TEMPORARY ORDER of the Local Government Board: Relief to able-bodied Men, their Wives and Families:—

PARISH OF SAINT MARY ABBOTS
KENSINGTON.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Mary Abbots Kensington;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order, dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Parish of Saint Mary Abbots Kensington, the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of outdoor relief to poor persons in the said Parish;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Parish:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

Article I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Mary Abbots Kensington, may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

Article II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the Workhouse the wife and family of any able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse.

(2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the Workhouse, shall not be absent from the Workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for a period exceeding twelve hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians.

(3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the Workhouse without any contravention of subdivision (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the Workhouse, without being set to work during the time, or any part of the time, of his absence.

Article III.—This Order shall operate and have effect until the thirtieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Authorised Exhibition and Sale of Fat Swine.

1. The provisions of the Somersetshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1907 (No. 2) shall not apply to the exhibition and sale of fat swine referred to in the Schedule hereto or to the movement of swine therefrom except that Article 12 (*Offences*) shall be incorporated in this Order and be read as if this Order were the Order therein referred to.

Regulation of Movement of Swine from Exhibition.

2.—(1.) Swine exposed at the said exhibition shall not be moved therefrom unless accompanied by a Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Somerset or elsewhere than to a bacon factory or slaughter-house specified in the Licence.

(2.) The swine shall before being moved from the exhibition be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting, with an indelible composition of red colour, of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(3.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue

(4.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay,

and shall during the movement, as far as is practicable, be kept separate from all other swine not being moved under this Order.

(5.) The Licence under this Order for the movement of swine from the exhibition shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

(6.) The swine shall be detained at the bacon factory or slaughter-house until they are slaughtered.

(7.) A copy of every Licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District wherein the place of destination of the swine is situate.

General Provisions as to Movement.

3. Swine moved with a Licence under this Order shall not be subject to any restriction on movement of swine imposed by Order of the Board or by any regulation of a Local Authority made under any such Order.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Interpretation.

6. In this Order—

“Bacon factory” means premises in which the business of a curer of bacon is carried on:

“Slaughter-house” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered.

Oxö Auxiliary Light—Visibility of.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 1506 of 1907:—

The Norwegian Government has given further notice, dated 31st October, 1907, that a faint light is visible outside the arc of visibility (between N. 80° W. and N. 75° W.) of the secondary light (white fixed), established 70 feet below the principal light on Oxö, but that the difference in power between this and the true light is so marked that it is impossible to mistake one for the other.

Approximate position, lat. 58° 44' N. long. 8° 31' E.

a. Duke of Orleans Bay. Heavy breakers with a south-westerly swell, situated in approximately lat. 33° 57' 20" S., long. 122° 40' 0" E.

b. Point Malcolm. A reef, with a depth of 3 to 4 feet over it, on which the sea always breaks, situated in approximately lat. 33° 42' S., long. 123° 45' E.

LONDON AND WINDSOR MOTOR ROADS, TRAMROADS AND TRAMWAYS.

(Incorporation of Company; Compulsory Purchase of Lands in the counties of London, Middlesex, Buckingham and Berks; Construction of Motor Roads, Tramroads, and Tramways in said Counties; Powers to Deviate; Junctions of Motor Roads with Highways, &c.; Stopping up and Diversion of Roads, &c.; Powers to Lop Trees; Erection of Waiting Rooms, Garages, &c.; Generating Stations; Gauge; Posts; Wires, &c.; Electrical and other Motive Power; Extinguishment of Rights of Way; Acquisition of Commonable Lands; Power to Purchase part only of Houses, Buildings, Manufactories, &c.; Compensation to Landowners; Powers to deal with Lands; Application of Moneys from Sale of Lands, &c.; Powers to Limited Owners; Tolls and Charges; Bye-laws; Regulation and Classification of Traffic; Powers to Manufacture and Supply Motor Cars and Accessories and to render Services; Agreements with and Contributions by Government Departments, Local Authorities and Persons; Amendment or Repeal of Provisions of Tramways Act, 1870; Exemption from Rating; Agreements as to Supply of Electrical Energy and as to Running over Tramways; Provision of Motor Cars and Motor Omnibuses; Payment of Interest out of Capital; Appointment of Auditors; Sale or Lease of Undertaking; Incorporation, Application, Amendment or Repeal of Acts; other Powers and Purposes).

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill (hereinafter referred to as "the Bill") for effecting all or some of the following among other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To incorporate a Company (hereinafter called "the Company") and confer upon it the powers hereinafter mentioned, and all other necessary and convenient powers for the purposes of the Bill.

2. To empower the Company to make and maintain the motor roads hereinafter described, or some or one of them, or some part or parts thereof respectively, with all needful bridges, viaducts, embankments, junctions, gates, barriers, fences, footways, approaches, culverts and works, and all needful depôts, garages, repairing and other shops and sheds, charging stations, offices, buildings, yards and conveniences connected therewith (that is to say):—

A Motor Road, No. 1A, wholly situate in the parish and metropolitan borough of Hammersmith, in the county of London, commencing at a point in the southern building line of Beadon-road, adjoining Hammersmith-broadway, 57 yards or thereabouts from the north-east corner of the property known as the Hammersmith Liberal Club, situate between the street known as The Grove and Bradmore-lane, measured in a south-easterly direction, and 43 yards or thereabouts from the entrance to the Hammersmith Station of the Metropolitan and Great Western Railway, measured in a westerly direction, and terminating in the eastern building line of Burfield-street at a point 27 yards or thereabouts from the north-east corner of Burfield-street, measured in a southerly direction.

A Motor Road No. 1B, wholly situate in the parish and metropolitan borough of Hammersmith, in the county of London, commencing at a point in the southern building line of Glenthorne-road, at a point 47 yards or thereabouts from the south-eastern corner of the General Post Office (Sorting Office) at the corner of the Grove aforesaid and Glenthorne-road, measured in a south-westerly direction, and 33 yards or thereabouts from the south-east corner of the building line of Overstone-road at its junction with Glenthorne-road, measured in a south-easterly direction and terminating by a junction with the Motor Road No. 1A at its termination hereinbefore described.

A Motor Road No. 1, commencing in the parish and metropolitan borough of Hammersmith, in the county of London, by a junction with the Motor Roads Nos. 1A and 1B at their terminations hereinbefore described and terminating in the parish and urban district of Chiswick, in the county of Middlesex, at a point on the eastern fence of the North and South Western Junction Railway (Hammersmith Branch) 163 yards or thereabouts from the south-eastern corner of the lodge at the level crossing of Stamford Brook-road on the said railway, measured in a south-easterly direction, and 123 yards or thereabouts from the centre of the bridge carrying the Kensington and Richmond Branch of the London and South Western Railway over Prebend Gardens, measured in a north-westerly direction.

A Motor Road No. 2, situate in the parish and metropolitan borough of Hammersmith, in the county of London, the parish and urban district of Chiswick, and the parish and urban district of Acton, in the county of Middlesex, commencing in the parish and metropolitan borough of Hammersmith, in the county of London, at a point in the western building line of Goldhawk-road at the intersection of Stamford Brook-road and Goldhawk-road, the said point coinciding with the south-eastern corner of the Queen of England public house, and terminating in the parish and urban district of Acton, in the county of Middlesex, at a point 62 yards or thereabouts from the south-eastern corner of the passenger booking office at Chiswick Park and Acton Green station on the Metropolitan District Railway (Ealing extension), measured in a southerly direction, and 44 yards or thereabouts from the south-western corner of the building of the West London Depository, measured in a north-westerly direction.

A Motor Road No. 3, situate in the parish and urban district of Acton, the parishes of Old Brentford and New Brentford, in the urban district of Brentford, the parishes of Isleworth and Heston, in the urban district of Heston and Isleworth, the parishes of Cranford, Harlington, and Harmondsworth, in the rural

district of Staines, in the county of Middlesex, and the parishes of Iver Langley Marish (Detached), Langley Marish, Horton Stoke Poges (Detached), in the rural district of Eton, the parish and urban district of Slough, in the county of Buckingham, commencing in the parish and urban district of Acton, in the county of Middlesex, by a junction with the Motor Road No. 2 at its termination hereinbefore described, and terminating in the parish and urban district of Slough, in the county of Buckingham, at a point in the eastern fence of Windsor-road, 31 yards or thereabouts from the south-eastern corner of the Prince of Wales public-house, measured in a south-easterly direction, and 553 yards or thereabouts from the south-western corner of Spring Cottage, measured in a westerly direction.

A Motor Road No. 4, wholly situate in the rural district of Eton, in the county of Buckingham, commencing in the parish of Langley Marish, by a junction with the Motor Road No. 3 hereinbefore described, at a point 973 yards or thereabouts from the north-western corner of Ditton Park Mansion, measured in a north-westerly direction, and 685 yards or thereabouts from the centre of Longmead Bridge, measured in a north-easterly direction, and terminating in the parish of Datchet, at a point in the centre of Datchet-road, 143 yards or thereabouts from the centre of Victoria Bridge, measured along the centre of the said road in an easterly and south-easterly direction.

3. The proposed motor roads are intended for use by all classes, or a class or classes to be prescribed by the Bill, of cars, carriages, waggons, omnibuses, vans, bicycles, tricycles, and all other kinds of vehicles, self-propelled by means of any power other than animal power, or hauled by a locomotive or other vehicle similarly actuated (all of which are hereinafter referred to as "motor vehicles"), and for use to such extent as the Bill may provide by vehicles propelled or driven by animal or human power.

4. To empower the Company to make all proper or necessary junctions and communications between the proposed motor roads and any road or street existing, in course of construction, or hereafter to be made, which may be joined, intersected or interfered with by or be contiguous to the line of the proposed motor roads, and to make such roads, entrances and approaches with or without gates as may be necessary to afford access to the proposed motor roads for motor vehicles, and for such and the other purposes of the Bill, to alter the line and levels of any streets, roads or ways, public or private, existing or in course of construction, to any extent which may be defined in the Bill, and to cross, stop up, make openings into, divert, alter, whether temporarily or permanently, or otherwise interfere with all streets, roads, highways, paths, courts, gardens, passages and places, and all tramways, railways, bridges, canals, rivers, streams, drains, sewers, gas, water, and other pipes, telephone, telegraph, and electric wires and apparatus within the aforesaid parishes and places as may be necessary for the making and maintaining of the said motor roads and for carrying into effect the purposes of the Bill, and to appropriate and use the same for the purposes of the proposed motor roads, together with the solum of any public streets and roads under, along, or across which the said motor roads are intended to be made.

5. To make provision for the repair of all or any of the altered or diverted roads, streets, footpaths or highways to be constructed or altered under the authority of the Bill by the same persons and by the same means as other roads, streets, footpaths or highways in the parishes or places within which the altered or diverted roads, streets, footpaths or highways will be situate are for the time being legally repairable, or in such other manner as may be prescribed by the Bill, and to provide that the Company shall not be liable to repair or maintain the surface of any road or highway which shall be carried over any of the proposed motor roads by a bridge or bridges or the immediate approaches thereto.

6. To authorize the Company to construct, lay down, maintain, work, and use the tramroads, tramways, and works hereinafter described, or some or one of them, with all necessary and proper rails, studs, plates, sleepers, channels, junctions, sidings, turntables, turnouts, crossings, passing places, crossovers, triangles, waiting rooms, stables, carriage houses, engine houses, stations, sheds, buildings, works, and conveniences connected therewith respectively.

The tramroads and tramways proposed to be authorized by the Bill are as follows:—

Tramway No. 1A (a tramroad), wholly situate in the parish and metropolitan borough of Hammersmith, in the county of London, commencing at a point in the southern building line of Beadon-road adjoining Hammersmith Broadway, 57 yards or thereabouts from the north-east corner of the property known as the Hammersmith Liberal Club, situate between the street known as The Grove and Bradmore-lane, measured in a south-easterly direction, and 43 yards or thereabouts from the entrance to the Hammersmith Station of the Metropolitan and Great Western Railway, measured in a westerly direction, and terminating in the eastern building line of Burfield-street at a point 27 yards or thereabouts from the north-east corner of Burfield-street measured in a southerly direction.

Tramway No. 1 (a tramroad), commencing in the parish and metropolitan borough of Hammersmith, in the county of London, by a junction with Tramway No. 1A, at its termination hereinbefore described and terminating in the parish and urban district of Chiswick, in the county of Middlesex, at a point on the eastern fence of the North and South-Western Junction Railway (Hammersmith Branch), 163 yards or thereabouts from the south-eastern corner of the lodge at the level crossing of Stamford Brook-road on the said railway, measured in a south-easterly direction, and 123 yards or thereabouts from the centre of the bridge carrying the Kensington and Richmond Branch of the London and South-Western Railway over Prebend Gardens, measured in a north-westerly direction.

Tramway No. 2 (a tramroad), situate in the parish and metropolitan borough of Hammersmith, in the county of London, the parish and urban district of Chiswick and the parish and urban district of Acton, in the county of Middlesex, commencing in the parish and metropolitan borough of Hammersmith, in the county of London, at a point in the western building line of Goldhawk-road, at the intersection of Stamford Brook-road and Goldhawk-road, the said point coinciding with the south-eastern corner of the Queen of England Public-house, and terminating in the parish and urban district of Acton, in the

county of Middlesex, at a point 62 yards or thereabouts from the south-eastern corner of the passenger booking office at Chiswick Park and Acton Green Station on the Metropolitan District Railway (Baling Extension) measured in a southerly direction, and 44 yards or thereabouts from the south-western corner of the building of the West London Depository measured in a north-westerly direction.

Tramway No. 2a (a tramroad), wholly situate in the county of Middlesex, commencing in the parish and urban district of Chiswick, at a point in the northern building line of High-road, 63 yards or thereabouts from the north-eastern corner of Turnham Green Church, measured in a northerly direction and 92 yards or thereabouts from the south-western corner of the Crown and Anchor public-house, measured in a westerly direction and terminating in the parish and urban district of Acton, by a junction with Tramway No. 2 at its termination hereinbefore described.

Tramway No. 3 (a tramroad) situate in the parish and urban district of Acton, the parishes of Old Brentford and New Brentford, in the urban district of Brentford; the parishes of Isleworth and Heston, in the urban district of Heston and Isleworth, the parishes of Cranford, Harlington, and Harmondsworth, in the rural district of Staines, in the county of Middlesex, and the parishes of Iver, Langley Marish (detached), Langley Marish, Horton, Stoke Poges (detached), in the rural district of Eton, the parish and urban district of Slough, in the county of Buckingham, commencing in the parish and urban district of Acton, in the county of Middlesex, by a junction with Tramway No. 2 at its termination hereinbefore described and terminating in the parish and urban district of Slough, in the county of Buckingham, at a point in the eastern fence of Windsor-road, 31 yards or thereabouts from the south-eastern corner of the Prince of Wales public house, measured in a south-easterly direction, and 553 yards or thereabouts from the south-western corner of Spring Cottage, measured in a westerly direction.

Tramway No. 4 (a tramroad), situate in the parishes of Langley Marish and Datchet, in the rural district of Eton, and the county of Buckingham, and the parish of New Windsor, in the borough of Windsor, and the county of Berks, commencing in the parish of Langley Marish, in the rural district of Eton, and the county of Buckingham, by a junction with Tramway No. 3, hereinbefore described at a point 973 yards or thereabouts from the north-western corner of Ditton Park Mansion measured in a north-westerly direction, and 685 yards or thereabouts from the centre of Longmead Bridge measured in a north-easterly direction, and terminating in the parish of New Windsor, in the borough of Windsor and the county of Berks, in the northern fence of Datchet-road, at a point 153 yards or thereabouts from the doorway leading into the Queen's Waiting Room at the Windsor terminus of the London and South Western Railway (Windsor line), measured in a north-easterly direction, and 355 yards or thereabouts from the north-eastern corner of Windsor Castle, measured in a north-westerly direction.

Tramway No. 5, wholly situate in the borough of Windsor, in the county of Berks, commencing in the parish of New Windsor by a junction with Tramway No. 4 at its termina-

tion hereinbefore described, passing thence in a south-westerly direction along Datchet-road, thence into and along Thames-avenue, and terminating in the parish of Clewer Within at a point in the western building line of River-street, 66 yards or thereabouts from the junction of the northern building line of Thames-street with the western frontage of River-street, measured along the said River-street building line.

Tramway No. 6 (a tramroad), wholly situate in the parish of Clewer Within, in the borough of Windsor and the county of Berks, commencing by a junction with Tramway No. 5 at its termination hereinbefore described, and terminating at a point near the north-east corner of Goswell-road, 223 yards or thereabouts from the centre of Windsor Bridge, measured in a south-westerly direction, and 217 yards or thereabouts from the centre of the Curfew Tower, Windsor Castle, measured in a north-westerly direction.

Tramway No. 7, wholly situate in the parish of Clewer Within, in the borough of Windsor and the county of Berks, commencing by a junction with Tramway No. 6 at its termination hereinbefore described, passing thence in a westerly direction into, and in a westerly direction along the road on the southern bank of the River Thames (continuation of River-street) and terminating on the northern fence of that road at the point at which that road is crossed by the western boundary of the parish of Clewer Within.

Tramway No. 8 (a tramroad), situate in the parish of Clewer Within, in the borough of Windsor, the parish of Clewer Without, in the rural district of Windsor, in the county of Berks, the parish of Eton Wick, in the rural district of Eton, the parish and urban district of Slough, in the county of Buckingham, commencing in the parish of Clewer Within, in the borough of Windsor, and the county of Berks, by a junction with Tramway No. 7, at its termination hereinbefore described, and terminating in the parish and urban district of Slough, in the county of Buckingham, by a junction with Tramway No. 3, at its termination hereinbefore described.

7. The proposed tramroads and tramways will be constructed on a gauge of 4 feet 8½ inches, or such other gauge as the Board of Trade may approve, and will be worked by mechanical power, and it is not proposed to lay any tramway so that for a distance of 30 feet or upwards a less space than 9 feet 6 inches will intervene between the outside of the footpath on either side of the street or road and the nearest rail of the tramway, except in the case of the following tramway, and then only at the place hereafter described (that is to say):—

Tramway No. 5 in Datchet-road, on both sides thereof from a point opposite the south western corner of the terminus of the London and South Western Railway (Windsor Line) to a point 35 yards or thereabouts eastwards along the said road.

8. To authorize the Company to enter upon and open the surface of and to alter, stop up and remove and otherwise interfere with streets, highways, public and private roadways, footways, footpaths, places, towpaths, pavements, railways, rivers, watercourses, bridges, sewers, drains, water pipes, gas pipes, lamp-posts, pillar boxes and electric telegraphic and telephonic tubes, posts, wires and apparatus within all or any of the parishes and places mentioned in

this Notice for the purposes of the proposed motor roads, and for the purpose of constructing, maintaining, repairing, renewing, removing or reinstating the proposed tramroads and tramways or any of them, or substituting others in their place or for other the purposes of the Bill, to construct all such subways, sewers, drains and works as are necessary or convenient for or in connection with those purposes, and to straighten or set back the edge or kerb of the footpath, footway or pavement on both sides or any side of any street or road in or along which any of the proposed tramways will be laid.

9. To empower the Company to deviate, laterally and vertically, from the lines and levels of the proposed motor roads, tramroads, tramways and works shown on the deposited plans and sections after-mentioned to the extent to be shown on the said plans and sections, or to be defined in the Bill, and to underpin, support and otherwise strengthen walls and buildings near to or which may be affected by any of the proposed works, without being required to purchase the same.

10. To empower the Company from time to time, and either temporarily or permanently, to make, maintain, alter, remove or abandon such tramways, crossings, passing-places, cross-overs, deviations, sidings, junctions, curves, turnouts, turntables, and other works, in addition to those specified herein as may be necessary or convenient for the efficient working of the proposed tramroads and tramways, or any of them, or otherwise in the interests of the Company, or for facilitating the passage of traffic along streets and roads, or for providing access to any stables or carriage-houses, engine-houses, generating stations, stationary engines, works or buildings of the Company or for forming junctions with any other tramways, tramroads or light railways existing or authorized, or which may hereafter be authorized.

11. To empower the Company to substitute double lines for single or interlacing lines, single lines for double or interlacing lines, and interlacing lines for double or single lines on the proposed tramroads and tramways, or any of them.

12. To empower the Company to cut, lop off and remove any trees planted in or near any street, road or place along or across which any of the proposed tramways are laid which may interfere with the construction or working of such tramways, or the trolley wires, or the clear and safe passage of the trams and the passengers thereon, and to erect waiting rooms for passengers on any of the roadways in which the proposed tramways will be laid.

13. To empower the Company to work and use for the conveyance of traffic of all descriptions the proposed tramroads and tramways, or any of them, and any tramways for the time being leased to or run over, worked or used by the Company, by means of engines, carriages, trucks and vehicles propelled (in addition to or in substitution for animal power), by electrical power generated at and applied from stations or otherwise, or steam, pneumatic, gas, oil or other mechanical power, or partly by one such power and partly by another such power, and for that purpose or any purpose appurtenant or ancillary thereto, to confer on the Company such rights, powers and privileges as may be necessary or expedient for carrying into effect the purposes of the Bill, and in particular power to enter upon and open the surface of and to lay down on, in, under or over the

place, railway or bridge, such posts, wires, tubes, mains, plates or apparatus, and to make and maintain such openings, posts, wires, tubes or ways on, in, under or over any such surface, and remove any such lamp-post, pillar box or other erections, and to attach to any house or building, bridge or existing lamp-post or standard such supports, brackets and fittings as may be necessary or convenient, either for the construction and working of the proposed tramroads and tramways, or for providing access to or in connection with any generating station, engines, machinery or apparatus, and to empower the Company for the purpose of working the proposed tramroads and tramways, and of the Bill, to erect engines and machinery, and to acquire, hold, grant and dispose of patent and other rights and licences, and to use patent and other rights and licences in relation to such electrical or other mechanical power.

14. To reserve to the Company the exclusive right of using on the proposed tramroads and tramways, engines and carriages with flange wheels or wheels specially adapted to run on a grooved edge or other rail.

15. To provide for and regulate the user by the Company, for the purposes of the Bill, of any paving, metalling or road materials excavated or removed by them during the construction of any of the proposed motor roads, tramroads, tramways and works, and the ownership and disposal of any surplus paving, metalling or materials, and to make provision with respect to the materials to be used by the Company in executing any such works.

16. To authorize the Company when by reason of the execution of any work affecting the surface or soil of any footway, footpath, street, road or place or otherwise in which any tramway, channel, conduit or electric line shall be or is to be laid or placed, it is necessary or expedient to remove or discontinue the use of any tramway, channel, conduit or electric line as aforesaid, or any part thereof to make in the same or any adjacent street, road or place, and maintain work and use so long as occasion may require a temporary tramway, channel, conduit or electric line, or temporary tramways, channels, conduits or electric lines in lieu of the tramway, channel, conduit or electric line or part of the tramway, channel, conduit or electric line so removed or discontinued to be used or intended so to be.

17. To empower the Company to widen where necessary the carriage road along which the proposed tramways are to be laid by reducing the width of the footpath or otherwise.

18. To enable the Company for the purposes of or in connection with the proposed motor roads, tramroads, tramways and other works, and other the purposes of the Bill and of the undertaking thereby authorized, and of any agreement made or to be made between the Company and any local or road authority under or for the purposes of the Bill, to purchase or acquire by compulsion or agreement, and to hold all or any of the lands (including in that expression when used in this Notice, houses, buildings, and interests in or rights over land and other property) shown on the deposited plans, or to take easements over or in connection therewith, and to acquire by agreement in addition to such lands other lands to such extent as may be prescribed by the Bill, and to hold any of such lands, and to erect, hold, manage and use offices, buildings, garages, repair shops, stores, engine houses, generating stations car sheds, stables and other conveniences on any of such lands or property, and to sell, lease or

dispose of, or let on hire [any such lands, offices, buildings, houses, stations, sheds and other conveniences, and also to enable the Company to purchase or acquire by compulsion or agreement, and to hold and use the following lands for the purposes of erecting and to erect, maintain and use thereon a generating station or stations for generating, transforming, storing and supplying electrical energy, with all necessary and subsidiary works and appliances, and also depôts, car sheds, workshops, and other buildings or other the purposes of the undertaking (namely):—

Certain lands, containing 12 acres 0 roods 20 poles, being part of the field or enclosure numbered 274 on the 2500 Ordnance map (London Sheet lxxxiii, edition of 1891-96), situate in the parish of Isleworth in the urban district of Heston and Isleworth, and the county of Middlesex, and bounded on the northern side by the fence dividing the fields or enclosures numbered 251 and 274 on the above-mentioned Ordnance map, on the western side by the Great Western Railway (Brentford Branch), on the southern side by the London and South Western Railway (loop line), for a distance of 203 yards or thereabouts from its

intersection with the Great Western Railway (Brentford Branch), measured in an easterly direction, and on the eastern side by a line drawn at right angles from the eastern end of the southern boundary to a point on the boundary fence of the Grand Junction Canal for a distance of 97 yards or thereabouts, and thence along the boundary fence of the Grand Junction Canal to the northern boundary.

19. To extinguish or provide for the extinguishment of all rights of way and other rights over or affecting any road or highway, streets, footpaths, ways, courts, alleys and passages and portions thereof which are proposed to be stopped up and discontinued and diverted, and in and over the lands to be acquired under and for the purposes of the Bill, and for vesting the site and soil of such roads, streets, footpaths, ways, courts, alleys and passages, or portions thereof in the Company.

20. To empower the Company to take for or in connection with the purposes of the Bill, certain lands, being or reputed to be commons or commonable lands, of which the following are the particulars and the estimated quantities proposed to be taken:—

And to extinguish all manorial, commonable and other rights in, over and under the lands purchased or acquired under the powers of the Bill.

21. To exempt the Company from the operation of Section 92 of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, so as to enable them to purchase compulsorily parts only of houses, buildings and manufactories without being bound to purchase the whole thereof.

22. To make special provisions as to the acquisition of lands required for the purposes of the Bill, and as to determining the purchase money and compensation payable in respect thereof, and to provide for limiting the amount of such money or compensation and claims in respect thereof in cases of recent buildings and alterations and recently created interests therein, and to provide that in determining the purchase money or compensation to be paid to any person whose property is taken under the powers of the Bill the jury, arbitrator or other authority shall take into consideration any improved value of other lands belonging to the said owner by reason of the construction of the proposed motor roads, or the exercise of other powers of

23. To authorize the Company to hold any of the lands they are by the Bill authorized to acquire and which are not required for the purposes of the proposed motor roads, and from time to time to lay out streets, roads, and footpaths on such and any other lands belonging to the Company, and erect on and to remove therefrom houses and buildings, and to sell and let on building or other leases or agreements, or otherwise deal with or dispose of the said lands and buildings or any part or parts thereof, and to raise money on the security of any such lands or buildings, and so far as may be necessary to exempt the Company from all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to superfluous lands.

24. To make provision with reference to the application of all or any of the moneys arising on the sale, lease, or other disposal of any lands or buildings by the Company or for the investment thereof, or for the distribution thereof amongst the shareholders and mortgagees of the

Company, or some of them, or otherwise, as may be prescribed or authorized by the Bill.

25. To enable the Company in selling or disposing of lands acquired by them to attach conditions as to the use thereof, and to enable the Company to enforce such conditions by power of re-entry, penalties or otherwise.

26. To confer upon any persons having limited estates or interests in any lands which would or might be in any manner benefitted or improved by the construction of the proposed motor roads, or by the exercise of any of the powers which may be conferred by the Bill, power to subscribe and hold shares in the capital of the Company, and to charge such lands with the money so subscribed, and to grant and convey any such lands to the Company with or without payment or consideration, or on such terms and conditions as may be authorized by the Bill.

27. To enable the Company to levy and recover tolls, rates and charges for the use of the proposed motor roads and in respect of the proposed tramroads and tramways and any other tramways owned, leased to, or run over, worked or used by them, and for the conveyance of passengers and traffic thereon, and to confer, vary or extinguish exemptions from the payments of such tolls, rates and charges, and to provide for a periodic or other fixed payment by way of commutation.

28. To empower the Company to prescribe the class or classes of motor and other vehicles entitled to use the proposed motor roads, to regulate the construction, and when on the proposed motor roads, the method of operation of such vehicles, to make different regulations for and differentiate between different motor and other vehicles and classes of motor and other vehicles using the proposed motor roads.

29. To authorize the Company to make, vary and rescind bye-laws, rules and regulations for the conduct, management and regulation of motor and other vehicles using the proposed motor roads and of traffic thereon, or for the exclusion of traffic, persons, animals and vehicles therefrom, and to enforce the observance of such bye-laws, rules and regulations, and to impose and recover penalties for the breach or non-observance thereof.

and render services for or in connection with all or any of such purposes.

31. To empower the Company on the one hand, and any Government Department, the Councils for the Administrative Counties of London, Middlesex, Buckingham and Berks, and any local authority or other bodies or persons, or any of them having respectively the control or management or the duty of directing the repairs of or in whom they are vested any footways, footpaths, streets, roads, bridges, canals, sewers and places respectively within the said parishes and places on the other hand, to enter into and carry into effect contracts or agreements with regard to all or any of the purposes of the Bill, and in particular with respect to the construction, maintenance and user of the proposed motor roads and the works and conveniences connected therewith, the formation and user of approaches thereto, and connections thereof with public roads and streets, the construction of contiguous public roads, the acquisition of lands under and for the purposes of the Bill, widening of any street, road or place, and the contribution by such authorities or any of them to the expense thereof, the acquisition and appropriation of lands, the alteration of the widths or levels of any of the said footways, footpaths, streets, roads, bridges, canals, sewers, or places, and the manner of and time for laying down, placing, altering, maintaining, renewing, repairing and working, and the using by the Company of the proposed tramways and the rails, plates, sleepers, tubes, wires, posts, brackets, ways and works connected therewith, and for facilitating the passage of carriages and traffic over or along any of the proposed tramways, the erection of waiting-rooms for passengers, and for the purchase or postponement of the purchase or variation of the terms of purchase under the Tramways Act, 1870, of the proposed tramways or any of them or of any lands and properties acquired by the Company for the purposes of the proposed works or otherwise by the County Councils and local authorities, bodies or persons as aforesaid or any of them, and to confirm any agreements entered into or to be entered into with the County Councils, local authorities, bodies or persons as aforesaid or any of them with respect to any of the purposes aforesaid or other the purposes of the Bill.
