

scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Handley Carr Glyn, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Luke, Pallion, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Mary Magdalene, Millfield.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or any of them or any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Mary Magdalene, Millfield, being:—

"All that part of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Luke, Pallion, in the county of Durham, and in the diocese of Durham, which is bounded upon the south partly by an isolated portion of the parish of Bishopwearmouth, and partly by the new parish of Saint Mark, Millfield, upon the east by the new parish of Saint Andrew, Deptford, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the north-west, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Deptford, from the said new parish of Saint Luke, Pallion, at the centre of the level-crossing where the line of the Lambton Railway intersects Lisburn-terrace, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of Railway-street, and extending thence first south-eastward to the middle of Railway-street (thereby crossing the Painshaw branch line of the North Eastern Railway) and then south-eastward along the middle of Railway-street for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its junction with East Moor-road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of East Moor-road for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway running between the houses on the eastern side of Brady-street and the houses on the western side of Rutland-street, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway running along the backs of the houses on the northern side of Dene-street, and extending thence westward along the middle of the last mentioned roadway for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway running along the backs of the houses on the eastern side of Saint Luke's-terrace and of Peacock-street West, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last

mentioned roadway for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hylton-road West, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Luke, Pallion, from the said isolated portion of the parish of Bishopwearmouth."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the cure out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the seventh day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Michael and All Angels, Beckenham, situate in the parish of Beckenham, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Michael and All Angels, Beckenham, situate as aforesaid.
