RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

The following draft Rules are published pursuant to the Rules Publication Act, 1893 :—

ORDER XXII, RULE 17.

1. Order XXII, Rule 17, shall be read as if there were included therein :—

London County Council $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. Stock.

ORDER XXXVII, RULE 34A.

2. Any subpoena, other than a subpoena issued from the Crown Office or in an action to be tried at Assizes, shall remain in force from the date of issue until the trial of the action or matter in which it is issued.

ORDER LIV, RULE 12.

3. Order LIV, Rule 12, is hereby annulled and the following Rule shall stand in lieu thereof :—

12. In the King's Bench Division a master, and in the Probate Divorce and Admiralty Division a registrar, may transact all such business and exercise all such authority and jurisdiction in respect of the same as under the Act or these Rules may be transacted or exercised by a Judge at chambers, except in respect of the following proceedings and matters; that is to say :—

(a) All matters relating to criminal proceedings or to the liberty of the subject;

(b) Granting leave for service out of the jurisdiction of a writ, or, notice of a writ of summons;

(c) Appeal from district registrars;

(d) Prohibitions;

(e) Injunctions and other orders under subsection 8 of section 25 of the principal Act, other than orders for the appointment of receivers by way of equitable execution and injunctions so far, and so far only, as the same are ancillary or incidental to equitable execution;

(f) Reviewing taxation of costs;

(g) Acknowledgments of married women or applications to dispense with the concurrence of a husband in a disposition by a married woman.

ORDER LXII, RULE 1A.

4. If from time to time the state of business shall so require, the Clerks to the Chancery Registrars may attend the Court of Appeal or the Judges of the Chancery Division on the trial of actions with witnesses on such days and at such times as the Senior Registrar for the time being shall, with the approval of the Master of the Rolls in the case of the Court of Appeal, and with the approval of the Senior Judge of the Chancery Division, in the case of that Division, determine.

ORDER LXIII, RULE 3.

5. The Sittings of the several Offices of the Supreme Court shall extend over the whole of the four periods between the Vacations and shall include in addition the last seven days of the Long Vacation.

ORDER LXIII, RULE 9.

6. Subject in any Division of the High Court to any Order by the President thereof, the Office hours in the several Offices of the Supreme Court other than the Summons and Order, Crown Office and Associates Departments of the Central Office shall be from ten in the forenoon to four in the afternoon, except on Saturdays, when the Offices shall close at one in the afternoon, and in Vacation, when the Offices shall close at two.

In the Summons and Order Department the hours shall be from half-past ten in the forenoon to half-past four in the afternoon, except on Saturdays, when it shall be from half-past ten in the forenoon to half-past one in the afternoon, and in Vacation, when it shall be from half-past ten to half-past two.

In the Crown Office and Associates Departments the hours shall be from eleven in the forenoon to five in the afternoon, except on Saturdays and in Vacation, when the hours shall be from eleven in the forenoon to two in the afternoon.

9. These Rules may be cited as the Rules of the Supreme Court (March), 1908, or each Rule may be cited by the heading thereof with reference to the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1883.

In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6 Victoria, chapter 110), and on behalf of the Manchester Ship Canal Company, I hereby give you notice that the Company proposes to construct on the bank of the River Mersey in Walton Inferior, in the county of Chester, in accordance with the plan and section deposited in the office of the Mersey Conservancy, three breasts of timber, each 17 yards in length, 6 yards in average height, and $4\frac{1}{2}$ yards in width, at the respective distances of about 165 yards, 495 yards, and 815 yards (measured in a southerly direction) from the southerly end of the timber wharf belonging to Messrs. Crosfield and Sons Limited. The object of the proposed breasts is to provide mooring places for dredging craft and other vessels engaged in the dredging operations in the River Mersey. It is intended to commence the work after the expiration of one month from the date of this Notice. The proposed work will exclude about 20 cubic yards of tidal water on a tide of the height of 21 feet, as measured from the sill of the gates of the Old Dock in Liverpool.

CAMBRIDGESHIRE (SWINE-FEVER)
ORDER OF 1908.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application to Area of Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, with modifications.

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall apply to the Area specified in the Schedule hereto (in this Order referred to as the said Infected Area), which is hereby declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area, but subject to the modifications hereinafter contained.

Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

2.—(1.) The Local Authority may grant a Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition of swine in the said Infected Area if they are satisfied that the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held in a market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition which is capable of being thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, and thereupon the market fair sale or exhibition may be held accordingly.

(2.) A Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market fair sale or exhibition (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets fairs sales or exhibitions on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding three months, but the Licence may be renewed from time to time or revoked at any time by the Local Authority.

(3.) A Licence shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to ensure publicity for the same, and a copy of the Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition where such market fair sale or exhibition is held.

(4.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article.

(5.) A fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local Authority and named in the Licence for the purpose of receiving Licences authorising movement of swine to the market fair sale or exhibition, and for granting Licences for movement of swine

therefrom in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(6.) No swine shall be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare into a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Article unless accompanied by a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order.

Licences for Movement out of Licensed Markets, &c., only to bacon factory or slaughterhouse.

3.—(1.) Swine exposed at a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order may be moved from the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition along over or across a highway or thoroughfare in an Infected Area if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fair, sale-yard, or exhibition is situate, and only to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the Licence, where the swine after their arrival shall be detained until they are slaughtered.

(2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.

(3.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

(4.) A copy of a Licence for movement from a market, fair, saleyard, or exhibition, shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the Licence.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

4.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to a market fair sale or exhibition in an Infected Area, the Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition by the person in charge of the swine to the person appointed under this Order to receive the same.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to any other premises in an Infected Area, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

Attendance at Markets, &c.

5. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order.

Revocation by Board of Licences.

6. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to

be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

9.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order—

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries;

"Infected Area" means an area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area;

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the sixteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and eight.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the CAMBRIDGE-SHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1908.

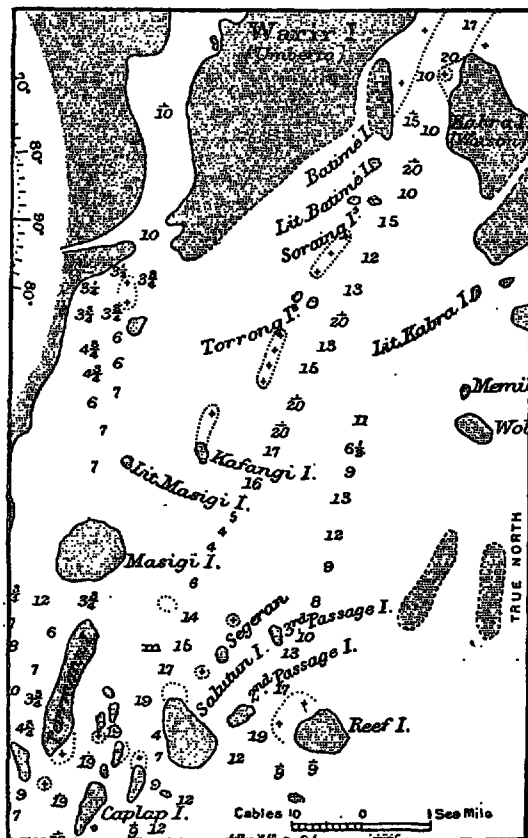

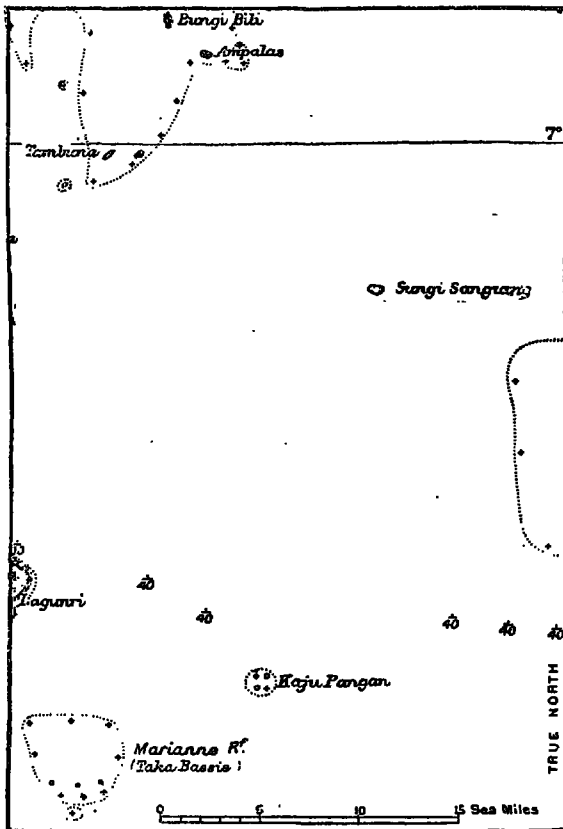
