entire civil parish of Quarter Bach, and of that part of Llandilo Rural civil parish which lies to the south-east of an imaginary line drawn from a point on the eastern boundary of that parish close to the source of the Gwythwch Brook, and a short distance from the north-western boundary of the parish of Quarter Bach at Tair Carn Uchaf, directly to that brook, and thence along the centre of that brook to its junction with the River Loughor, and thence along the centre of that river to the south-western boundary of Llandilo Rural civil parish, such new Sub-District to include also the detached part of Llandilo Rural civil parish situated to the north of the River Annman, and a short distance to the west of the extreme south-western limit of the main portion of the parish; (c) that there should be added to the existing Sub-District of Llandilo that part of the civil parish of Llandilo Rural which is situated between the imaginary line above described and the present boundary of that Sub-District.

2. Now, therefore, I, Sir William Cospatrick Dunbar, Bart., C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and eight.
