the said Chelmsford Union shall be deemed to be
within the Hertfordshire Audit District.
