MALVERN HILLS.

(Enlarging the Powers of the Malvern Hills Conservators; Prohibiting Quarrying; Bye-Laws Regulating Quarrying; Amendment of Malvern Hills Act, 1884; Compensation; Further Powers to Board of Agriculture; Voluntary Subscriptions; Incorporation, Amendment, and Repeal of Acts).

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill for the following purposes, or some of them, that is to say:—

1. To enlarge the powers of the Malvern Hills Conservators (in this Notice referred to as the Conservators) for the preservation of the Malvern Hills, and to define what is included in the expression "the Malvern Hills."

2. To prohibit quarrying on any part of the Malvern Hills in any manner that may prove to be a temporary or permanent disfigurement of the same.

3. To empower the Conservators to make and enforce bye-laws for regulating the operation of quarrying on any part of the Malvern Hills so far as may be necessary or expedient for the purpose of preserving, securing, and enforcing the right of the freeholders and tenants and commoners to take their common of pasture and common of estovers in pursuance of the decree of the Court of Exchequer confirmed by the Act of 16 Charles II.

4. To alter, amend, or in part repeal the Malvern Hills Act, 1884, and to extend the provisions of section 25 of that Act so as to make those provisions applicable not only to future extensions of existing quarries as well as to new quarries.

5. To make provision for the payment if so required by Parliament of compensation to any persons who may be injuriously affected by any such prohibition against quarrying, and to provide for the raising of the necessary funds for paying such compensation.

6. To empower the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries on the application of the Conservators, and after holding a local inquiry, to order that quarrying shall cease in any existing quarries with power to the Board to award compensation therefor, and to provide for the raising of such compensation and the application thereof.

7. To empower the Conservators to receive voluntary subscriptions from bodies and persons for the preservation of the Malvern Hills, and to provide for the application of the moneys so subscribed.

8. To incorporate with the Bill with or without variation or modification, all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Inclosure Acts, 1845 to 1882, the Commons Act, 1899, and the Open Spaces Act, 1906.

Printed copies of the Bill will be deposited at the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons, on or before the 17th day of December, 1907.
