REGULATIONS.

Two Courts are usually held at about the end of February or the beginning of March, and two more about the end of May or the beginning of June.

1. Ladies who have been presented and who wish to be summoned to one of these Courts are requested to make a written application to The Lord Chamberlain, St. James's Palace, S.W., on or as soon as possible after the 1st January next, but not before that date.

2. It is not according to rule, unless under exceptional circumstances, for ladies to attend Court more than once in every three years.

- 3. When making applications, ladies are requested to state approximately the time of year that will be most convenient for them to attend a Court.
- 4. A lady attending a Court may present one lady, for whom she must be responsible, in addition to her daughter or daughter-in-law. The names of ladies to be presented should be forwarded by the lady who wishes to make the presentation when she sends in her own name.
- 5. No applications can be received from ladies who wish to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the ladies who wish to make the presentations.
- 6. Ladies may be accompanied to Court by their husbands if the latter have been presented, but gentlemen do not pass before The King and Queen. LADIES ARE REQUESTED TO FORWARD THE NAMES OF THEIR HUSBANDS AT THE SAME TIME AS THEIR OWN in order that they may be submitted together.
- 7. Summonses are issued about three weeks before the date of each Court, and should it not be an Unofficial Member of be convenient for a lady to attend the particular Council of the Island of Ceylon.

Court to which she is summoned, it will be open to her to make her excuses to the Lord Chamberlain in writing, when her name can, if desired, and if possible, be transferred to another list.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a translation of a Circular, dated November 5, issued by the Austrian Government intimating that the existence of bubonic plague at Tunis having been officially declared, all goods arriving from that port are to be subjected to the treatment laid down in the Government Circular of August 12, 1904, No. 12468.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Government, dated November 14, amending the regulations respecting the prevention of infection by ships arriving in Dutch ports, making Article 6, Paragraph 2 of the Regulations to read as follows:—"If it appears from the Master's statement that sufferers from plague, yellow fever, or Asiatic cholera have been on board during the voyage, or that an unusual mortality among the rats has been observed, and if the inspection shows or causes him to suspect that there are or have been sufferers from the said diseases on board, or that there exists an unusual mortality among the rats, he shall institute an inspection of the condition of the ship (living places, bilge water, drinking water, etc.), of the nature of the cargo, and the manner in which it has been stowed." The following words are added in Article 8, sub. 5 (after the word "merchandise") "including the destruction of the rats and other vermin on board."

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Telegram, dated December 11, from His Majesty's Representative at Constantinople:—"Sanitary precautions against Tunis, Bona and Philippeville suppressed."

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated December 2, from His Majesty's Representative at Constantinople, intimating that at a supplementary meeting of the Constantinople Board of Health, held on November 28th, reports were read from the Prefecture of that city to the effect that considerable numbers of pilgrims from Russia are daily arriving in Constantinople by railway (from Vienna, Budapest or some other point on the line), and by sea from Kustendjé. They thus escaped the measures in force on pilgrims arriving direct by sea from Russian ports.

It was consequently decided that those coming by railway will be stopped at the station of Tchataldja, where they will undergo medical visit and the disinfection of their effects, the delay not to last more than forty-eight hours. They will then be taken by special train or in special carriages to the Sirkedji terminus (Constantinople), whence they will be conducted by agents of the municipality and the police on board ships preparing to start for the Hedjaz.

Ships coming from Kustendje will undergo a medical visit at Kavak, and if pilgrims are found on board coming from Russia they will be landed at the Monastyr Aghzi Lazaret, where they will do forty-eight hours' quarantine, and their clothes and effects will be disinfected.

All the above measures came into practical effect on the 1st of December.

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 10TH DECEMBER 1907.)

# THE AMERICAN GOOSEBERRY MILDEW ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

# Application of the Order.

1. This Order shall apply to the districts which are by the First Schedule hereto declared to be affected.

#### Definitions.

- 2. In this Order-
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "The Local Authority" means as regards any District described in the first column of the First Schedule hereto, the council mentioned in the second column of that Schedule:
- "Disease" means the disease affecting gooseberry and current bushes which is known as *Sphaerotheca mors-uvae* or American Gooseberry Mildew; and "diseased" means affected with disease:
- "Bush" includes a cutting, seedling, or other plant:
- "Article" means Article of this Order.

# Notification of Disease.

3. The occupier of any premises on which there is a bush which is diseased or suspected of being diseased shall forthwith notify the fact to the clerk to the Local Authority, or to some person authorised by the Local Authority to receive such notices, and where practicable a specimen showing the disease or suspected disease shall accompany the notice.

# Preliminary Investigation by Local Authority.

- 4.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving in any manner notice of the existence or supposed existence of disease shall forthwith take such steps as may be necessary to determine on what premises the disease exists, and shall cause notice of such determination to be served on the occupier of each of such premises which shall thereupon become "infected premises" and continue to be infected premises until the notice is altered or withdrawn by the Local Authority in accordance with Article 10.
- (2.) The notice shall as far as practicable include in the infected premises only such plantations, gardens or fields as contain bushes which are or recently have been diseased.

# Precautions to be Adopted in case of an Outbreak of Disease or Supposed Outbreak.

5.—(1.) The occupier of any plantation, garden or field on which there is a diseased bush shall as soon as is practicable spray all the diseased bushes and all gooseberry and currant bushes on the plantation, garden or field to which the disease is likely to spread with a solution of liver

- of sulphur (containing not less than one pound of liver of sulphur to thirty-two gallons of water) or with some other fungicide approved by or on behalf of the Local Authority for that purpose; provided that this provision shall not apply to bushes which have shed their leaves.
- (2.) No bush shall be removed from any plantation, garden or field on which there is a bush which is diseased or suspected of being diseased, and clippings from diseased or suspected bushes shall be forthwith destroyed by burning or other effective method by the occupier of the premises.

#### Action to be taken by Local Authority after Preliminary Investigation.

- 6.—(1.) The Local Authority shall as soon as is practicable cause a notice to be served on each occupier of infected premises requiring him to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the disease as are specified in the notice.
- (2.) A notice under this Article shall require the occupier of the premises as regards each diseased bush on the premises and every bush immediately adjoining such bush—
  - (a) to destroy by burning or other effective method and by a date to be specified in the notice, either the whole bush or, if the occupier so prefer, all wood formed in the current or preceding year on the bush, which wood shall for that purpose be pruned to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and also similarly to destroy the fruit (if any) on each diseased bush; and
  - (b) to spray thoroughly the site of each bush which has not shed its leaves as soon as possible with a solution of liver of sulphur (containing at least one pound of liver of sulphur to twenty-four gallous of water) or with some other fungicide approved by or on behalf of the Local Authority for that purpose;

Provided that if the occupier shall fail to carry out the destruction required by the notice by the date therein specified the Local Authority may cause their officers to carry out the work by either of the alternative methods prescribed by the notice.

- (c) And also as soon as is practicable, and thereafter while the notice remains in force, if and when so directed by an Inspector of the Local Authority, to prune or spray as may be directed all gooseberry and currant bushes on the infected premises whether the same have been diseased or not.
- (3.) All clippings arising from any pruning under this Article shall be forthwith destroyed by the occupier by burning or other effective method.

# Power to Require Adoption of Precautions on Premises in Vicinity of Infected Premises.

7. The Local Authority may cause a notice to be served on the occupier of any plantation, garden or field on which there are gooseberry or currant bushes to which the disease is likely to spread from infected premises in the vicinity requiring such occupier, on or before such date as therein specified, to spray thoroughly all the gooseberry and currant bushes on such plantation, garden or field with a solution of liver of sulphur (containing not less than one pound of

liver of sulphur to thirty-two gallons of water) or with some other fungicide approved by or on behalf of the Lecal Authority. Provided that this provision shall not apply to bushes which have shed their leaves.

Precautions against Spread of Disease by Fruit Picking.

8. Where the Local Authority are satisfied that the extent of the disease in any plantation, garden or field is such that the picking of the crop would be likely to spread the disease to other premises, the Local Authority may by notice served on the occupier of the plantation, garden or field prohibit the picking of the crop either absolutely or subject to such conditions as they think necessary for the prevention of the spread of disease by such picking.

Precautions against Spread of Disease by Bushes.

- 9.—(1.) No gooseberry or currant bush shall be removed from infected premises except with, and subject to the conditions (if any) inserted in, a licence granted by the Board.
- (2.) An Inspector of the Local Authority may within the district of the Local Authority, and an Inspector of the Board may elsewhere in Great Britain, by notice served on the owner or person in charge of any bushes which have been removed in contravention of this Order or on any person to whom they have been consigned for sale prohibit the sale or exposure for sale of such bushes, and require the same to be either destroyed or returned to the infected premises.

# Withdrawal of Notices of Infected Premises.

10. A notice constituting any premises infected premises shall not be altered or withdrawn by the Local Authority, except with the approval of the Board, until the expiration of the year following that in which the disease has last been seen on the premises, unless the premises are before that date cleared of gooseberry and currant bushes and the sites of the diseased bushes and the bushes immediately adjoining them are disinfected in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

Copies of Notices and Returns of Proceedings to be sent to the Board.

- 11.—(1.) A copy of every notice served under this Order shall be sent to the Board by the Inspector by whom the notice is signed.
- (2.) The Local Authority shall, in a form to be provided by the Board, notify the Board of any outbreak of disease, and shall as soon as may be after the expiration of each year report to the Board the proceedings taken in the preceding year by the Local Authority under this Order or any Order hereby revoked.

#### Powers of Entry.

12. Any Inspector or other officer appointed in that behalf by the Local Authority, and any Inspector of the Board, may upon production if so required of his appointment or authority enter any land on which he has reason to believe that disease exists or has recently existed and examine any gooseberry or currant bush on such land.

#### Notification of Order.

13. This Order shall be published by the Local and any such penalty may be impo Authority by advertisement in a newspaper revoking Order had not been made.

circulating in the district of the Local Authority and in such other manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to insure publicity for the same.

#### Offences.

- 14. Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, who—
  - (1.) knowingly fails to give notification of disease as required by Article 3; or
  - (2.) fails to prune or spray in manner prescribed by this Order or by any notice served on him under this Order any bush or other thing required under the Order or notice to be pruned or sprayed by him; or
  - (3.) removes any bush in contravention of this Order; or
  - (4.) fails to destroy any clipping required under this Order to be destroyed by him; or
  - (5.) fails to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the disease as are specified in a notice served on him under Article 6; or
  - (6.) picks or permits to be picked any crop or part of a crop in contravention of a notice served on him under Article 8, or fails to comply with the conditions of any such notice; or
  - (7.) sells or exposes for sale any bushes in contravention of a notice served on him under Article 9, or fails either to destroy or return any bushes as required by any such notice; or
  - (8.) wilfully obstructs or impedes any Inspector or other officer in the course of his duties under this Order.

# Execution of the Order.

- 15.—(1.) The Local Authority of each district mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall carry into effect this Order within that District, and shall appoint such Inspectors or other officers for that purpose as may be necessary.
- (2.) For the purposes of this Order a notice shall be deemed to be served on a person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there, and a notice or other document purporting to be signed by the clerk of a Local Authority shall be prima facie evidence that it was signed by him and duly authorised by the Local Authority.

#### Revocation of Orders.

- 16.—(1.) The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked; provided that such revocation shall not—
  - (i.) affect the previous operation of the Order so revoked or anything duly done or suffered under that Order; or
  - (ii.) affect any right, privilege, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred under that Order; or
  - (iii.) affect any penalty incurred in respect of any offence committed against that Order; or
  - (iv.) affect any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, or penalty as aforesaid;


and any such investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed, as if the revoking Order had not been made. (2.) Every notice served under the Order hereby revoked shall after the commencement of this Order have effect as regards the area defined therein as if it were a notice under Article 6, the area so defined were "infected premises," and the thirty-first day of January, nineteen hundred and eight, were specified as the date within which the requirements of paragraph (a) of Article 6 must be complied with.

#### Commencement.

17. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and seven.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

# Further Contraction of Application of Berkshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1907.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Berkshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1907, herein referred to as the principal Order, shall apply only to the Areas described in the Schedule hereto, which are hereby declared to be separate Swine-Fever Infected Areas for the purposes of that Order.

#### Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the sixteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and seven.

#### Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the Berkshirk (Swine-Fever) Order of 1907 (No. 3), and shall be read as one with the principal Order.
