





Lake Borgne—Beacons Erected.

2. Rabbit Island Shoal.

Position.—In a depth of 6 feet, from which Long Point Light bears N. 6° W., distant one mile, and Pearl River Light N. 62° E. on chart No. 2853.

Name and Description of Beacon.—Rabbit Island Shoal Beacon. A single pile beacon with circular topmark, painted black.

Variation.—4° E
