The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the seventh day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the

England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a rectory) of Saint Botolph, Bishopsgate, in the city of London and in the diocese of London, between that benefice and a certain other benefice namely the benefice (being a rectory) of (brist namely the benefice (being a rectory) of Christ Church, Spitalfields, which said last named benefice is situate in the county of Middlesex and in the said diocese of London.

"Whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of London is the Patron in right of his See of the said benefice of Saint Botolph, Bishopsgate, and also of the said benefice of Christ Church, Spitalfields.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said benefice of Christ Church, Spitalfields, is at present insufficiently endowed and that the said benefice of Saint Botolph, Bishopsgate, has endowments of such an amount as that after the charge hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been placed

At the Court at Windsor Castle, the 25th day | upon the same endowments, the said benefice January, 1908. of Saint Botolph, Bishopsgate, will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said diocese of London, has represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the parish of Christ Church, Spitalfields, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Saint Botolph, Bishopsgate, which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Saint Botolph, Bishopsgate, is now full.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, acting as Archbishop of the province within which each of the said two benefices is situate, and with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said diucese of London, acting as such Bishop and also as the Patron in right of his See of each of the said two benefices as aforesaid (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have signed this scheme and have respectively sealed the same with their archi-episcopal and episcopal seals) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and as from the day of the date at which the said benefice of Saint Botolph, Bishopsgate, shall from whatsoever cause be next avoided, all the tithe rent charges, glebe lands and all other (if any) the endowments which shall at the date of the next avoidance of the said benefice of Saint Botolph, Bishopsgate, or which may thereafter belong to the same benefice shall be charged and for ever thereafter be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Christ Church, Spitalfields, with the annual sum or yearly charge hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, a clear annual sum or yearly charge of two hundred and fifty pounds the same annual sum or yearly charge of two hundred and fifty pounds to be as from the day aforesaid due and payable to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Christ Church, Spitalfields, and the same annual sum or yearly charge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the benefice of Christ Church, Spitalfields, or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year.

in every year. "And we further recommend and propose that the Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Christ Church, Spitalfields, shall have the following powers for recovering the said rent charge of two hundred and fifty pounds per annum hereby proposed to be created in favour of the benefice of which he is Incumbent as aforesaid (that is to say) power, if and whenever any part of the said rent charge shall at any time be unpaid for twenty-one days after any of the times appointed for the payment thereof (although there shall not have been any legal demand made thereof) to enter into the receipt of the endowments charged therewith or any part thereof and to receive and take the same until he shall thereby or otherwise be paid and satisfied the same rent charge and the arrears thereof due at the time of such entry or afterwards to become due during his being in possession of the same premises together with all costs and expenses occasioned by the nonpayment thereof and for the purpose of collecting receiving and recovering such endowments or any of them to use exercise and enjoy all such powers and remedies for collecting, recovering and enforcing payment thereof and of the annual sums payable for or towards the raising or making up the same as may be statutably exercised or exercisable by him under the law then in force.

"Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Saint Botolph, Bishopsgate, shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey and annex to the said benefice of Uhrist Uhurch, Spitalfields, any part or parts of the rectorial endowments belonging to the said benefice of Saint Botolph, Bishopsgate, which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of London for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said yearly charge of two hundred and fifty pounds hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid, then the same annual sum or yearly charge of two hundred and fifty pounds shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and determine and be no longer payable as hereinbefore recommended and proposed.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirtynine and of the Acts therein mentioned that is to say the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-first day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, that is to say :—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirtythird and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared aud now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Baydon, in the county of Wilts and in the diocese of Salisbury.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Baydon, is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in William Lehman Ashmead Bartlett Burdett-Coutts, of Number one, Stratton-street, in the city of Westminster, Esquire, a Member of the Commons' House of Parliament.

"And whereas the said William Lehman Ashmead Bartlett Burdett-Coutts is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Baydon now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Salisbury.

"And whereas the Right Reverend John, now Bishop of Salisbury, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said John, Bishop of Salisbury, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned. "And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Baydon, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish or chapelry of Baydon.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said William Lehman Ashmead Bartlett Burdett-Coutts (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said John, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Baydon now vested in him the said William Lehman Ashmead Bartlett Burdett-Coutts as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said John, Bishop of Salisbury, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said John, Bishop of Salisbury, and by his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Salisbury.

"Whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln is the Patron in right of his See of the said benefice of Algarkirk, and of the said benefice of Saint Paul, West Marsh, Great Grimsby.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said benefice of Saint Paul, West Marsh, Great Grimsby, is at present insufficiently endowed, and that the said benefice of Algarkirk has endowments of such an amount as that after the apportionment hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been made, the said benefice of Algarkirk will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, are of opinion that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the new parish of Saint Paul, West Marsh, Great Grimsby, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Algarkirk which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Algarkirk is now full.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, acting as Archbishop of the province within which each of the said two benefices is situate (in testimony of which consent he has signed this scheme, and sealed the same with his archiepiscopal seal), and with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln, acting as such Bishop and also as the Patron in right of his See of each of the said two benefices as aforesaid (in testimony of which consent he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme, and any duly Gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and as from the day on which, from whatsoever cause, the said benefice of Algarkirk shall next be avoided the following apportionment of the income of the same benefice shall take place, that is to say, all the glebe lands which may then belong, or which thereafter may belong to the said benefice of Algarkirk, shall be charged and for ever thereafter chargeable in favour of the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Saint Paul, West Marsh, Great Grimsby, with one clear annual sum or yearly rent charge of one hundred and twenty pounds, such clear annual sum or yearly rent charge to be due and payable to the Vicar or Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Paul, West Marsh, Great Grimsby, and to be apportionable between any outgoing Vicar or Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Paul, West Marsh, Great Grimsby, or his representatives on the one hand, and his successor in the same incumbency on the other hand, and to be receivable by the Vicar or Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid, by equal half-yearly payments, upon the first day of May and upon the first day of November in every year.

"And we further recommend and propose that the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Saint Paul, West Marsh, Great Grimsby, shall have the following powers for recovering the said annual sum or yearly charge of one hundred and twenty pounds, that is to say, power if and whenever any part of the said annual sum or yearly charge of one hundred and twenty pounds shall at any time be unpaid for twenty-eight days after any of the times appointed for the payment thereof, to enter into the receipt of the endowments charged there-with, or any part thereof, and to receive and take the same until he shall thereby or otherwise be paid and satisfied the same rent charge and the arrears thereof due at the time of such entry, or afterwards to become due during his being in possession of the same premises, together with all costs and expenses occasioned by the non-payment thereof, and for the purpose of collecting, receiving, and recovering such endowments, or any of them, to use, exercise, and enjoy all such powers and remedies for collecting, recovering, and enforcing payment thereof as may be statutably exercised or exercised by him under the low them in former. exercisable by him under the law then in force.

"Provided always that none of the powers aforesaid shall be exercised by or on behalf of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Paul, West Marsh, Great Grimsby, until the expiration of twenty-one clear days at the least after a written notice demanding payment of the sum then in arrear shall have been left at the last known residence of the Incumbent of the said benefice of Algarkirk, which written notice nevertheless the said Vicar or Incumbent of the benefice of Saint Paul, West Marsh, Great Grimsby, shall be at liberty to leave as aforesaid, at any time after the expiration of the first seven days of the twenty-eight days aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lincoln.

date the twelfth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say :---

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain properties in the parish of Billingham, in the county of Durham, now vested in us.

"Whereas under and by virtue of a certain indenture bearing date the sixteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, made between Robert Nigel Fitzhardinge Kingscote, C.B., a Colonel in Her said late Majesty's Army a Commissioner of Her said late Majesty's Woods Forests and Land Revenues of the first part the Tees Conservancy Commissioners of the second part and us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the third part two pieces or parcels of land situate in the parish of Billingham in the county of Durham, being the pieces or parcels of land numbered 7 and 9 on the map or plan annexed to the said indenture and comprising twenty-seven acres one rood and twenty-nine perches or thereabouts became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us.

"And whereas under and by virtue of a certain other indenture bearing date the twenty second day of March, one thousand nine hundred and four, made between John Francis Fortescue Horner Esquire a Commissioner of Woods in charge of the Land Revenues of the Crown in the counties of Durham and York of the first part the Tees Conservancy Commissioners of the second part and us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the third part two pieces or parcels of land situate in the parish of Billing-ham in the county of Durham being the pieces or parcels of land delineated and coloured red on the map or plan annexed to the said indenture and containing five acres one rood and twentyone perches and one-half of another perch or thereabouts became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us.

"And whereas the said lands are not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant, but are now in possession, but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation, are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same, or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said lands or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorised and empowered by instrument or instruments, in writing, duly executed according to law from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of ,the said Act all or any part of the said lands so vested in us as aforesaid, with their appurtenances and all our estate right title and interest thereiu or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his her or their heirs executors administrators or assigns or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and enquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands tithes rent charges tenements or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Durham.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the ninetcenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-first day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say :--

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and tweutieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the parish of Llantwit - juxta - Neath, in the county of Glamorgan, and in the diocese of Llandaff.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said parish of Llantwit-juxta-Neath is a cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish of Llantwit-juxta-Neath which is hereinafter mentioned and

described should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship, but there is an unconsecrated building known as the church of Saint Anne, situate at Tonna, within the limits of the said proposed district.

"And whereas Claudia Griffiths, late of Dylais Fach, near Neath, in the county of Glamorgan, Spinster, who departed this life on the fourth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, by her will dated the sixth day of September, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five and proved in the Principal Registry of the Probate Division of the High Court of Justice, on the eighteenth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, devised the said building known as the church of Saint Anne to James Benjamin Garsed Price, of Neath, Solicitor, the executor and trustee named in her said will, upon trust that if at any time during her life or within two years after her death that part of the parish of Llantwit-juxta-Neath in which the said building and certain other here-ditaments (also within the limits of the said proposed district) are situate, should either with or without any part of any adjoining parish by Order of Your Majesty in Council or otherwise be lawfully constituted a new or separate parish or district for ecclesiastical purposes and if thereupon provision should be made for vesting the patronage or right of presentation of or to the church of such new or separate parish or district in manner therein mentioned (being as hereinafter recommended and proposed) that the said James Benjamin Garsed Price or other the trustee or trustees of the said will should assure the said building in such manner as that the same might be consecrated as and become the parish church of such new or separate parish or district as aforesaid.

"And whereas the said James Benjamin Garsed Price has agreed that upon any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme being duly made and Gazetted the said building known as the church of Saint Anne shall pursuant to the trust aforesaid be conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it is our intention that when conveyed as aforesaid and duly consecrated the said building shall become the church of the separate district which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said Claudia Griffiths did by her said will also direct that upon such new or separate parish or district being constituted and such provision for the patronage of the church thereof being made as hereinbefore mentioned her trustee or trustees should set apart the sum of ten thousand pounds free of duty to be paid and applied for or towards the endowment of the Minister or Incumbent thereof.

"And whereas the said James Benjamin Garsed Price has agreed that upon any Order in Council being made and Gazetted as aforesaid the said sum of ven thousand pounds shall pursuant to the said bequest be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to `the intent that the same may be applied for the purposes aforesaid.

"And whereas we are satisfied that by virtue of the said bequest an adequate and permanent maintenance will be available for the support of the Minister of the said proposed district and when the said district shall have become a new parish, then for the support of the Incumbent thereof.

"And whereas the persons nominated by the

said will of the said Claudia Griffiths as the persons to whom it is desired that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed separate district shall be assigned are the Venerable Frederick William Edmondes, the present Archdeacon of Llandaff, jointly with the said James Benjamin Garsed Price or other the trustee or trustees of the said will so long as any of the trusts thereof shall remain subsisting or if such trusts shall all have been fully executed in the lifetime of the said James Benjamin Garsed Price then jointly with the said James Benjamin Garsed Price during the remainder of his life and after his death and the full execution of the said trusts the Dean of the cathedral church of Llandaff and the Archdeacon of Llandaff and their respective successors jointly for ever.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Joshua Pritchard, now Bishop of Llandaff (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Llantwit-juxta-Neath which is more particularly described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Tonna.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof as well on the first appointment thereto as on any subsequent avoidance thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly Gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the following persons, that is to say, by the said Frederick William Edmondes together with the said James Benjamin Garsed Price or other the trustee or trustees of the said will until the trusts thereof shall have been fully executed and if the said Frederick William Edmondes shall die before the said trusts shall have been fully executed then by the said James Benjamin Garsed Price or other such trustee or trustees alone and when such trusts shall all have been fully executed in the lifetime of the said James Benjamin Garsed Price then by the said Edmoudes and Frederick William James Benjamin Garsed Price jointly or by the said James Benjamin Garsed Price after the death of the said Frederick William Edmondes during the rest of the life of the said James Benjamin Garsed Price and upon and after the death of the said James Benjamin Garsed Price and the full execution of the trusts of the said will, whichever shall last happen, by the Dean of the cathedral church of Llandaff and the Archdeacon of Llandaff and their respective successors jointly for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

# "The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Tonna, being :----

"All that part of the parish of Llantwit-juxta-Neath, in the county of Glamorgan, and in the diocese of Llandaff, which is bounded upon the north-west by the parish of Cadoxton-juxta-Neath, upon the north, upon the north-east, and upon the south-east by the parish of Resolven, both in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Resolven from the said parish of Llantwitjuxta-Neath, at a point in the middle of the stream called Gwenffrwd opposite to the southern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 469 upon the Ordnance Map of the civil parish of Llantwit Lower, published in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninetynine, upon the scale of twenty-five inches to the mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this scheme from the close numbered 147 upon the said maps, and extending thence first northward to the said fence and then in various directions but principally towards the west along the fences which divide the said close numbered 469 and the closes numbered 470, 467, 466, 465, 464, 410, 424, 425, 404, and 396 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 147 and the closes numbered 149, 409, 406, 405, 403, and 398 upon the said maps for a distance of one mile and twelve chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 396 from the said close numbered 398 reaches the eastern side of the road leading to Neath, and extending thence south-westward in a straight line for a distance of twenty-three yards or thereabouts (thereby crossing the said road obliquely) to the eastern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 395 upon the said maps from the close numbered 397 upon the said maps, and extending thence in various directions but principally towards the west along the fences which divide the said close numbered 395, and the closes numbered 390, 389, 386, 379, 378, 380, 374, 373, 372, 362, and 295 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 397 and 377, 376, the closes numbered 288, 290, and 291 375 upon the said maps for a distance of one mile and eight chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 295 from the said close numbered 291 reaches the southeastern side of Touna-road, almost opposite to the road leading to the Tonna Lock in the Neath Canal, and extending thence first northward across Tonna-road, to the middle of the said road leading to Tonna Lock and afterwards first north-westward, then westward and then again north-westward along the middle of the said road leading to Tonna Lock for a distance of seven chains and a quarter or thereabouts to the centre of the Lock Bridge which connects such road with the towing path on the north-western side of the said canal, and extending thence north-westward to the middle of the said towing path and then westward along the middle of the said towing path for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the close numbered 300 upon the said maps and extending thence northward to and along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of twenty-nine yards or thereabouts to its northern end on the southern bank of the River Neath and extending thence northward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts (thereby crossing the River Neath) to a point in the middle of the old course of such river upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Llantwit-juxta-Neath from the said parish of Cadoxton-juxta-Neath."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the parish out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Llandaff.

The Wild Birds Protection (West Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1908.

#### Dated 25th January, 1908.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire, I hereby make the following Order :--

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (West Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1908."

#### BIRDS.

#### Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire so as to be between the last day of February and the 12th day of August in any year.

#### Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:--

# Exclusion from the operation of the Act of 1880.

IV. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall not apply within the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire to the House Sparrow.

V. During the period between the 11th day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire :--

#### Sunday Protection.

VI. During the period between the 11th day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the Adminis-trative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire, except in that portion of the Riding known as the Forest of Bowland and comprising the Townships of Forest of Bowland (Higher Division), Forest of Bowland (Lower Division), Newtonin-Bowland and Slaidburn.

#### EGGS.

# Certain Eggs protected throughout the West Riding.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds, also the eggs of the Birds named in the Schedule to the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, and of those added to the Schedule by Clause III of this Order, is prohibited within the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire :--


