TEMPORARY ORDER of the Local Government Board: Relief to able-bodied Men, their Wives and Families:—

PARISH OF SAINT MARY, ISLINGTON.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Mary, Islington;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order, dated the 1st day of January, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Parish of Saint Mary, Islington, the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of outdoor relief to poor persons in the said Parish; And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Parish:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

Article I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Mary, Islington, may, after not

less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

Article II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the Workhouse the wife and family of any able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse.

(2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the Workhouse, shall not be absent from the Workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for a period exceeding twelve hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians.

(3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the Workhouse without any contravention of subdivision (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the Workhouse, without being set to work during the time, or any part of the time, of his absence.

Article III.—This Order shall operate and have effect until the thirtieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 13th December, 1907.)

Whereas by the twenty-first section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-Districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient, in the interest of public convenience, that the following alterations should be made in the constitution of Sub-Districts of Kings Norton Registration District, viz.:—(a) that the Civil Parish of Balsall Heath (Balsall Heath Ward of the City of Birmingham) should be detached from Kings Norton Sub-District, and be created a separate Sub-District, to be called and known as Balsall Heath Sub-District; (b) that the Civil Parish of Harborne (the part of Edgbaston and Harborne Ward of the City of Birmingham included in Kings Norton Registration District) should be transferred from Harborne Sub-District to Edgbaston Sub-District; and (c) that the reduced Sub-District of Harborne, which would consist of Smethwick Civil Parish and County Borough, should be renamed Smethwick Sub-District.

2. Now, therefore, I, Sir William Cospatrick Dunbar, Bart., C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on first day of January, nineteen hundred and eight.

THAMES RIVER STEAMBOAT SERVICE
ACT, 1904 (AMENDMENT).

(Amendment of the Thames River Steamboat Service Act, 1904, with respect to the Tolls, Rates, and Charges to be taken at the Piers of the London County Council; Amount of such Tolls, Rates, and Charges; Remedies for Recovery; By-Laws; Arrangements as to and Abatements from Tolls, Rates, and Charges; Confirmation of Agreements; Application of Provisions of Thames River Steamboat Service Act, 1904, and other Acts; Repeal and Amendment of Acts; General and incidental Provisions.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that the London County Council (in this notice called "the Council") intend to apply to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill for the purposes, or some of the purposes, hereinafter mentioned, viz:—

To amend the provisions of the Thames River Steamboat Service Act, 1904 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1904"), with respect to the tolls, rates, and charges to be taken for or in respect of the user of the piers and landing-places for the time being of the Council by empowering the Council to demand, take, and recover tolls, rates, and charges in respect of boats and vessels of every class or description calling at any pier or landing place belonging or leased to or worked or controlled by the Council on the River Thames for the purpose of landing or embarking passengers and other persons and goods, and in respect of all passengers, persons, and goods so landed or embarked, and otherwise in respect of such user.

To prescribe and fix or provide for the prescribing and fixing by by-laws or otherwise of the amount or maximum amount of such tolls, rates, and charges as aforesaid, and to provide for the increase and reduction from time to time of such amounts or maximum amounts.

To confer upon the Council and their officers and servants all such powers as may be deemed necessary or expedient for securing the payment to and recovery by the Council or any such officer or servant of any tolls, rates or charges payable under the intended Act, including, if thought fit, powers to seize and detain boats and vessels and any goods or articles thereon, and to detain on and sell boats, vessels and any such goods or articles.

To empower the Council to make, and from time to time vary and rescind, and to enforce by

penalties or otherwise, by-laws with respect to such tolls, rates and charges as aforesaid, and the amount, collection, recovery and application thereof, and with respect to other matters incidental to or connected with the objects of the Bill, and to make provisions for and with respect to the confirmation, publication and proof of any such by-laws.

To empower the Council and any other body, company, or person to enter into and carry into effect agreements and arrangements with respect to the intended tolls, rates, and charges, and the collection, recovery, and payment thereof, and to confirm and give effect to any such agreements which may have been or may be entered into, and to authorize the Council to make or allow abatements or reductions from tolls, rates, and charges.

To apply to and with respect to the provisions of the intended Act, and any by-laws made thereunder, all or any of the provisions of the Act of 1904, relating to tolls, rates, and charges, and the collection and recovery thereof, and to extend, restrict, or otherwise alter to such extent (if any) as may be defined in the Bill, the said last mentioned provisions, or any of them, and to make further or other provisions with respect to the subject matter thereof.

To extend and apply to and with respect to the provisions of the intended Act, and any such by-laws as aforesaid, such (if any) of the provisions of the Thames Conservancy Act, 1894, and any other Act or Acts relating to the Conservators of the River Thames, and of the Act 6 and 7 William IV, cap. cxxviii, and any other Act or Acts relating to the Greenwich Pier Company or their Undertaking as may be deemed necessary or expedient.

To make all such other provisions as may be deemed necessary or expedient with respect to or incidental to the intended Act, or for better securing the objects thereof.

To provide that the costs and expenses of and incidental to the applying for and obtaining of the intended Act (except so far as they may be otherwise provided for) shall be defrayed as payments for general county purposes within the meaning of "The Local Government Act, 1888."

The Bill will or may, so far as may be necessary or expedient for the purposes of the intended Act, repeal, alter, extend or amend all or any of the provisions of the Act of 1904, and any other Act or Acts relating to the Council, or to the piers and landing places on the River Thames belonging, or leased to, or worked or controlled by them; the Thames Conservancy Act, 1894, and any other Act or Acts relating to the Conservators of the River Thames, or to the piers and landing places on that river owned, leased, worked, or controlled by the said Conservators; the Act 6 and 7 William IV, cap. cxxviii, and any other Act or Acts relating to the Greenwich Pier Company or to Greenwich Pier, or otherwise to the Undertaking of the said Company.

The Bill will vary and extinguish all such rights and privileges as will interfere with any of the objects hereinbefore mentioned.

Printed copies of the proposed Bill will, on the 17th day of December instant, be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.
