MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

County of Hertford.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Hertford have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the following roads or parts of roads within the Urban District of Barnet, that is to say:—

So much of the Great North-road (including High-street) as is situate within the urban district; Wood-street, extending from its junction with High-street to the western boundary of the urban district; Union-street; New-road, extending from its junction with High-street to the northern boundary of the urban district; Alston-road; and the Avenue.

Notice is hereby further given, that objections to the making of any such regulation may be sent, in writing, to the Local Government Board at their office at Whitehall, London, on or before the ninth day of June, 1908.
