Despatch relating to Field Operations.

Sir,

In accordance with the instructions of the Inspector General the King's African Rifles, I have the honour to forward herewith a return of the minor military expeditions in East Africa in which the 3rd Battalion King's African Rifles

was engaged between 1902 and 1906.

During the period under review, in addition to the recent campaign against the Nandi which has been dealt with separately, the troops in British East Africa have been called on five times to operate in various parts of the Protectorate. In four cases the employment of strong patrols has produced the desired effect, while on one other occasion the situation called for a more serious effort in the shape of an organised military expedition before law and order were restored to the disturbed district.

I desire to bring to your notice the names of the following Officers whose services are worthy

of special consideration:

Captain and Brevet Major L. H. R. Pope-Hennessy (Temporary Lieutenant-Colonel, 4th Battalion King's African Rifles) was in command of the Force operating in Sotik from the 7th May to the 12th July, 1905. The late Commismissioner, Sir Donald Stewart, in his despatch, No. 454 of the 14th August, 1905, reported that "Major Pope-Hennessy, who was in command of the column, carried out his work in a most thorough manner, and it was owing to the precautions taken by him that the enemy never had a chance of effecting a surprise or a night attack—their favourite methods of warfare. The officers mentioned in his report all appear to have done good work."

By the severe lesson which he gave the Sotik, which has resulted in a valuable and fertile country being opened to settlement, and by the judgment and restraint with which, in loyal obedience to the spirit of his instructions, he conducted the operations on the Buret-Lumbwa border, Major Pope-Hennessy materially facilitated my subsequent operations against the Nandi, who had counted on the help of their

cousins the Lumbwa. I submit that in these operations he has shown a capacity for command and soundness of judgment which is deserving of special consideration.

Captain F. W. O. Maycock, 3rd Battalion, King's African Rifles, by his conduct of the Muruka patrol in 1902 and the operations in Embo in 1906, has proved himself to be possessed of energy, judgment, and self-reliance. In Embo his operations were conducted under the most adverse conditions of weather and natural features, and were crowned with complete success. His good work in Sotik was brought to my notice by Major Pope-Hennessy.

I also wish to bring to your notice the names of the following Officers who have done good service during the various operations which are the subject of this report:—

During the operations which are the subject of this report the behaviour of the rank and file has been consistently good, while the hardships cheerfully borne by both Officers and men have been neither light nor few. The result of their labours has been the establishment of order in the Protectorate.

I have therefore the honour to request that the African General Service Medal with clasp "East Africa 1902-1906" may be conferred upon the troops therein employed.

Return of Military Operations in the British East Africa Protectorate, 1902–06.

1. Maruka patrol.

The Maruka section of the Kikuyu, having murdered five Indian traders and refused to surrender the murderers and come under Administrative control, His Majesty's Commissioner ordered a patrol through their country.

The patrol, under Captain Maycock, 3rd King's African Rifles, consisted of 5 officers, 115 rifles 3rd K.A.R., 60 rifles police, with 300 levies and 1 Maxim gun.

The Maruku district was reached on the 4th September, 1902, and thoroughly worked over by mobile detachments between that date and the 25th October. The Maruka were sufficiently punished, and order restored in their district.

2. Iraini patrol.

Owing to constant murders of natives friendly | levies, and porters, a road having to be cut for to Government by the Iraini section of the some 35 miles to enable the column, which, with

Kikuyu, and the danger to our administration of more settled neighbouring districts if the Iraini were not brought under control, His Majesty's Commissioner decided to send a strong patrol, under Captain F. A. Dickinson, 3rd Battaliou King's African Rifles, to restore order.

The patrol consisted of :-

5 British Officers.

135 rifles 3rd Battalion King's African Rifles.

60 rifles East Africa Protectorate Police.

500 levies.

2 Maxim guns.

Captain Dickinson divided his command into three patrols which entered the Iraini country on the 13th February, 1904, from three sides worked it out thoroughly between that date and the 17th March. The operations extended to a sub-section of the Embo which threw in its lot with the Iraini. These operations led to the surrender of the chiefs and order was restored in the district.

3. Sotik Expedition.

In the spring of 1905, the Sotik tribe raided the Masai, capturing a number of women and children as well as a quantity of live stock. All efforts having failed to induce the Sotik to release their captives and to restore to the Masai the cattle raided, the Secretary of State for the Colonies sanctioned the employment of a military expedition to restore order by force of arms and to bring the country under administrative control.

The force under command of Major Pope-Hennessy, 3rd Battalion King's African Rifles, assembled in two columns at the end of May, as under:—

No. I Column at Njoro.—(Major Pope-Hennessy, 3rd K.A.R., in command). Three Companies, 3rd Battalion, King's African Rifles; 2 Maxim Guns, 3rd Battalion, King's African Rifles; Detachment 1st Battalion, King's African Rifles. 600 Masai levies.

No. II Column at Kericho.—(Captain C. L. Barlow, 1st King's African Rifles, in command). One Company, 3rd Battalion, King's African Rifles. 30 Rifles Police. 300 Lumbwa levies.

On the 2nd June, No. I Column marched from Njoro to Neilson's Farm on the Mau mountains, whence, after establishing an advance base, it moved on the 5th June into Sotik through a trackless primeval forest. Its advance was opposed on the Sotik border, but the enemy was defeated with trifling loss to the column.

A junction was effected with No. II Column, the advance of which had been unopposed, on the 9th June at Sotik Post. As information respecting the enemy's numbers, fighting quality, and intentions was still vague, Major Pope-Hennessy decided to operate in one column until these points had been sufficiently cleared up by actual contact to justify movements with detachments, weak in themselves, but able to cover a wide extent of country.

On the 27th a flying column, preceded by strong patrols, moved into and worked out the Sakamnia district, returning to the Sotik Fost on the 30th.

As it now became clear that the Sotik had received sufficient punishment, the force moved to Grey's Farm, near Molo. This march over steep hills and gorges covered with dense forest and bamboo jungle was a trying one to troops, levies, and porters, a road having to be cut for some 35 miles to enable the column, which, with

its convoy, was seven miles long, to pass in single file.

The force was demobilised on the 12th July. These operations have effectually established peace and good order in Sotik, and thrown this fine country open to colonisation.

The enemy's losses were severe. The Masai captives were released and the claims of that tribe on the Sotik made good. The force lost 1 man killed and 6 wounded; during the operations 14,711 rounds of rifle ammunition were expended and 614 rounds of Maxim ammunition. Major Pope-Hennessy reports that:—

"The behaviour of the rank and file throughout was good. I was particularly pleased with the remarkable marching of Captain Maycock's or No. 6 (Masai) Company, 3rd King's African Rifles, sections of which several times covered 40 miles in the day when supporting parties of Masai spearmen.

"Captain Jenkins' or No. 9 (Soudanese) Company, 3rd King's African Rifles set a good example to the rest of the force in discipline, smartness, and keenness for work."

In addition to the above named Officers Major Pope-Hennessy has brought to notice the good work of the following:—

4. Kisii Patrol.

For some time the Kisii tribe had been at loggerheads with the Kavirondo, the large tribe which lies between the Victoria Nyanza and the hill country of the Lumbwa and Nandi. The Kavirondo are under regular Government control and looked to the local administration to protect them from the Kisii, who had committed many murders on the border.

As the Kisii refused to pay compensation to the Kavirondo for the murders they had committed or to acknowledge our authority His Majesty's Commissioner decided to send a patrol into their country.

The patrol under Captain E. V. Jenkins, D.S.O., 3rd King's African Rifles, consisted of

4 Officers.

100 rifles, 3rd Battalion, King's African Rifles. 50 rifles, East Africa Protectorate Police.

150 Masai levies, with one Maxim gun.

The Kisii country was entered on the 1st September, 1905, and thoroughly patrolled in all directions until the 9th October. On three occasions the Kisii attacked the patrol in force and with determination, but were beaten off with loss.

The patrol accomplished its work satisfactorily with a cost of six men wounded:—

5. Operations in Embo.

Owing to their defiance of Government for the last five years and constant acts of hostility to our friendly tribes, culminating in the massacre of a deputation sent by the Mbee tribe to ask for British protection, His Majesty's Commissioner decided to send a force into Embo to establish order there.

The force, under command of Captain Maycock, 3rd Battalion, King's African Rifles, consisted of

8 Officers.

210 rifles, 3rd Battalion, King's African Rifles. 100 rifles, East Africa Protectorate Police.

170 armed Swahilis.

2 Maxim guns.

Owing to the Embo having terrorised the surrounding natives information was most difficult to obtain. The expedition, which entered the Embo country on the 18th June, 1906, operated in three columns, two of King's African Rifles (under command of Captain Maycock and Captain Barrett respectively), and one of police.

At first the resistance of the Embo was energetic and courageous, but by the 19th July they were completely subdued, Captain Maycock's operations having been crowned with complete success.

The expedition resulted in the pacification of the country, a fertile and valuable district of the Protectorate, and the safeguarding of our friendly tribes from future molestation.

In his report Captain Maycock brings to notice the excellent work done by Captain Barrett, 3rd Battalion King's African Rifles, in command of No. II Column. To his support, cooperation, and energy Captain Maycock ascribes much of the success which attended the expedition.

He further brings to notice the good work done by Sergeant-Instructor Quest, East Africa Police, and of Mr. E. B. Horne, of the East Africa Protectorate Administration.

Despatch relating to Field Operations. My Lord,

I have the honour to forward herewith a report by the Officer Commanding the Southern Nigeria Regiment on the Military Operations that have taken place between June, 1906, and March, 1907.

- 2. The fighting in the Owa District, which gave considerable trouble in 1905, was unusually severe, and the Officers and men concerned also suffered great hardships as the country is swampy and the operations took place in the rainy season.
- 3. I invite attention to the services of the Officers and men specially mentioned by Colonel Moorhouse, particularly those of Captains W. E. Rudkin and C. E. Heathcote.

Your Excellency,

In accordance with your Excellency's instructions I have the honour to forward a report on field operations carried out by the troops in Southern Nigeria between June, 1906, and March, 1907.

During that period there have not been any operations prearranged for a definite object

sanctioned by the Secretary of State as has usually been the case in previous years. Any operations that have been necessary have been caused either by direct revolt of the natives against the Government as at Agbor, Ishinkwa, and Uruala, where punitive action was necessary, or where the natives without being actively hostile, refused to obey the orders of the Government or carry out the instructions of the District Commissioner. In these cases, as in the Aka Ogoni, Kwa and Ikotekpene districts, a strong patrol had the desired effect, and there was little or no fighting.

Owa Column.—The most important of these operations was the one necessitated by the murder of Mr. O. S. Crewe Read, D.C., Agbor, by the people of Owa. News of the murder reached Asaba on the morning of June 9th, and Captain Rudkin, R.F.A., left the same afternoon with 3 Officers, 1 Medical Officer, and 1 Political Officer, and 194 rank and file, and a Maxim, and reached Umonede (40 miles) at 1 p.m. the following day, where he received information that the enemy were in great force about 5 miles off, on the Agbor road. He started before daylight on the morning of June 11th, and met with most determined resistance during the whole day. The enemy made stand after stand at close quarters, and had to be dislodged with the bayonet. He eventually reached the river 3 miles from Agbor, at 6.30 p.m., having had Mr. Chichester, Political Officer, and Lieutenant Walmsley Dresser, Royal Warwickshire Regiment, dangerously wounded, 2 rank and file killed, and 25 wounded.

3. Reinforcements of 3 Officers, one 2.95 gun and 110 rank and file, reached Captain Rudkin by June 19th, and he continued to have severe fighting south and south-east of Agbor until July 2nd, when further reinforcements of 3 Officers and 130 rank and file arrived. With this force he attacked and captured Owa, the scene of Mr. Crewe Read's murder.

This broke the back of the rising, and though some outlying towns did not submit without further fighting, they had all come in by August 3rd, when the column broke up.

The body of Mr. Crewe Read was recovered unmutilated.

All persons directly concerned in the murder, and various chiefs who had joined in the rising, either surrendered or were captured and handed over to the civil authorities for trial. Fixes were inflicted on the various towns concerned in the rising.

Captain Rudkin had under his command 12 Officers and 434 rank and file, and his casualties amounted to 16 killed and 92 wounded (exclusive of carriers), but taking into consideration the extremely thick bush in which the operations were conducted, and the unusually stubborn opposition offered by the enemy, I do not consider them at all excessive.

These operations were carried out in the middle of the rains, which greatly increased the hardship and discomfort of the column.

I wish to bring to the notice of your Excellency the good services rendered by the following Officers, non-commissioned officers, and men:—

Captain W. E. Rudkin, Royal Field Artillery, acted with great promptitude on the receipt of the news of Mr. Crewe Read's murder, and subsequently commanded the expedition until its successful close with determination, zeal, and military skill in spite of great difficulties of country and climate.

Captain C. E. Heathcote, K.O.Y.L.I., in addition to the skill and courage with which he handled his small force at Uruala, was for nine months in charge of the new district of Omoduru, where he discharged his duties with great energy and tact.

Lieutenant H. C. Fox, Royal Scots Fusiliers, displayed conspicuous bravery and powers of leadership on June 11th, when in command of the advance guard for twelve hours.

Sir,
I forward herewith the report of the operations in the Chibuk country.

The Chibuk Hill appears to have been a

stronghold of desperadoes, and to have been a very nasty place to tackle. The operations seem to have been well planned and conducted, and though the large number of casualties is regrettable, it does not seem to have been possible, from the nature of the ground and the determination with which the enemy fought, to have been avoided.

I bring to your Excellency's notice the skilful manner in which the operations were handled by Lieutenant P. Chapman, M.I., Northern Nigeria Regiment, and consider that his services are worthy of special consideration.

I further bring to your notice the names of Lieutenant C. A. Chaytor, 2nd Battalion, Northern Nigeria Regiment, Dr. A. C. Parsous, and also No. 2547 Sergeant Dan Halide and Sergeant-Major Amadu Yoruba.

I request that a tracing of the map be sent by the Intelligence Office to the Brigade Office.

A road report of the Maifone-Chibuk road has been called for and will be forwarded on arrival.

Field Operations Chibuk country.

My Lord,

In continuation of my Despatch No. 121 of the 27th of March last, I have the honour to transmit a further report from the Commandant on the operations recently undertaken in the Chibuk country.

2. I would invite your Lordship's attention to the recommendations made by Colonel Hasler in regard to Lieutenants Chapman and Wolseley and the non-commissioned officers and men under their command, in which recommendations, as also in the recommendation that a General Service Medal be granted to those engaged in these operations, I fully concur.

Sir.

On the 11th March, 1907, I forwarded to you a despatch on the operations in the Chibuk country under Lieutenant P. Chapman. I imagined at this time that the operations were completed. Since then a second phase of the

same operations has taken place under the command of Lieutenant E. J. Wolseley, two reports, dated 31st December, 1906, and 14th January, 1907, I have already sent you under my F/531/07 of 6th April. 1907, and further two reports from the same Officer, dated the 6th and 19th February respectively, from Chibuk, I now attach. In addition to this, further information has reached me concerning the first phase in the shape of a letter from the Resident, Bornu, and of conversation with Lieutenant Chapman.

I therefore think it best to re-write my despatch and in the new one to include Lieutenant Wolseley's operations.

As I informed you in my first despatch the Chibuk Hill has been for a long while a stronghold of desperadoes, who, using this hill as their sanctuary, terrorised the neighbourhood and looted and murdered the inhabitants of the surrounding country, pillaged caravans, &c. The Resident, Bornu, called upon Lieutenant Chapman to reduce the place. The operations throughout seem to have been well planned, and carried out with great skill and dash. Owing to the very difficult nature of the country the number of casualties on our side has been very I quote from a letter written by Mr. Hewby, Resident, Bornu, an official who has been seven years in Government employ in the Protectorate, and was for many years before that in the service of the Royal Niger Company Limited. He says: "I venture to state my deliberate opinion that no military operations have taken place during the last seven years in which the troops engaged had such genuine fighting to do under extraordinary difficult and nerve-trying conditions. With regard to these military operations, which involved the loss of 10 men killed and 40 wounded, I beg to offer my opinion that the Officers and men engaged are entitled to any reward open to them, and I should be glad if the Commandant could be informed of my full appreciation of the energy and resource of Lieutenant Chapman commanding the operations."

The Chibuk Hill is absolutely honeycombed with caves, and there are subterranean passages, some of which were nearly a mile in length. Almost all the fighting was at very close quarters. The operations under Lieutenant Chapman lasted from November 12th, 1906, to December 4th, 1906; Lieutenant Wolseley was at Chibuk from December 22nd, 1906, till February 17th, 1907. By a careful system of picquetting the various water supplies, he eventually forced the enemy to capitulate. During this time he lost 1 man killed and about 10 wounded.

I would bring to your special notice the services of Lieutenant P. Chapman, 7th Royal Fusiliers. He conducted the operations with great skill and judgment. Lieutenant Chapman speaks in the highest terms of the coolness and gallantry of Lieutenant C. A. Chaytor, Yorkshire Light Infantry. This Officer in addition to being wounded received an arrow through his helmet, and a sergeant who was talking to him had his brains dashed out by an arrow.

The Officer Commanding is loud in his praise of the conduct of Mr. A. C. Parsons, the medical officer. In addition to the large number of wounded men whom he had to attend, he was also in charge of Lieutenant Burnett, Highland Light Infantry, who was in a critical condition with blackwater fever. Mr. Parsons was absolutely indefatigable in the performance of his duties.

I further bring to notice the services of Lieutenant E. J. Wolseley, who conducted the operations after Lieutenant Chapman left, and brought them to a satisfactory conclusion. Lieutenant Chapman reports that he received every assistance from Captain Booth (Assistant Resident) acting as Political Officer to the Force.
