NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(Nos. 399 and 425 to 446 of the year 1908.)

[The Astronomical positions are approximate unless otherwise stated. The bearings are Magnetic, and those relating to lights are given from seaward. The visibility of lights is that in clear weather. Fog signals are sounded during thick or foggy weather unless otherwise stated. The depths are given at low-water ordinary springs. The heights are given above high water.]

No. 399.—COASTS OF COCHIN CHINA, ANNAM, AND GULF OF TONG KING.

System of Typhoon and Storm Signals Established.

Particulars.—The system of Typhoon and Storm warning signals now in use at the semaphores of the Imperial Maritime Customs on the Coast of China has been established with slight additions by the French Government at the semaphores at Hai Fong Tihen Sha (Tourane), Padaran and Cape St James.

Information respecting storms can also be obtained at the following places which have no semaphore:—Vinh, Dong Hoi, Tourane, Kin Hou, Nhatrang, and Saigon.

The above stations, which are connected with the observatory at Phulien, Tong King, will be instructed daily regarding the storm areas.

Signals.—When the following signals are made a red flag with a white star in the centre will be hoisted at the mast head during the day, and replaced by a red light at night.

The signals are made by means of shapes used as symbols, having numbers corresponding to them as follows:—



These shapes are hoisted at the yard-arms of the signal mast, and have the following general characteristics:—
