THE FAIRS ACT, 1873. BRINSLEY FAIR OR FEAST.

Whereas on the 28th January, 1908, a repre-
sentation was made to me, as Secretary of State
for the Home Department, by the Rural District
Council of Basford to the effect that a Fair or
Feast has been annually held at Brinsley on the
Sunday following Saint James' Day, and that it
would be for the convenience and advantage of
the public that the said Fair or Feast should in
future be held on the Sunday preceding August
Bank Holiday in each year:

And whereas notice of the said representation
and of the time when the same would be taken
into consideration has been duly published in
pursuance of the Fairs Act, 1873:

And whereas on such representation and con-
sideration it appears to me that it would be for

the convenience and advantage of the public that
the said Fair or Feast should in future be held
on the Sunday preceding August Bank Holiday
in each year:

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for the
Home Department, in exercise of the powers
vested in me by the Fairs Act, 1873, do hereby
order that the Fair or Feast which has been
annually held at Brinsley on the Sunday follow-
ing Saint James' Day shall in future be held on
the Sunday preceding August Bank Holiday in
each year.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Borough of Glossop.

WHEREAS by sub-section 1 of section 9 of
the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted
that within any limits or place referred to in
regulations made by the Local Government
Board with a view to the safety of the public,
on the application of the local authority of the
area in which the limits or place are situate, a
person shall not drive a motor car at a speed
exceeding ten miles per hour:

Notice is hereby given, that the Council
of the borough of Glossop have made application
to the Local Government Board for a regulation to
be made in pursuance of the said sub-section
putting the above provisions of that sub-
section in force within the limits comprising the
following roads or parts of roads within the
borough, that is to say:—

Station-road; Woolley Bridge-road; Woolley
Bridge, Brookfield, and Dinting Vale, extending
from Woolley Bridge to High-street West;
High-street West; High-street East.

So much of Sheffield-road as extends for a
distance of 4 furlongs from its junction with
High-street East and Hall-street.

So much of the road leading to Hayfield
(including Victoria-street and Charlestown-road)
as extends for a distance of 7 furlongs and 30
yards from its junction with High-street.

So much of Norfolk-street as extends from its
junction with High-street to its junction with
Charles-street.

Notice is hereby further given, that objections
to the making of any such regulation may be
sent in writing to the Local Government Board
at their offices at Whitehall, London, on or
before the twelfth day of May, 1908.

A copy of any such objection should be sent
at the same time by the objector to the Council
of the said borough, addressed to the Town
Clerk.
