PRESENT,

HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES.

Lord President. Lord Steward. Lord Wenlock. Mr. Secretary Haldane.

HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Commission dated the seventeenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eight, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, in His Majesty's absence from His Realm in foreign parts, to hold on His Majesty's behalf, His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His approval of any matter or thing whereunto His Royal Highness should be so authorized by writing under His Majesty's Sign Mauual, and to do further on His Majesty's behalf any matter or thing for the purposes of the said Commission whereunto His Royal Highness should be authorized in manner aforesaid:

And whereas in virtue of the powers conferred upon Him by section six of the Territorial and Reserve Forces Act, 1907, His Majesty has decided to raise and maintain a force, to be called the "Territorial Force," and to comprise the several units detailed in the second column of the Schedule appended hereto:

And whereas it is provided by section twentynine of the said Act that where an Association has been established thereunder for any county, His Majesty may by Order in Council transfer to the Territorial Force such units of the Yeomanry or Volunteers (or part thereof) raised in the county as may be specified in such Order; and that the said Order may provide, in connection with such transfer, for the several matters mentioned in the said section, and may contain such supplemental, consequential, and incidental provisions as may appear necessary or proper for the purposes of the said Order:

And whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Act, the Army Council have established Associations for the several counties detailed in the third column of the Schedule appended hereto:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, being authorized thereto by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth, on behalf of His Majesty, order, as it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. The several units (or parts of units) of Yeomany and Volunteers detailed in the first column of the schedule appended hereto shall, on and from the first April, one thousand nine hundred and eight, be transferred to the Territorial Force, and shall thereafter be units of the Territorial Force, and shall be respectively known by the titles specified in the second column of the said Schedule.
- 2. All officers and men of units (or parts of units) so transferred shall on or before the thirtieth June, one thousand nine hundred and eight, elect whether they will consent to become subject to the provisions of the said Act as to conditions and area of service, or not.

- 3. Officers electing to become subject to such provisions will, provided that they are recommended by the Commanding Officer of the unit in which they wish to serve, be gazetted as officers of the Territorial Force; and men so electing will, subject to a similar proviso, be enlisted in the said Force in accordance with section nine of the said Act, and with regulations prescribed by His Majesty's Army Council. Any officer or man electing not to become subject to the said provisions will respectively either relinquish his commission or be discharged from His Majesty's Service as soon as may be.
- 4. All officers and men of the units (or parts of units) transferred to the said Force under this Order shall, until they either have been gazetted or attested (as the case may be) or have relinquished their commissions or been discharged, as provided above, remain subject to the same provisions, as regards conditions and area of service and otherwise, as would have been applicable to them, if the units or parts of units to which they belong had not been so transferred; provided that no officer or man shall while remaining subject to such provisions be permitted to undergo training or to attend drills, unless required to do so by His Majesty's Army Council.
- 5. All property belonging to or held for the benefit of any unit of the Volunteers or Yeomanry mentioned in the first column of the schedule to this Order and vested in the commanding officer of any corps or regiment of Volunteers or Yeomanry as such shall, if and so far as it consists of land or any interest in land, by virtue of this Order become vested in, and, so far as it consists of other property, be transferred to, the association hereinafter mentioned, subject to any charges thereon and to any liabilities in or towards the discharge of which the property is properly applicable, and shall be held by that association for the benefit of the corresponding unit of the Territorial Force, in like manner in all respects as it was held by such commanding officer as aforesaid for the unit of the Volunteers or Yeomanry, or for such other purposes as the association, with the consent of such corresponding unit (to be ascertained in manner prescribed by regulations of the Army Council) shall

Provided that the foregoing provisions as to vesting shall not apply as respects the legal estate in any copyhold or customary land, but in such case such legal estate shall, subject to the customs of the manor, be transferred to such trustees as the association in which the estate, if the land had not been copyhold or customary land, would have vested may appoint for the purpose.

- 6. The association in which any land or interest in land is so vested shall be—
- (a) if the unit is administered by a single association, that association, wherever the land may be situated; and
- (b) if the unit is administered by more than one association, the association of the gounty in

which the land is situated, or, if the land is not situated in any of the counties the associations of which administer the unit, such of those associations as the Secretary of State may by Order direct.

The association to which property other than land is to be so transferred shall be—

- (a) if the unit is administered by a single association, that association; and
 - (b) if the unit is administered by more than one association, such of the associations and in such proportions as the Secretary of State may direct.

The commanding officer in whom any property directed by or under this Order to be transferred to an association or to trustees is vested shall, on the request and at the cost of the association to which the property is to be transferred or by which the trustees are appointed, execute and do all such lawful assurances and things for transferring the property to the association or trustees as the association may reasonably require.

If any question arises as to the association in or to which any property is vested or is to be transferred under this Order, the question shall be decided by the Secretary of State, whose decision shall be final.

- 7. Where any property belonging to or held for the benefit of a unit of Volunteers or Yeomanry mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order is vested in or held by any trustees other than such commanding officer as aforesaid, those trustees shall, until otherwise directed by Order in Council under the said section 29, be appointed in regard to the property so vested in or held by them to be special trustees, to the exclusion of the association, and shall continue to hold such property in trust for the corresponding unit of the Territorial Force, in like manner in all respects as they previously held it for the unit of the Volunteers or Yeomanry, and the corresponding unit shall notwithstanding any trust, limitation, or condition affecting any such property, continue entitled to the benefit thereof in like manner as the unit was entitled thereto before it became a unit of the Territorial Force.
- 8. Where the council of a county or borough have acquired any land or interest in land on behalf of any unit of Volunteers mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order, the council may, with the consent of the Secretary of State, transfer the land or interest in land and any outstanding liabilities incurred by the council in respect thereof to the association or one of the associations by which the corresponding unit of the Territorial Force is administered, if that association consents to the transfer, but unless and until the land or interest is so transferred the council shall continue to hold the land or interest in land on behalf of the corresponding unit of the Territorial Force, in like manner in all respects as they held it on behalf of the unit of the Volunteers.

And whereas it is provided by each such lease that the piece or parcel of land thereby demised shall not be enjoyed for any other use or purpose whatsoever than for the Company to exercise arms in and for the mustering, training, and exercising of the trained bands or militia of the City, in accordance with certain provisions in the said leases respectively contained:

And whereas by the said section twenty-nine of the said Act it is enacted that an Order in

Council made under that section may provide, | Company or any civil rights and privileges amongst other things,-

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.
