INCOME TAX.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 20th March, 1908.)

Whereas by the twenty-first section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-Districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient, in the interest of public convenience, that North Clerkenwell Sub-District of Holborn Registration District

should be united with South Clerkenwell Sub-District of the same Registration District, and that the enlarged Sub-District, which would consist of the entire Civil Parish of Clerkenwell, should be called and known as Clerkenwell Sub-District.

2. Now, therefore, I, Sir William Gospatrick Dunbar, Bart., C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and eight.
