W HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Commission dated the seventeenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eight, to nominate and appoint the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the Prime Minister, and the Lord President of the Council, or any two of them, in His Majesty's absence from His Realm in Foreign Parts, and in the absence of the Prince of Wales, to hold on His Majesty's behalf, His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His approval of any matter or thing whereunto they should be so authorized by writing under His Majesty's behalf any matter or thing for the purposes of the said Commission whereunto they should be authorized in manner aforesaid:

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the nineteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eight, His Majesty has provided for the transfer, on and from the first April, one thousand nine hundred and eight, to the Territorial Force of certain units of Yeomanry and Volunteers, and for the election by the officers and men of such units whether they will become subject to certain provisions of the Territorial

and Reserve Forces Act, 1907, referred to in the Order, and for the acceptance under certain conditions, as members of the Territorial Force, of officers and men so electing, and for the disposal of other officers and men of such units; and has, in connection with such transfer, made certain provisions with reference to the property belonging to or held for the benefit of such units:

And whereas it is expedient to transfer to the Territorial Force the Volunteer units detailed in the first column of the schedule appended hereto, and to make similar provisions in relation to the officers and men of these units and the property belonging to them or held for their benefit:

Now, therefore, the Lord Chancellor and the Lord President, being authorized thereto by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, do, on behalf of His Majesty, order, as it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The units of Volunteers detailed in the first column of the Schedule appended hereto shall, as from the first April, one thousand nine hundred and eight, be transferred to the Territorial Force, and shall thereafter be units of the Territorial Force, and shall be respectively known by the titles specified in the second column of the said Schedule, and the said Order in Council of nine-teenth March, one thousand nine hundred and eight, shall accordingly have effect as if the Schedule to this Order formed part of the Schedule to that Order.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Commission dated the seventeenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eight, to nominate and appoint the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the Prime Minister, High and the Lord President of the Council, or any two of them, in His Majesty's absence from His Realm in Foreign Parts and in the absence of the Prince of Wales, to hold, on His Majesty's behalf, His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His approval of any matter or thing whereunto they should be so authorized by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, and to do further on His Majesty's behalf any matter or thing for the purposes of the said Commission whereunto they should be authorized in manner aforesaid:

And whereas provision is made in Part III (Section thirty-three) of the Territorial and Reserve Forces Act, 1907, for the formation of special reservists into regiments, battalions, or

other military bodies:

And whereas it is provided by Section thirtyfour of the said Act that His Majesty may by Order in Council transfer to the Army Reserve such battalions of the Militia as may be specified in such Order: and that every battalion so transferred shall, from the date mentioned in the said Order, be deemed to have been lawfully formed under Part III of the said Act as a battalion of special reservists; and that the said Order may contain such provisions as may seem necessary for applying the provisions of the Reserve Forces Acts, 1882 to 1906, as amended by the said Act, to the officers and men of the battalions so transferred:

And whereas the expression "battalion" in the said Act, having the same meaning as in the Army Act, in its application to artillery and engineers means any body into which His Majesty may have been pleased to divide such artillery or engineers:

Now, therefore, The Lord Chancellor and The Lord President being authorized thereto by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, do, on behalf of His Majesty, order, as

it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

(1) Each of the battalions or other bodies (hereinafter referred to as "units") of the Militia detailed in the first column of the Schedule appended hereto shall, on and from the day following the completion of the period of annual training in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight prescribed for such unit by the Army Council, be transferred to the Army Reserve, and shall thereafter be deemed to have been duly formed as, and shall be, a unit of special reservists, and shall be known by the short title specified against it in the second column of the said schedule.

(2) All officers and men of the units detailed in the first column of the said schedule shall, before a date to be fixed by the Army Council, elect whether they will assent to such transfer,

or not.

(3) The Commanding Officer of every such unit shall certify in writing to the Army Council as soon as may be after the date so fixed, in regard to each officer and man in the unit, whether he assents to be transferred to the Army Reserve as aforesaid; and shall further certify in regard to each officer so assenting, whether he is willing to become subject to the conditions and liabilities laid down in His Majesty's Royal Warrant of the third April, one thousand nine hundred and eight, relating to the Special Reserve of Officers.

(4) Officers who are certified to have so assented and to be willing to become subject to

the said conditions and liabilities will, provided that they are recommended by the Commanding Officer of the unit in which they wish to serve, be gazetted as officers of the Special Reserve of Officers; and men who are certified to have so assented will, subject to a similar proviso, be enlisted in the Army Reserve in accordance with section thirty of the said Act, and with the regulations prescribed by the Secretary of State. The provisions of the Reserve Forces Acts, 1882 to 1907, and of all Orders and regulations duly made under any of those Acts shall, so far as they are applicable, apply to such officers and men.

(5) The case of all officers and men not certified to have assented as aforesaid will be dealt with as may be directed, consistently with their existing conditions of Militia service.

(6) All officers and men of any units which shall have been transferred to the Army Reserve under this Order shall, after such transfer, remain subject, until either they have been gazetted or enlisted (as the case may be) or their cases have been otherwise disposed of as provided above, to the same provisions as regards conditions of service and otherwise, as would have been applicable to them, if the units to which they belong had not been so transferred: Provided that no officer or man shall while so remaining subject to such provisions be permitted to undergo training or to attend drills, unless required to do so, in accordance with the said provisions, by the Army Council.


