CRIMINAL APPEAL ACT, 1907.

Notice is hereby given that the following Additional Rule has been made, with the approval of the Lord Chancellor, by the Lord Chief Justice and the Judges of the Court of Criminal Appeal.

For the purpose of section 16 of the Act proceedings at the trial shall mean the evidence and any objections taken in the course thereof, any statement made by the prisoner, the summing up, and sentence of the Judge of the Court of Trial, but unless otherwise ordered by such Judge shall not include any part of the speeches of counsel or solicitor.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Swansea) Order, 1908.

Dated 7th April, 1908.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the Council of the County Borough of Swansea, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Swansea) Order, 1908."

BIRDS.

Certain Birds protected throughout the Borough during the whole of the Year.

II. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year, and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Borough of Swansea:—

Bittern, Common Buzzard, Chough, Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Common Guillemot, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Wood Lark, House Martin, Nightingale, Nightjar, (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Osprey, Little Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny Owl (Brown Owl, Wood Owl), White or Barn Owl, Puffin, Raven, Razorbill, Siskin, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Birds protected during the whole of the Year within a Certain Area.

III. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year, and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is

prohibited on the sands and seashore in the Borough of Swansea.

All Birds protected on Sundays throughout the Borough.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year, and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the Borough of Swansea.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the Borough.

V. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Borough of Swansea.

Bittern, Common Buzzard, Chough, Kentish Dotterel, Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Common Guillemot, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Wood Lark, House Martin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Water Ouzel, Oyster Catcher, Little Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny Owl (Brown Owl, Wood Owl), White or Barn Owl, Stormy Petrel, Puffin, Raven, Razorbill, Siskin, Lesser Tern, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

THE MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Borough of Bangor.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903"), it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, by regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1896"), prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in their opinion, be especially dangerous:

And whereas by sub-section 1 of Section 9 of the Act of 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

Notice is hereby given, that the Council of the Borough of Bangor have applied to the Local Government Board to make regulations—

(a) Under Section 6 of the Act of 1896, and Section 8 of the Act of 1903, for restricting to five miles per hour the speed at which any motor car may be driven within the limits comprising the following roads, that is to say:—High-street and Dean-street; and

(b) Under sub-section 1 of Section 9 of the Act of 1903 putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the following roads and parts of roads, that is to say:—So much of Holyhead-road as extends from High-street to Menai View Outlook; so much of Carnarvon-road as extends from High-street to the boundary of the borough; Farrar-road; Beach-road, Beach-row and Strand-street; Garth-road and so much of Menai-road as extends therefrom to the westerly end of Garth-Terrace; College-road and Upper Garth-road, and Friddoedd-road.

Notice is hereby further given, that objections to the making of any such regulations, or either of them, may be sent in writing to the Local Government Board at their offices at Whitehall, London, on or before the twenty-seventh day of April, 1908.

A copy of any such objection should be sent at the same time by the objector to the Council of the said Borough, addressed to the Town Clerk.

INCOME TAX.

Purposes for the said division of Wellingborough, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners, as may be sufficient to increase the number of such Commissioners to any number not exceeding fourteen, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners to any number not exceeding fourteen.

ORDER OF 1908.**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1908, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of the District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in

one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

6. This Order may be cited as the FLINTSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1908.
