### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of  
Barrow-in-Furness) Order, 1908.

Dated 26th March, 1908.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me  
by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904,  
and upon application by the Council of the County  
Borough of Barrow-in-Furness, I hereby make  
the following Order:—

#### *Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild  
Birds Protection (County Borough of Barrow-in-  
Furness) Order, 1908."

#### *BIRDS.*

*Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.*

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880,  
shall apply within the County Borough of Barrow-  
in-Furness to the following species of Wild Birds  
in the same manner as if those species were  
included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Blackbird,  
Black-headed Bunting, Common Bunting, Yellow  
Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Creeper,  
Dipper, Stock Dove, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted  
Flycatcher, Hawfinch, Heron, Hobby, Kestrel,  
Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin,  
Moorhen, Nuthatch, Ring Ouzel, Pipits, Lesser  
Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Stonechat, Swallow,  
Swift, Thrush, Tits, Wheatear, Pied Wagtail,  
Grey Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Black Cap  
Warbler, Garden Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge  
Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler,  
Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wren, Golden-  
crested Wren, Whinchat.

#### *Eggs.*

*All Eggs protected within a certain Area.*

III. The taking or destroying of the eggs of  
any species of Wild Birds is prohibited within  
that part of the County Borough of Barrow-in-  
Furness known as the Island of Walney for a  
period of five years from the date of this Order.

*Certain Eggs protected throughout the County  
Borough.*

IV. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the  
following species of Wild Birds is prohibited  
throughout the County Borough of Barrow-in-  
Furness:—

Blackbird, Curlew, Dipper, Stock Dove, Wild  
Duck, Goldfinch, Black-headed Gull, Pied Fly-  
catcher, Heron, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Moorhen,  
Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk, or Fern  
Owl), Ringed Plover, Redshank, Long-tailed  
Tit, Owl, Oyster Catcher, Sandpiper, Sheldrake,  
Snipe, Teal, Tern, Wheatear, Whitethroat,  
Lesser Whitethroat, Woodcock, Golden-crested  
Wren

## INCOME TAX.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

SHEEP-SCAB (NORTH WALES DIPPING  
AREAS) ORDER OF 1908.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Declaration of Sheep-Scab Compulsory Dipping Areas.*

1.—(1.) The Areas described in the First Schedule to this Order and therein numbered I, II, and III are hereby declared to be Compulsory Dipping Areas for the purposes of the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1906, hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order," and that Order shall apply to those Areas accordingly subject to the modifications contained in this Order.

(2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly without a Dipping Area declared by this Order, the principal Order shall apply to the farm or holding and the sheep thereon as if the whole farm or holding were in that Area, except that where the farm or holding is partly in the Area numbered I and partly in another Area hereby declared the said Order shall apply to the farm or holding and the sheep thereon as if the whole farm or holding were in the Area numbered I.

*Periods for Compulsory Dipping.*

2.—(1.) In the Dipping Areas declared by this Order there shall be two prescribed dipping periods. The first prescribed dipping period shall commence on the first day of June and end on the thirty-first day of August, and the second prescribed dipping period shall commence on the first day of September and end on the thirtieth day of November.

(2.) During the first prescribed dipping period Part I of the principal Order (*Compulsory Dipping of all Sheep in Compulsory Dipping Area*) shall apply with the modifications contained in this Order; and during the second prescribed dipping period Part I shall apply without modification.

*Modifications of Part I of the Principal Order as regards the First Prescribed Dipping Period.*

3. During the first prescribed dipping period Article 2 (2) of the principal Order shall not apply and the following provisions of this Article shall apply:—

(1.) For the purposes of enabling the Local Authority to be represented at the dipping whenever they think such a course desirable, the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped under the principal Order shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is hereinafter provided:—

(i.) The notice shall be delivered, or sent by post, to such persons as the Local Authority of the District may appoint to receive such notices in respect of sheep in their District.

(ii.) The notice shall be sent or delivered at such time as to be received by the

appointed person three clear days, at least, before the intended time of dipping, unless a shorter notice is authorised by the Local Authority.

(iii.) The notice shall state the time and place of the intended dipping, and the approximate number of sheep intended to be dipped.

(2.) If from any cause the dipping of the sheep on the date specified in a notice becomes impracticable, no further notice shall be required if the sheep are dipped as soon after such date as is practicable.

(3.) A return in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, shall be sent immediately after each dipping by the owner or person in charge of the sheep dipped to the person appointed to receive such returns by the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are dipped, except in any case in which an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority is present at the dipping.

(4.) Article 2 of the principal Order shall not apply to sheep for which an exemption has been obtained from the Local Authority of the District, which exemption shall be granted only for sheep which for the purposes of sale, exhibition or movement shall have been dipped under and in accordance with the provisions of the principal Order on or since the third day of May in the current year, and have since such dipping been kept separate from sheep not dipped in the manner prescribed by the principal Order. The sheep thus exempted shall until the expiration of the first prescribed dipping period be kept separate from sheep which have not been dipped in the manner prescribed by the principal Order. Every exemption shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority and shall be subject to any conditions specified in the exemption. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries. This modification does not alter the effect of Part II of the principal Order (*Regulation of Exposure and Movement of Sheep in Compulsory Dipping Areas*).

(5.) The sheep shall be dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab by the Sheep-Scab Order of 1905, or otherwise, or purporting to be so approved.

(6.) All sheep after having been dipped shall during the remainder of the prescribed dipping period be kept isolated, as far as practicable, from sheep which have not been so dipped.

(7.) The occupier of a farm or holding in a Dipping Area on which sheep are kept shall personally, or by his agent authorised in that behalf, within fourteen days after the expiration of the first prescribed dipping period, send, in each year, a declaration as to the dipping of the sheep, in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, to the person appointed to receive such declarations by the Local Authority of the District in which the farm or holding is situate.

(8.) The Local Authority shall appoint persons for their District or for separate parts of their District to receive notices, returns, and declarations under this Order, and shall give adequate notice in their District of appointments so made.

(9.) The Local Authority may in any case where they think such procedure desirable, for the purpose of securing the dipping required by this Order, serve a Notice on the owner or person in charge of any

sheep requiring that the sheep shall be dipped at such time and place as is stated in the notice and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and the sheep shall thereupon be dipped in accordance with the requirements of such notice. The notice may be in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

*Application of Part II of the Principal Order.*

4. Part II of the principal Order, except Article 5 (*Restriction of Movement of Sheep out of Compulsory Dipping Area*), shall in each Dipping Area declared by this Order be in force only from the fifteenth day of April to the thirtieth day of November (including both those days) in every year that this Order remains in force as regards the Area.

*Movement out of a Dipping Area through another Dipping Area.*

5. For the purposes of the principal Order sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of a Dipping Area declared by this Order where they are being moved through that Area from another Dipping Area hereby declared under and in accordance with the provisions of the principal Order and this Order.

*Movement of Sheep through Dipping Area.*

6. Sheep landed in a Dipping Area declared by this Order shall not for the purposes of the principal Order be deemed to be moved out of such Area, if they are consigned from Ireland to a place of destination outside the Area, but sheep so landed shall be moved from the landing-place forthwith by the most direct route to the nearest available railway station from which the sheep can be moved to the place of destination to which they are so consigned, and forthwith moved by railway out of the Area.

*Revocation of Order.*

7. The Orders described in the Third Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.

*Commencement.*

8. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and eight.

*Short Title.*

9. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP-SCAB (NORTH WALES DIPPING AREAS) ORDER OF 1908.

During the first prescribed dipping period Part I of the principal Order (*Compulsory Dipping of all Sheep in Compulsory Dipping Area*) shall apply in the Dipping Area numbered II with the modifications contained in this Order; and during the second prescribed dipping period Part I shall so apply without modification.

*Modifications of Part I of the Principal Order.*

4. During the prescribed dipping period in Area numbered I and during the first prescribed dipping period in Area numbered II, Article 2 (2) of the principal Order shall not apply and the following provisions of this Article shall apply:—

(1.) For the purposes of enabling the Local Authority to be represented at the dipping whenever they think such a course desirable, the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped under the principal Order shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is hereinafter provided:—

(i.) The notice shall be delivered, or sent by post, to such persons as the Local

Authority of the District may appoint to receive such notices in respect of sheep in their District.

(ii.) The notice shall be sent or delivered at such time as to be received by the appointed person three clear days, at least, before the intended time of dipping, unless a shorter notice is authorised by the Local Authority.

(iii.) The notice shall state the time and place of the intended dipping, and the approximate number of sheep intended to be dipped.

(2.) If from any cause the dipping of the sheep on the date specified in a notice becomes impracticable, no further notice shall be required if the sheep are dipped as soon after such date as is practicable.

(3.) A return in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, shall be sent immediately after each dipping by the owner or person in charge of the sheep dipped to the person appointed to receive such returns by the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are dipped, except in any case in which an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority is present at the dipping.

(4.) Article 2 of the principal Order shall not apply to sheep for which an exemption has been obtained from the Local Authority of the District, which exemption shall be granted only for sheep which for the purposes of sale, exhibition or movement shall have been dipped under and in accordance with the provisions of the principal Order on or since the third day of May, in the current year, and have since such dipping been kept separate from sheep not dipped in the manner prescribed by the principal Order. The sheep thus exempted shall until the expiration of the first prescribed dipping period be kept separate from sheep which have not been dipped in the manner prescribed by the principal Order. Every exemption shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority and shall be subject to any conditions specified in the exemption. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries. This modification does not alter the effect of Part II of the principal Order (*Regulation of Exposure and Movement of Sheep in Compulsory Dipping Areas*).

(5.) The sheep shall be dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab by the Sheep-Scab Order of 1905, or otherwise, or purporting to be so approved.

(6.) All sheep after having been dipped shall during the remainder of the prescribed dipping period be kept isolated, as far as practicable, from sheep which have not been so dipped.

(7.) The occupier of a farm or holding in a Dipping Area on which sheep are kept shall personally, or by his agent authorised in that behalf, within fourteen days after the expiration of the prescribed dipping period, send, in each year, a declaration as to the dipping of the sheep, in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, to the person appointed to receive such declarations by the Local Authority of the District in which the farm or holding is situate.

(8.) The Local Authority shall appoint persons for their District or for separate parts of their District to receive notices, returns, and declarations under this Order, and shall give adequate notice in their District of appointments so made.



(9.) The Local Authority may in any case where they think such procedure desirable, for the purpose of securing the dipping required by this Order, serve a Notice on the owner or person in charge of any sheep requiring that the sheep shall be dipped at such time and place as is stated in the notice and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and the sheep shall thereupon be dipped in accordance with the requirements of such notice. The notice may be in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

*Application of Part II of the Principal Order.*

5. Part II of the principal Order, except Article 5 (*Restriction of Movement of Sheep out of Compulsory Dipping Area*), shall in each Dipping Area declared by this Order be in force from the fifteenth day of April to the twelfth day of November, (including both those days) in every year that this Order remains in force as regards the Area.

*Movement out of a Dipping Area through another Dipping Area.*

6. For the purposes of the principal Order sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of a Dipping Area declared by this Order where they are being moved through that Area from another Dipping Area hereby declared under and in accordance with the provisions of the principal Order and this Order.

*Commencement.*

7. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and eight.

*Short Title.*

8. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP-SCAB (CARDIGANSHIRE DIPPING AREAS) ORDER OF 1908.

SHEEP-DIPPING (SOUTH WALES AND  
MONMOUTH) ORDER OF 1908.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Application of Order.*

1.—(1.) This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, and hereinafter referred to as "the Dipping Area."

(2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly in the Dipping Area and partly outside the Dipping Area, the whole farm or holding shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be in the Dipping Area.

*Mode of Dipping prescribed.*

2. Where under this Order it is provided that sheep are to be dipped, they shall be dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab by the Sheep-Scab Order of 1905 or otherwise, or purporting to be so approved.

*General Dipping within Prescribed Period.*

3.—(1.) All sheep (except those exempted by later provisions of this Order) which are in the Dipping Area at any time between the fourteenth day of July and the first day of September, hereinafter referred to as "the prescribed dipping period," in any year during which this Order shall be in operation, shall be caused to be dipped within the Dipping Area between these dates by the owner, or person in charge thereof.

(2.) In the case of sheep moved into the Dipping Area between the twentieth day of August and the first day of September it shall be sufficient compliance with this Article if the sheep are dipped within ten days after the movement.

(3.) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to the following sheep:—

(i.) Sheep moved by railway through the Dipping Area without being untrucked within the Area;

(ii.) Sheep which, in the opinion of the Local Authority of the District where they are kept, it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip in accordance with the requirements of this Order, on account of their being intended for exhibition or of any other special circumstances, and which are accordingly exempted by an exemption signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority. The exemption may be granted subject to conditions as to subsequent dipping or otherwise. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board. The exemption shall be in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect;

(iii.) Sheep slaughtered in the Dipping Area or moved out of the Dipping Area, without contravening Article 15 of this Order, before the expiration of the period within which their dipping is required under this Article.

*Notice to Local Authority of Time and Place of intended Dipping.*

4.—(1.) For the purposes of enabling the Local Authority to be represented at the dipping whenever they think such a course desirable, the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped under the preceding Article, shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is hereinafter provided:—

(i.) The notice shall be delivered, or sent by post, to such persons as the Local Authority of the District may appoint to receive such notices in respect of sheep in their District.

(ii.) The notice shall be sent or delivered at such time as to be received by the appointed person three clear days, at least, before the intended time of dipping, unless a shorter notice is authorised by the Local Authority.

(iii.) The notice shall state the time and place of the intended dipping, and the approximate number of sheep intended to be dipped.

(2.) If from any cause the dipping of the sheep on the date specified in a notice becomes impracticable, no further notice shall be required if the sheep are dipped as soon after such date as is practicable.

(3.) A return in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, shall be sent immediately after each dipping by the owner or person in charge of the sheep dipped to the person appointed to receive such returns by the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are dipped, except in any case in which an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority is present at the dipping.

*Clipping before Dipping.*

5. A sheep shall not be deemed to have been dipped in accordance with the requirements of this Order, unless it has been previously clipped in the current year, but this provision shall not apply to lambs less than nine months old.

*Isolation of Sheep after Dipping.*

6. All sheep, after having been dipped, shall during the remainder of the prescribed dipping period be kept isolated, as far as practicable, from sheep which have not been so dipped.

*Declaration after Dipping Period.*

7. The occupier of a farm or holding on which sheep are kept shall personally, or by his agent authorised in that behalf, on or after the first day of September, but not later than the fifteenth day of September, send a declaration as to the dipping of the sheep, in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, to the person appointed to receive such declarations by the Local Authority of the District in which the farm or holding is situate.

*Notice of Appointment of Persons to receive Returns, &c.*

8. The Local Authority shall appoint persons for their District or for separate parts of their District to receive notices, returns, and declarations under the preceding Articles, and shall give adequate notice in their District of appointments so made.

*Restriction on Movement of Sheep not Dipped within Dipping Period.*

9. Where any sheep shall not have been dipped as required by this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority may, without prejudice to any proceedings for the offence, serve the owner or person in charge of the sheep and the owner or person in charge of any sheep then in contact

with the undipped sheep with a notice, in the Form D set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, requiring the dipping of the sheep described in the notice and prohibiting their movement from the farm, holding, or other place where they are at the time the notice is served (except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District) until all the sheep shall have been dipped after the service of the notice in the presence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or have been slaughtered, and thereupon it shall be unlawful to move the sheep in contravention of the notice.

*Cleansing of Dipping Places.*

10. The place on any farm or premises which has been used for the dipping shall, without unnecessary delay, be thoroughly cleansed by the occupier, and all tufts of wool gathered and disinfected or destroyed.

*Samples of Dip may be taken.*

11. Every owner or person in charge of sheep being dipped under this Order shall permit and give every facility to an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board, or to a constable, to take samples of dip or material which is being or has been used for the dipping of sheep.

*Power to provide Dipping Places.*

12. The Local Authority may provide and fit up and maintain dipping places, but subject to the approval in writing by the Board of the site of each dipping place; provided that no dipping place shall be used under this provision if its use would injuriously affect the water in any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, well, pond, or place constructed or used for the supply of water for drinking or other domestic purposes.

*Power for Local Authority to regulate time and place of Dipping in particular cases.*

13. The Local Authority may in any case where they think such procedure desirable serve a notice on the owner or person in charge of any sheep requiring that the sheep shall be dipped at such time and place as is stated in the notice and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and the sheep shall thereupon be dipped in accordance with the requirements of such notice. The notice may be in the Form E set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

*Powers of Entry of Inspectors.*

14. An Inspector of the Board, and an Inspector of the Local Authority subject to their direction, may for the purposes of this Order enter any premises and examine any sheep thereon.

*Restrictions on Markets, &c., and of Movement out of Dipping Area.*

15.—(1.) Between the fourteenth day of July and the first day of September in any year during which this Order shall be in operation sheep shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be exposed for sale in any market, fair, or sale yard in the Dipping Area, nor moved out of the Area, unless they have been dipped during the prescribed dipping period or within twenty-eight days before the commencement of such period, and unless they are accompanied by a declaration stating that they have been so dipped, signed by the owner of the sheep or his agent authorised in

that behalf. The declaration shall be in the Form F set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

(2.) Where the movement is out of the Area the place of destination shall be endorsed upon the declaration, and a copy of the declaration with such endorsement shall, before the movement, be given or sent to an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District from which the sheep are moved. The sheep shall be moved to the place of destination by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay. A copy of a declaration received by an Inspector under this Article shall forthwith be sent by him to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

(3.) Sheep intended for exhibition at agricultural shows may be moved out of the Area without a declaration, if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District from which the sheep are moved, upon production of a veterinary certificate showing freedom from sheep-scab.

*Provision for Movement through the Dipping Area.*

16.—(1.) For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of the Dipping Area in any case where they are moved through the Area by railway from a place outside the Area to another place outside the Area without unnecessary delay and without the sheep being untrucked within the Area.

(2.) Sheep landed in the Dipping Area shall not for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be moved out of the Area, if they are consigned from Ireland to a place of destination outside the Area, but sheep so landed shall be moved from the landing-place forthwith by the most direct route to the nearest available railway station from which the sheep can be moved to the place of destination to which they are so consigned, and forthwith moved by railway out of the Area.

*Movement of Lambs.*

17.—(1.) Where an Inspector of a Local Authority is satisfied that any lambs in the District for which he is appointed Inspector are intended for immediate slaughter, and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should be dipped before movement for such purpose, he may, subject to any directions by the Local Authority appointing him, by licence authorise the exposure for sale of the lambs in any market, fair, or saleyard in the Area, or the movement of the lambs to any premises outside the Area, subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence, and thereupon the lambs may be exposed for sale or moved in accordance with such licence and conditions; Provided that an Inspector of a Local Authority shall not issue any such licence for movement to premises in the District of another Local Authority (such premises being outside the Area), unless the consent of such Local Authority, either generally or in the particular instance, has been previously obtained.

(2.) Lambs may, without being previously dipped, be exposed for sale at any market, fair, or saleyard in the Area which the Local Authority of the District shall have authorised for this purpose, and from which other sheep are excluded.

(3.) Lambs may, without being previously dipped, be moved out of the Area from a market,

fair, or saleyard authorised under this Article, or from any other premises, if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District from which the lambs are to be moved; and such lambs shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and shall be there detained and isolated from other sheep for a period of fifty-six days unless they shall have been dipped during such period in the presence and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority. A copy of the licence shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place of destination specified in the licence. The licence shall be in the Form G set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

(4.) This Article does not apply to lambs more than nine months old.

*Production of Declarations and Licences; Names and Addresses.*

18.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved or exposed for sale where under this Order a declaration or exemption is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the declaration or exemption, if any, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

19. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

20.—(1.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the period within which its dipping is required by this Order shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person fails to give any notice or send any return or declaration required by this Order, or falsely makes any return or declaration for the purposes of this Order, or offers or utters any such return or declaration knowing the same to be falsely made, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a sheep is exposed for sale in any market, fair, or saleyard, in contravention of this Order, the occupier of the premises where the sheep is exposed, and the person exposing the same, and the owner and person in charge of the sheep, and the purchaser thereof, knowing the same to be exposed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the

consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved or exposed for sale, where under this Order a declaration or exemption is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If a sheep is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the sheep is detained, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

21. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Sheep” includes lambs;

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector and any person appointed by a Local Authority to be their Inspector for the purposes of this Order;

“Owner” includes a joint owner;

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries;

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Revocation of Order.*

22.—(1.) The Order described in the Third Schedule to this Order is hereby revoked.

(2.) Forms prepared under, and referring to, that Order may be used under, and shall be read as referring to, this Order.

*Short Title.*

23. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP-DIPPING (SOUTH WALES AND MONMOUTH) ORDER OF 1908.

#### BOROUGH OF LUTON.

In the Matter of the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act, 1905.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Corporation of Luton intend to apply to the Board of Trade for its approval to the Bye-laws more particularly hereunder set forth in accordance with the provisions of sec. 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

#### LUTON CORPORATION TRAMWAYS.

BYE-LAWS made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Luton, acting by the Council as the Promoters of the Luton tramways and as the Local Authority, under and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Luton Corporation Tramways Order, 1905.

#### Interpretation of Terms.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the following words shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them.

"Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Luton, acting by the Council, and shall include any lessees or other persons for the time being working the tramway system hereinafter referred to.

"Tramways Committee" means the Committee for the time being appointed by the Corporation to undertake the control and management of the tramways.

"Tramways" means the tramway system of the Corporation, situate within the borough of Luton.

"Car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers.

"Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car.

"Driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car.

"Officer" means any tramway Inspector or any Inspector of public carriages in the employ of the Corporation, or any member of the Borough Police Force.

#### Application of Bye-Laws and Regulations.

2. The Bye-laws hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all cars of the Corporation, and to all vehicles used upon the tramways, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws.

#### Entering and leaving Cars.

3. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindmost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor or other authorized officer. When a car stops no person shall board the car before any passenger desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

#### Entering a Car when in Motion.

4. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any car which is in motion.

#### Stopping Places.

5. The conductor shall be bound to cause the car to be stopped for the purpose of enabling passengers to enter or leave the same only at such places as may be indicated along the route from time to time by the Tramways Committee.

#### Full Number of Passengers.

6. When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided in such interior, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

When any car contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount or remain thereon. When a car contains the full number of passengers, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the car.

#### Smoking.

7. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette, inside any car except in a compartment (if any) specially set apart for the purpose, nor shall any passenger smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette, on the outside of any car while occupying such front seats of the car as may from time to time be set apart for the use of non-smokers.

#### Spitting.

8. No person shall spit in or on any car.

#### Offensive Language or Conduct.

9. No person shall swear or use obscenity, indecent, or offensive language, or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

10. No person shall play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell, or offer for sale, any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

11. No person shall commit any nuisance in, on or against any car, tramway station, waiting room, or premises used in connection with the tramway system.

#### Intoxicated Persons, &c.

12. No person who is, in the opinion of the conductor, in a state of intoxication, or who from that or any other cause is, in the opinion of the conductor, unfit to be a passenger on a car, shall be allowed to board or enter upon any car, and if any such person be found in or upon any car he shall leave the car immediately on being requested to do so by the conductor.

#### Objectionable Persons.

13. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the seats, linings, or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, and no person, who in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and any such person may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any car, and shall not enter, or be, or remain in or upon any part thereof after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in or upon any car, shall on request of the conductor or other authorized officer, leave the car, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned. Provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon or requested to leave a car under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

#### Persons Suffering from Disease.

14. No person afflicted with any infectious or contagious disease shall board, enter, or travel on any car, and no driver or conductor shall wilfully or knowingly suffer or permit any such person so to do.

#### Payment of Fares.

15. Every passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other authorised officer of the Corporation, the fare legally payable for his journey, and in any case, whether demanded or not, shall pay such fare before leaving the car, and shall obtain a ticket therefor. Such ticket shall not be transferable, and shall be available only for the journey and on the car for and on which the same is issued, except in the case of special, return, season, or transfer tickets. Any person travelling in or upon a car shall do so subject to the conditions shown upon the ticket, and any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey.

16. No person under three years of age who is sitting on the lap of a passenger shall be liable to pay a fare, provided that this provision shall not apply to more than one such child accompanying any one passenger. Any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such person shall pay the full ordinary fare.

#### Tickets.

17. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to any authorised officer of the Corporation, and shall also, when required to do so, either deliver up his ticket, or pay the

fare for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

18. No person shall wilfully alter or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion illegible.

#### Artisans' Tickets.

19. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the tramways, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

#### Dogs.

20. No dog or other animal will be suffered to accompany passengers inside the cars. Any dog or other animal taken into or found on any car shall be removed by the person in charge thereof from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, such dog or other animal may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor. Provided that where by a notice affixed in a conspicuous position on any car, the Corporation shall prescribe conditions upon and subject to which, dogs and other animals may be taken upon any car, this Bye-law shall not prohibit the taking of dogs or other animals on the outside of any such car under and subject to such conditions.

#### Damaging Cars.

21. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, to pay the amount of any damage so done.

#### Luggage.

22. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) not carried by hand, shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform.

#### Firearms, &c.

23. No person shall travel in or on any car with firearms or dangerous articles or things, and no person shall carry or deposit upon any car any luggage, article, instrument, or implement which shall cause hindrance or annoyance to passengers, or which may in the opinion of the conductor be dangerous or offensive to any passengers. Provided that nothing contained in this Bye-law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military, Reserve or Auxiliary forces carrying unloaded firearms.

#### Disabled Cars.

24. If at any time a car becomes disabled or in any way injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fare so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or injured car.

#### Travelling on Step, &c.

25. No passenger or other person not being an authorized officer of the Corporation shall travel or ride on the steps, driver's platform, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car, or stand upon

the upper deck of any car, while the same is in motion, or, except in accordance with the regulations of the Corporation exhibited upon such car, stand in the interior of any car.

26. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or board a car, and no persons shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a car.

#### General Road Traffic.

27. All persons in charge of carts, carriages, or other vehicles, or of animals travelling or being driven on or over, or standing on any part of any road or street in which the tramways are laid, shall, on any car approaching, take or drive them out of the way of the car with all despatch so as to keep the tramway clear for the use of the car. The person in charge of any vehicle or animal who shall not, as soon as possible after the driver of any car has given proper warning, drive or take such vehicle or animal off the tramway rails, so as to allow the car to proceed, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

#### Interference with Duties of Conductor or Driver.

28. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway, and no person other than the conductor or driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car or its equipment.

29. No person shall ring or cause to be rung, any of the signal bells upon any car, so as to effect the unnecessary stoppage of any car, nor in any event signal a car to start.

#### Power to Remove Passengers Committing Offences.

30. Any person who shall commit, whilst on any car, any offence or any breach of these Bye-laws shall, if he persists in the offence after being requested by a conductor to desist, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed by the conductor or other officer from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

#### Conductors and Drivers to Enforce Bye-laws.

31. Every conductor and driver shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations, and prevent the breach thereof.

#### Penalty.

32. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings.

33. There shall be placed, and kept placed, in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use, a printed copy of these Bye-laws.

34. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the 20th day of May, 1908.

The foregoing Bye-laws were made at a meeting of the Council, held on the 17th day of March, 1908.
