The following Address was presented to The King on the arrival of His Majesty at Chester on the evening of the 12th May:—

To The King's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty,

We, Your Majesty's liegemen, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City and County of the City of Chester, in Council assembled, crave leave to tender our most dutiful homage to Your Majesty on Your first visit to our Ancient and Loyal City after Your Accession to the Throne, which is rendered all the more gracious as it is the first occasion on which a King of England has favoured the City with His Presence since the visit of His Majesty William the Third in 1690.

Your trusty servants bear in grateful remembrance the several occasions when Your Majesty, as Earl of Chester, honoured them with Your Gracious Presence, and esteem themselves highly favoured by the close conjunction of this present visit of Your Majesty with that of Your Majesty's well beloved and most noble son, George, Prince of Wales and Earl of Chester.

We desire to render our devout thanks and gratitude to Your Majesty that Your efforts to secure peace among the Nations have, by the blessing of Almighty God, been so abundantly successful, and we earnestly pray that such benediction will continue to attend Your Majesty and Your Illustrious Consort, Queen Alexandra, and that Your Majesty may be spared long to reign as our Sovereign Lord, assured at all times of the most devoted allegiance and sincere affection of the Citizens of this City, and of the free, prosperous, and contented subjects of Your Empire.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I have great pleasure in receiving the loyal and dutiful Address from the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of Chester, which you have handed to Me.

I have not forgotten My connection with your City as Earl of Chester, and from My youth I have always considered Chester one of the most interesting of cities.

The traditions of loyalty and affection to the Sovereigns of this country, which have been handed down to you from the most ancient times, and have been cemented by the visits paid to you by My predecessors, are, I am firmly convinced, cherished by you with as much warmth as at any time in past history.

I regret that the time at My disposal does not permit Me to revisit the beautiful buildings which abound in your City, your splendid Cathedral, and the many interesting memorials of bygone days which attract visitors to you from all parts of the world.

I am grateful for your appreciation of My efforts in the cause of peace. I may assure you that these efforts shall not cease, nor will I spare any exertion which may tend to enhance the welfare of our dear country. I shall long remember the cordial welcome which I have met with to-day.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Cumberland) Order, 1908.

Dated 14th May, 1908.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts. 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Cumberland, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Cumberland) Order, 1908."

BIRDS.

Close Time extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds (other than Plover and Wild Duck) is prohibited within the County of Cumberland shall be extended so as to be between the first day of March and the first day of September in any year, the close time for Plover and Wild Duck remaining as fixed by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, namely, between the first of March and the first day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County of Cumberland to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Corn Crake (or Land Rail), Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Dipper, Turtle Dove, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Kestrel, Kite, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Ring Ouzel, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Quail, Water Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redstart, Tree Sparrow, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Coal Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Twite, Wagtails, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wren, Golden-crested Wren.

The Goldfinch protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 2nd day of March following the killing or taking of the Goldfinch is prohibited throughout the County of Cumberland.

Certain Birds protected on Sundays and on Christmas Day.

V. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 2nd day of March following the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds on Sundays and on Christmas Day is prohibited throughout the County of Cumberland:—

Brambling, Bullfinch, Lapland Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Chaffinch, Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Shore Lark, Sky Lark, Linnet, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Siskin, Tree Sparrow, Twite, Wren, Golden-crested Wren.

Eccs

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Cumberland:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Reed Bunting, Common Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Corn Crake (or Land Rail), Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Cuckoo, Curlew, Dipper, Dotterel, Turtle Dove, Dunlin, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Little Grebe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Linnet, Mallard or Wild Duck, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightjar, Ring Ouzel, Owls, Oyster Catcher, Tree Pipit, Rock Pipit, Golden Plover, Ringed Plover, Quail, Water Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redshank, Redstart, Sandpiper, Shoveller, Skylark, Snipe, Tree Sparrow, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Teal, Terns, Coal Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Twite, Grey Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Woodpeckers, Wren, Golden-crested Wren, and (between the 15th April and the 1st July in each year) Lapwing, Peewit, or Green Plover.

Repeal of former Order.

VII. The Order of the 12th September, 1907, is hereby repealed.

on Monday, the 1st day of June, 1908, at noon, for the purpose of choosing and appointing, according to the regulations of the said Income Tax Act of 1842, such number of fit and proper persons to be Commissioners for General Purposes for the said division of Kingsbridge, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners, as may be sufficient to increase the number of such Commissioners to any number not exceeding fourteen, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners to any number not exceeding fourteen.

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of the District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed

conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

- 2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—
 - (i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

- (ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulatious proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.
- (iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.
- (3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.
