MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

County of West Sussex.

WHEREAS by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

Notice is hereby given, that the County Council of West Sussex have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the following portions of roads in the parishes of Crawley and Ifield, that is to say:—

So much of the main road from London to Brighton (including High-street) as extends from its junction with Black Dog-lane to the southern boundary of the parish of Ifield.

So much of the main road to Horsham as extends for a distance of 4,266 feet from its junction with High-street to "The Elms," Goffs Hill, Crawley.

Notice is hereby further given, that objections to the making of any such regulation may be sent in writing to the Local Government Board at their offices at Whitehall, London, on or before the 27th day of February, 1908.

A copy of any such objection should be sent at the same time by the objector to the County Council, addressed to the Clerk to the County Council of West Sussex, County Hall, Lewes.

MIDLOTHIAN AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND- MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1908.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Movement into out of or within Scheduled District.

1. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be landed in, or moved into or out of, the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3. (1.) If an animal is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If any person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows

a head of cattle or a sheep or goat or pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the MIDLOTHIAN AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1908.
