WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Glamorgan) Order, 1908.

Dated 24th April, 1908.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Glamorgan, I hereby make the following Order:—

*Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Glamorgan) Order, 1908."

BIRDS.

*Close Time for Wild Duck varied.*

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Duck is prohibited throughout the County of Glamorgan shall be varied so as to be the period between the 1st day of February and the 1st day of July in any year.

*Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.*

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County of Glamorgan to the

following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Common Buzzard, Golden Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Kestrel, Kite, Wood Lark, House Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Raven, Siskin.

*Certain Birds protected throughout the County during the whole of the Year.*

IV. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the county of Glamorgan:—

Bittern, Common Buzzard, Chough, Golden Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Common Guillemot, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Wood Lark, House Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Osprey, Little Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny Owl (Brown Owl, Wood Owl), White or Barn Owl, Puffin, Raven, Razorbill, Siskin, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

*All Birds protected during the whole of the Year within a Certain Area.*

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as varied, so far as Wild Duck are concerned, by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited on the Promontory known as Worms Head, in the County of Glamorgan.

*All Birds protected on Sundays in Certain Districts.*

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as varied, so far as Wild Duck are concerned, by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited in all the Rural Districts in the County of Glamorgan, and in all the Urban Districts, except Neath Borough, Bridgend, Briton Ferry and Aberavon.

Eggs.

*Certain Eggs protected throughout the County*

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Glamorgan:—

Bittern, Common Buzzard, Chough, Kentish Dotterel, Golden Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Common Guillemot, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Wood Lark, House Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Water Ouzel, Oyster Catcher, Little Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny Owl (Brown Owl, Wood Owl), White or Barn Owl, Stormy Petrel, Puffin, Raven, Razorbill, Siskin, Lesser Tern, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

*All Eggs protected within a Certain Area.*

VIII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited on the Promontory known as Worms Head, in the County of Glamorgan, for a period of five years from the date of this Order.
