KENT AUDIT DISTRICT.

To the Rural District Councils referred to in Article I (3) of this Order;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to

which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 19th day of April, 1906, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of Nugent Charles Simner, Barrister-at-Law, as a District Auditor, and assigned to him the duties therein mentioned and the District in which he should act as Auditor, and which in the said Order was termed "The Kent Audit District";

And whereas by an Order dated the 28th day of March, 1901, We certified the appointment of John Meredyth Evans as a District Auditor and assigned to him the duties therein mentioned and the District in which he should act as Auditor, and which in that Order was termed "the Sussex Audit District," and it was directed that the said District should, until We otherwise prescribed, comprise, among other areas, the Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this

And whereas it is desirable that the duty of auditing the Accounts of the Authorities comprised in the areas included in the said Poor Law Unions and of their Officers for the half-year ended in September, 1907, should be assigned to the said Nugent Charles Simner:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe as follows:-

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the said Nugent Charles Simner to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and of their Officers for the half-year ended in September, 1907,

- (1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order.
- (2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said Unions.
- (3.) The Rural District Councils whose Districts are for the time being wholly situated within any of the said Unions.

ARTICLE II.—The said Nugent Charles Simner shall audit the said Accounts for the said period in conformity with the provisions contained in Article II of the said Order dated the nineteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and six, and for the purposes of the said Audits the said Unions shall be deemed to be within the Kent Audit District.

- 1. - 2. Now, therefore, I, Sir William Cospatrick Dunbar, Bart., C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 11TH FEBRUARY 1908.)

Lancashire (Parasitic Mange) Order of 1908.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.

1.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from animals not so affected or suspected; and (b) with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected or

suspected to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the horse, ass, or mule so affected or suspected is.

(2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

Veterinary Inquiry by Local Authority as to existence of Parasitic Mange.

- 2.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving information of the existence, or supposed existence, of parasitic mange shall forthwith cause inquiry to be instituted as to the correctness of such information with the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector, or of a veterinary practitioner qualified according to the Act of 1894 to be a Veterinary Inspector.
- (2.) The owner and occupier of any premises on which there is a horse affected with, or suspected of, parasitic mange, shall give all reasonable facilities for the inquiry by the Local Authority under this Article, and any person failing to give such facilities shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Detention of Animals.

- 3.—(1.) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority may serve a Notice (in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect) on the occupier of any stable, shed, field or other premises in which there is a horse, ass, or mule, which in his opinion is affected with parasitic mange, and thereupon the following restrictions shall take effect:—
 - (i.) The horse, ass, or mule so affected shall not be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises specified in the Notice, except with the written authority, and under the supervision, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and only to some other place of detention; and during the detention it shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, be treated by the owner thereof with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority;
 - (ii.) No other horse, ass, or mule shall be moved out of the stable, shed, field, or other premises, unless on each occasion immediately before the movement it is treated with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority.
- (2.) A Notice under this Order shall remain in force until it is withdrawn by a Notice in writing served on the occupier of the premises by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

- 4.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:
 - (i.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about, any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange:
 - (ii.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be effected:

- (iii.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect any such place, utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things, at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee, or occupier:
- (iv.) For requiring the removal by the owner from contact with horses, asses, or mules, of litter used for or about any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange.
- (2.) The mode of disinfection shall be one of those prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (3.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, or to remove any litter, in accordance with any such Regula-tion, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feedingtrough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, to be cleansed and disinfected, or to remove such litter, and to recover summarily the expenses thereby incurred from such person.
- (4.) Where the power conferred by the preceding provisions of this Article is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee, or occupier of the place to be cleansed and disinfected shall give all reasonable facilities for athat purpose.

Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

- 5.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Order.
- (2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

6. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals and parasitic mange of horses, asses, and mules, (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences or procedure.

Exemption of Army Veterinary Service and Veterinary Colleges.

7. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass, or mule kept in stables of military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Service, or in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

Offences.

8.—(1.) If a horse, ass, or mule is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice under

- this Order, the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the horse, ass, or mule is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of this Order, or of any Regulation made thereunder, the owner and the lessee and the occupier and the person in charge of any place or thing in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any owner, occupier, or person in charge of premises requiring to be cleansed and disinfected fails to give the facilities to a Local Authority required under this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of

Interpretation.

- 9. In this Order-
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector:
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

10. This Order extends to the administrative county of Lancaster, and the county boroughs of Barrow-in-Furness, Blackburn, Blackpool, Bolton, Bootle, Burnley, Bury, Liverpool, Manchester, Oldham, Preston, Rochdale, St. Helens, Salford, Southport, Warrington, and Wigan.

Revocation.

11. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked as from the commencement of this Order; Provided that all regulations made by a Local Authority under any of the said revoked Orders and in force immediately before the commencement of this Order shall continue in force until altered or revoked by the Local Authority or by the Board and shall have effect as if they had been made under this Order.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of February, nineteen hundred and eight.

13. This Order may be cited as the Lancashire (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER of 1908.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 12TH FEBRUARY 1908.)

MIDLOTHIAN AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1908 (No. 3).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of former Order and Contraction of Boundaries of Scheduled District.

1.—(1.) The Midlothian and District (Footand-Mouth Disease) Order of 1908 is hereby modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

(2.) The Scheduled District for the purposes of the above-mentioned Order and this Order shall after the commencement of this Order be the District described in the First Schedule to this Order.

Exception of Certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

2. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—

(i.) movement of an animal which is affected with Foot-and Mouth Disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii.) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board; or

(iii.) movement of an animal along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in the Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order; or

(iv.) movement out of a Foot-and-Month Disease Infected Place.

Movement within Scheduled District with Licence for Special Purposes.

3.—(1.) Where the Local Authority consider that it is necessary or expedient that any animals within their District should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District—

(i.) on a particular occasion, for feeding purposes or otherwise; or

(ii.) as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms in the District of the same Local Authority;

and it is impossible to so move the animals otherwise than along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare, the Local Authority may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence (in the form set forth in the Third Schedule to this Order or to the like effect) granted by an Inspector of such Local Authority.

(2.) Where the movement authorised by the Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence" and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority by a Notice to the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are. In other cases the Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.

(3.) The Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or descrip-

tion of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

Movement into Edinburgh, Leith or Musselburgh for Slaughter.

4.—(1.) An animal may be moved by railway from outside the Scheduled District to a railway station in the city of Edinburgh or burgh of Leith or Musselburgh without a Licence, but an animal so moved shall only be moved from the railway station, to a slaughter-house within the city or one of the said burghs, and only if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by the Local Authority of the city or burgh. The animal shall be moved to such slaughter-house by the route described in the Licence, and after arrival at the slaughter-house shall be there detained until it is slaughtered.

(2.) An animal may also be moved by railway or otherwise from any place outside the Scheduled District to a slaughter-house in the city of Edinburgh or in the burghs of Leith or Musselburgh, respectively, if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city or burgh, which Licence shall be obtained before movement

into the Scheduled District.

(8.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Third Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect.

Movement within Scheduled District with Licence for Slaughter.

5.—(1.) An animal may be moved from any premises in the Scheduled District to a slaughter-house within such District provided that the animal is marked as required by this Article and accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place from which the animal is to be moved.

(2.) Every animal moved under this Article shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner in

manner following:

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow about six inches long on the left hind quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow \uparrow on the forehead of each of the sheep, and by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition namely:—Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; m-lted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above-mentioned.

(3.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Third Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(4.) A copy of a Licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place of destination specified in the Licence.

General Provisions as to Movement.

6.—(1.) Animals, while being moved under this Order, shall be accompanied by the Licence authorising the movement and shall so far as is practicable be kept separate from all animals

which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and not elsewhere, and where the place of destination is a slaughter-house they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(2.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order to a slaughter-house, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of

completing the said movement.

Granting of Movement Licences.

7. A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Authority.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

8. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board relating to any disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

9.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Move-ment Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

10.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of the conditions of a Licence under this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If an animal is not marked as required by this Order, the person to whom the Licence to move the animal is granted, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person failing to cause the same to be so marked, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If any person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a head of cattle, or a sheep, or goat, or pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against

the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

11. In this Order-

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

"Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats, and swine.

"Slaughter-house" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation.

12. The Order described in the Fourth Schedule to this Order is hereby revoked from and after the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of February, nineteen hundred and eight.

Short Title, &c.

14. This Order may be cited as the MID-LOTHIAN AND DISTRICT (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1908 (No. 3), and shall be read with the Order mentioned in Article 1 of this Order.
