FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1901 AND 1907.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 3 (3) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that on the 26th December, 1907, he made the following Orders:—

1. An Order under section 151 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, as amended by the Factory and Workshop Act, 1907, allowing, subject to conditions, separate departments of work in factories and workshops which are laundries to be treated as separate factories or workshops so far as regards the period of employment of women, young persons and children.

2. An Order under section 36 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, as amended by the Factory and Workshop Act, 1907, (a) allowing, subject to conditions, the period of employment for women and young persons to begin at 9 a.m. and end at 9 p.m. in laundries in the county of London and in certain adjacent districts; and (b) revoking and re-enacting the Order of 24th July, 1906.

3. An Order under section 43 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, as amended by the Factory and Workshop Act, 1907, (a) authorizing the substitution of some other day for Saturday as the weekly half-holiday in laundries, and (b) revoking and re-enacting (with the omission of dressing floors, tin-streams, china clay pits and quarries in Cornwall) the Order of 20th December, 1882.

THE LIMITED PARTNERSHIPS RULES, 1907.

Made pursuant to Section 17 of the Limited Partnerships Act, 1907.

1. "The Act" means the Limited Partnerships Act, 1907.

2. Whenever any act is by the Act directed to be done to or by the Registrar such act shall be done in England to or by the Registrar of Joint Stock Companies or in his absence to or by such person as the Board of Trade may for the time being authorize; in Scotland to or by the existing Registrar of Joint Stock Companies in Scotland; and in Ireland to or by the existing Assistant-Registrar of Joint Stock Companies for Ireland or by such person as the Board of Trade may for the time being authorize in Scotland or Ireland in the absence of the Registrar; but in the event of the Board of Trade altering the constitution of the existing Joint Stock Companies Registry Office such act shall be done to or by such officer or officers and at such place or places with reference to the local situation of the principal place of business of the limited partnership to be registered as the Board of Trade may appoint.

3. The fees to be paid to the Registrar under the Act shall be as follow:—

- (a.) On the original registration of a limited partnership the sum of two pounds.
 - (b.) On the registration of a statement of any change within the meaning of Section 9 (1) of the Act occurring during the continuance of a limited partnership the sum of five shillings.
 - (c.) By any person inspecting the statements filed by the Registrar in the Register Office the sum of one shilling for each inspection.
 - (d.) By any person requiring a Certificate of the registration of any limited partnership or a certified copy of or extract from any registered statement the sum of two shillings for each certificate and for such certified copy or extract the sum of sixpence for each folio of seventy-two words or in Scotland for each sheet of two hundred words.
4. The forms in the Appendix hereto with such variations as the circumstances of each case may require shall be the forms to be used for the purposes of the Act.

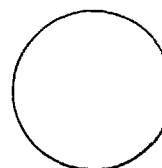

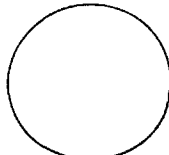

THE MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.
County of Surrey.

TEMPORARY ORDER of the Local Government Board: Relief to able-bodied Men, their Wives and Families:—

PARISH OF FULHAM.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Fulham;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order, dated the 14th day of December, 1852, which is in force in the Parish of Fulham, the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of outdoor relief to poor persons;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard

to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Parish:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

Article I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Fulham may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

Article II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the Workhouse the wife and family of any able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse.

(2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the Workhouse, shall not be absent from the Workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for a period exceeding twelve hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians.

(3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the Workhouse without any contravention of subdivision (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the Workhouse, without being set to work during the time, or any part of the time, of his absence.

Article III.—This Order shall operate and have effect until the thirtieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board; The Margarine Act, 1887, The Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1899, and The Butter and Margarine Act, 1907: Butter and Milk-blended Butter: Registration of Factories and Premises:—

To the Owners and Occupiers for the time being of Butter Factories, and of Premises on which there is manufactured Milk-blended Butter, and to the Wholesale Dealers in Milk-blended Butter in England and Wales:—

To the several Local Authorities under the Margarine Act, 1887, the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1899, and the Butter and Margarine Act, 1907, for the time being in England and Wales;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Section 9 of the Margarine Act, 1887 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of

1887"), as extended by Section 7 of the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1899 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1899"), provision was made for the registration of every manufactory of margarine and of all premises wherein the manufacture of margarine or the business of a wholesale dealer in margarine is carried on in England and Wales with the local authority from time to time in such manner as We, the Local Government Board, might direct;

And whereas by Section 1 of the Butter and Margarine Act, 1907 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1907"), it is enacted that the provision aforesaid shall apply to butter factories and to any premises on which milk-blended butter is manufactured, or on which the business of a wholesale dealer in milk-blended butter is carried on:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby Order and direct as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—Every owner or occupier of a butter factory or of premises on which there is manufactured any milk-blended butter, or on which there is carried on the business of a wholesale dealer in milk-blended butter in England and Wales who shall make application to the proper local authority for a Certificate of Registration under the Act of 1887 as amended by the Act of 1899 and the Act of 1907, shall, in his application, state the following particulars:—

(a.) The name and address of the owner or occupier making the application;

(b.) The situation of the factory, or of the premises on which the manufacture, or the business of the wholesale dealer, is carried on;

(c.) The name and address, or names and addresses, of the owner or owners, or occupier or occupiers, or wholesale dealer or dealers, carrying on the manufacture or the business;

(d.) Whether the premises are proposed to be registered as—

(i) a butter factory; or

(ii) premises on which there is manufactured any milk-blended butter; or

(iii) premises on which there is carried on the business of a wholesale dealer in milk-blended butter.

The application shall be signed by the person making the same, or by someone acting on his behalf.

ARTICLE II.—If the application is in due form, the local authority shall cause the factory, or the premises, as the case may be, to be registered by entering in a book the particulars of the application for registration; and thereupon a Certificate, in the Form A set forth in the Schedule hereto, shall be issued by the local authority to the person applying for the same.

ARTICLE III.—Where any change occurs in the persons carrying on the manufacture, or the business, written notice thereof shall be given by the owner or occupier of the butter factory, or of the premises on which the manufacture of milk-blended butter or the business of a wholesale dealer in milk-blended butter, as the case may be, is carried on, to the local authority, and the Register shall thereupon be amended by making therein the requisite alteration, and an endorsement shall be made by the local authority on the Certificate in accordance with the Form B set forth in the said Schedule.

FORM A.

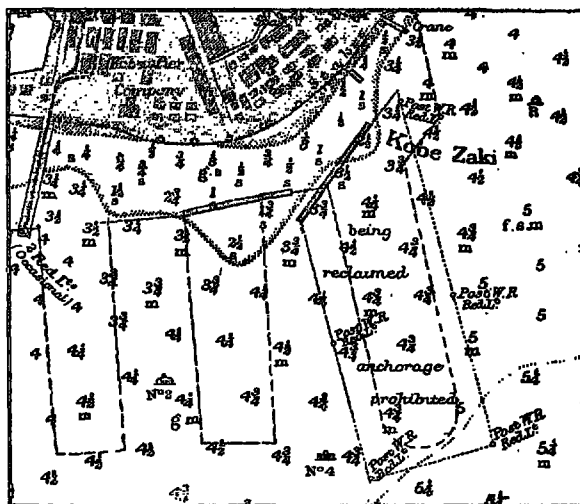
