##### Emigrant Ships.

Notice revoking the Dietary Scale for Passenger Ships, dated April 26th, 1856.

Whereas by section 37 of the Passengers Act, 1855, the Emigration Commissioners were empowered to prescribe dietary scales for use on passenger ships, and a dietary scale was prescribed by the Emigration Commissioners on the 26th April, 1856, and published in the London Gazette of 29th April, 1856;

And whereas by section 5 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1872, the powers and duties of the Emigration Commissioners were transferred to the Board of Trade, and the provisions of section 37 of the Passengers Act, 1855, have been re-enacted in section 298 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894;

And whereas a dietary scale, which is dated 2nd January, 1908, and will come in force on the 1st February, 1908, has been prescribed by the Board of Trade under the provisions of section 17 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and it

is expedient that the scale dated 26th April, 1856, should be revoked:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade hereby revoke, as from the 1st February, 1908, the dietary scale dated 26th April, 1856.

#### THE MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

County of Hertford.

WHEREAS by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 21ST JANUARY 1908.)

NEWPORT ALLOTMENT GARDENS  
(SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1908.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

*Premises to which this Order applies.*

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the county borough of Newport to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the county borough and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

(2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the said Local Authority.

*Restriction on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.*

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

*Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.*

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies in a suitable vehicle to a slaughter-house situate in the county borough of Newport, for the purpose of immediate slaughter with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of that county borough, which Licence shall be in force for not more than two days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the slaughter-house to which the swine are to be moved.

(2.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(3.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and shall be slaughtered after their arrival at the slaughter-house, without unnecessary delay.

*Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicle used for Movement of Swine.*

4.—(1.) Any vehicle which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding

Article, shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the owner of the vehicle as follows :

(i.) The floor of the vehicle and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom ; then

(ii.) The same parts of the vehicle shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water ; then

(iii.) The same parts of the vehicle shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

*Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.*

5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of the county borough of Newport, which Licence shall be in force for not more than six days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the place and premises to which the swine are to be moved, and shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the swine or of his agent authorised in writing for this purpose to the following effect—

(a.) that the swine to be moved have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence ;

(b.) that the swine are not affected with swine-fever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever ; and

(c.) that the swine are not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(2.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

(3.) The declaration as to swine to be moved shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the Licence thereon.

*Production of Licences ; Names and Addresses.*

6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other

officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

7. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

8.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any vehicle used for the movement of swine, the owner, or other person for the time being in charge of the vehicle, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a pig is not slaughtered as required by this Order, the person to whom the Licence is granted, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

9. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“Swine-Fever Infected Place” means a place for the time being declared to be infected with swine-fever under any Order of the Board:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

*Commencement.*

10. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of January, nineteen hundred and eight.

*Short Title.*

11. This Order may be cited as the NEWPORT ALLOTMENT GARDENS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1908.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.**

(DATED 22ND JANUARY 1908.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Provision for Movement through Scheduled Area.*

The following provisions of this Order are hereby substituted for Article 2 of the Order of the Board dated the 1st day of November, 1906, relating to the Scheduled Area described in the Schedule hereto, which Article is hereby revoked:—

Swine shall not be deemed to be moved into the Scheduled Area where they are so moved for the purpose of transit to a place of destination outside the Area, provided that the movement is in accordance with the following conditions:—

- (i.) During the movement in the Scheduled Area the swine shall, except while being moved by railway or vessel, be conveyed in afloat, cart, or van.

- (ii.) The swine shall not within the Scheduled Area be removed from the float, van, or cart except for transit by railway, or be permitted to come in contact with other swine.
- (iii.) Where the movement is partly by railway and partly by road, the railway station at which the swine are to be removed from the float, van, or cart shall be specified in the licence, and the licence shall be available for transit by railway from such station only.
- (iv.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (v.) The swine shall be accompanied by the licence (if any) authorising the movement granted under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or if the movement is such that no such licence is available the swine shall be accompanied by a licence under this Article authorising the movement, which may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station specified

in the licence is situate, or if the movement is not to a railway station, then by an Inspector of the District in the Scheduled Area through which the swine enter the Area.

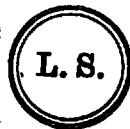
