MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903. Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF HERTFORD.

Urban District of Rickmansworth.

To the County Council of Hertford;

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the Local Authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Hertford, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned sub-section putting the provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the urban district of Rickmansworth, in the county of Hertford, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the urban district of Rickmansworth which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

SCHEDULE.

Station-road, extending from its junction with Rectory-road to its junction with High-street;

· High-street, extending from its junction with Parsonage-road to its junction with Redpale-road; and

The road leading from High-street, past St. Mary's Church to Moor-lane (otherwise known as the Lower Watford-road).

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

Whereas by the twenty-first section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-Districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient, in the interest of public convenience, that the following changes should be made in certain Sub-Districts of Llandilofawr Registration District, viz.:—
