WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East Suffolk) Order, 1908.

Dated 16th January, 1908.

of the reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the House of Commons to by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, issue his Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown and upon application by the County Council of

hereby make the following Order :-

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East Suffolk) Order, 1908."

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of East Suffolk to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included. in the Schedule to the Act:

Avocet, Turtle Dove, Great Bustard, Little Bustard, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough-Legged Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Crossbill, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, House Martin, Sand Martin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Kentish Plover, Kedstart, Robin, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackeap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser White-throat, Coldon and Warn Warnesh (Cuelcoid throat, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Close Time extended.

III. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds (other than Snipe and Wild Duck) is prohibited within the Administrative County of East Suffolk, shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February and the first day of September in any year, the close time for Snipe and Wild Duck remaining as fixed by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, namely, between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August in any year.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following the killing or taking of the following kinds of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of East Suffolk :-

Avocet, Bittern, Black-headed Bunting (Reed Sparrow), Cirl Bunting, Common (or Corn) Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Great Bustard, Little Bustard, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough-Legged Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Cuckoo, Stone Curlew (Thick-knee, Thickkneed Bustard), Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Hobby, Kingfisher, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Barn Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny Owl, Redstart, Robin, Spoonbill, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Long-tailed Tit, Grey Waztail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

All Birds Protected on Sundays within a certain Arin.

V. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March

STOUR AND ORWELL.

A line drawn straight from the Tower, in Walton-on-the-Naze, in the county of Essex, to the seaward extremity of Landguard Point, in the county of Suffolk.

Provided that nothing in the said Order shall apply to any wild duck decoy, for the time being used as such, or any pond used in connection therewith, in the said portion of the said Administrative County or in any of the foregoing parishes.

Repeal of former Order.

The Order of the 3rd January, 1908, is hereby repealed.

TEMPORARY ORDER of the Local Government Board: Relief to able-bodied Men, their Wives and Families:—

PARISH OF POPLAR BOROUGH.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Poplar Borough;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order, dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Poplar Union (now known as the Parish of Poplar Borough), the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations applicable to the administration of outdoor relief to poor persons in the said Parish;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Parish:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

Article I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Poplar Borough may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

Article II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the Workhouse the wife and family of any ablebodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse.

- (2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the Workhouse, shall not be absent from the Workhouse for periods amounting in the aggregate to more than forty-eight hours in any four consecutive weeks, nor without the consent of the Guardians.
- (3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the Workhouse without any contravention of subdivision (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the Workhouse, without being set to work during the time, or any part of the time, of his absence.

Article III.—This Order shall operate and have effect until the thirtieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

THE MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

County of Carnarvon.

HEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

And whereas the County Council of Carnarvon have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the following roads or parts of roads within the urban district of Criccieth, that is to say:—High-street, comprising so much of the main road leading from Portmadoc to Pwllheli as is situate within the urban district; the road leading from High-street past the White Lion Hotel to the Carnarvon-road; Carnarvon-road, extending from its junction with High-street to the boundary of the urban district; the road extending from High-street at its junction with Carnarvon-road to the Cambrian Railway; Lôa Moch, extending from its junction with Castle-street to the Cambrian Railway; Castle-street; Marine-crescent; Marine-terrace; West Parade; Lôn Fêl.
