THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

SPALDING SEPTEMBER FAIR.

Whereas on the 26th November, 1907, a representation was made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Spalding Urban District Council to the effect that a Fair has been held annually at Spalding on the 25th day of September, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should in future be held on the last Tuesday in September:

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when the same would be taken into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of the Fairs Act, 1873:

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should in future be held annually on the last Tuesday in September:

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Fairs Act, 1873, do hereby order that the Fair which has been held annually at Spalding on the 25th day of September shall in future be held annually on the last Tuesday in September.

THE MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

County of Kesteven.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

And whereas the County Council of Kesteven have made application to the Local Government

Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the following portion of a road in the parish of Colsterworth, that is to say:—So much of the Great North-road (including High-street, Colsterworth) as extends from a point in the said road, situate 3 furlongs and 30 yards north of its junction with New-road to a point in the said Great North-road, situate 1 furlong and 59 yards south of its junction with that road:

ISLE OF WIGHT (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER
OF 1908.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Article 8 of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 (*Regulation of Sales in Infected Area*) shall not apply to any market or sale held in a market or saleyard in the administrative county of the Isle of Wight (in this Order referred to as "the Infected Area").

Movement without Declaration for Immediate Slaughter.

2.—(1.) Swine may be moved from any market, saleyard, farm or other premises in the Infected Area to a bacon factory or slaughter-house, or to a market or saleyard specially authorised by the Local Authority of the District under Article 5 of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises are from which the swine are to be moved, and subject to the following conditions, namely:

- (i.) The swine shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (ii.) During the movement the swine shall, except while being moved by railway or vessel, be conveyed in a float, cart or van, and the swine shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked in manner prescribed by this Article.
- (iii.) Swine moved under this Article to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article authorising movement of swine from premises other than a market or saleyard to which the swine have been moved with a licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign and deliver or send by post to the Inspector a declaration in the Form U set forth in the Schedule to such last mentioned Order or to the like effect.

(3.) Every person to whom application is made for a licence shall, so far as is practicable, before granting the same, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the declaration (if any), and that the proposed movement is necessary or expedient.

(4.) The declaration (if any) shall be retained by the person granting the licence and disposed of by him as may be directed by the Local Authority on whose behalf the licence was granted.

(5.) A copy of a licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place of destination specified in the licence.

(6.) No licence under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 shall be required for the movement into a Scheduled Area of swine which are being moved with a licence under this Order.

(7.) Swine while being moved with a licence under this Article shall not be subject to any Regulations made by a Local Authority as to movement of swine into or within their District.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

3.—(1.) Where swine are moved from premises in the Infected Area to a market or saleyard, the licence authorising such movement shall be delivered up in exchange for the licence for movement of the swine from such premises.

(2.) Where swine are moved from premises in the Infected Area to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, the licence authorising such movement shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

General Provisions as to Movement.

4.—(1.) Swine, while being moved under this Order, shall be moved from the premises from which they are by the licence authorised to be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.

(2.) No licence granted under this Order shall have the effect of authorising movement of swine which are in a Swine-Fever Infected Place or of swine the movement of which is prohibited by notice given by an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Offences.

5.—(1.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved under this Order, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person fail to deliver up or send a licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig for the purposes of this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

6. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

- “Bacon factory” means premises in which the business of a curer of bacon is carried on:
 “Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered:
 “Board” means Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
 “Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of January, nineteen hundred and eight.

8. This Order may be cited as the ISLE OF WIGHT (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1908.

MITCHAM AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1908.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Premises to which this Order applies.

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the First Schedule hereto, and also to any premises in the administrative county of Surrey to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

(2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.

Restriction on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being

prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved with a Movement Licence, in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect, granted by a member of the Metropolitan Police Force from any premises to which this Order applies to a bacon factory or slaughter-house or to the corporation market, Birmingham, and swine so moved to that market will thereupon become subject to the provisions of the Birmingham (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906 as to marking, and as to movement with Licence to a bacon factory or slaughter-house, which affect all swine exposed at that market.

(2.) The Licence granted under this Article shall be in force for not more than six days inclusive of the day of issue.

(3.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(4.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and shall after their arrival at a bacon factory or slaughter-house be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(5.) A copy of every Licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the person granting the same to the Local Authority of the District wherein the place of destination of the swine is situate.

(6.) Swine moved with a Licence under this Article shall not be subject to any restriction on movement of swine imposed by Order of the Board or by regulations made by the Local Authority of any District.

Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

4.—(1.) The restriction on movement of swine imposed by Article 2 shall not extend to the movement of swine to any premises to which this Order applies if the swine are accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement, in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect, granted by a member of the Metropolitan Police Force.

(2.) Before a Licence is granted under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the person to whom application is made for the grant of a Licence a declaration countersigned as hereinafter provided, in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect; Provided that this provision shall not apply to swine moved from premises in the administrative county of Surrey.

(3.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(4.) The declaration shall be retained by the person granting the Licence thereon.

(5.) The Licence shall be in force for six days, inclusive of the day of issue.

(6.) Swine moved with a Licence under this Article shall not be subject to any Regulations made by the Surrey County Council relating to movement of swine into or within their District.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

5. Licences under this Order for the movement of swine shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

7. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority, who shall also provide and supply, without charge, printed forms requisite hereunder.

Offences.

8.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a pig is not slaughtered as required by this Order, the person to whom the Licence is granted, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a licence as required by this Order, he shall be

deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

9. In this Order—

“Bacon factory” means premises in which the business of a curer of bacon is carried on :

“Slaughter-house” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered :

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector :

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries :

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

10. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of January, nineteen hundred and eight.

The swine must be accompanied by this Licence, and be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay. If the place of destination specified in this Licence is a bacon-factory or slaughterhouse the swine must be there detained until they are slaughtered.
