#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Leicester) Order, 1908.

Dated 25th May, 1908.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Leicester, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### *Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Leicester) Order, 1908."

#### **BIRDS.**

*Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.*

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County of Leicester to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Tree Creeper, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), House Martin, Sand Martin, Swallow, Swift, Wagtail (all species).

*The Goldfinch, the Kingfisher and Owls protected during the whole of the Year.*

III. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year, and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the Goldfinch, the Kingfisher and the Owl (all species) is prohibited throughout the County of Leicester.

*Certain Birds protected on Sunday throughout the County.*

IV. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking on Sunday of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Leicester:—

Bittern, Blackbird, Bullfinch, Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Cuckoo, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Tufted Duck, Flycatcher, Goldcrest, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe (Dabchick), Greenfinch (Green Linnet), Hawfinch, Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goatsucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Osprey, Owl (all species), Lesser Redpole, Redshank, Robin, Redstart, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Red-backed Shrike, Siskin, Swallow, Swift, Thrush (all species), Tit (all species), Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Warbler (all species), Waxwing, Woodpecker (all species), Wren, Wryneck.

#### EGGS.

*Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.*

V. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Leicester for a period of five years from the date of this Order:—

Buntings, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Corn Crane (Land Rail), Tree Creeper, Wild Duck (all species), Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe (Dabchick), Hawks, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goatsucker, Night Hawk, or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Osprey, Owls, Water Rail, Redstart, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Shrike (Butcher Bird), Swallow, Swift, Cole Tit, Long-tailed Tit (Bottle Tit, Jack-o'-Bo-peep), Marsh Tit, Wagtails, Blackcap Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Woodpecker (all species), Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Willow Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

#### LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

Portmadoc, Beddgelert and South Snowdon Railway (Light Railway) Order.

The Light Railway Commissioners have re-submitted (with additional provisions for reviving and extending the time for the completion of the works authorised by the North Wales Narrow Gauge Railways (Beddgelert Light Railway Extension) Order, 1900), to the Board of Trade for confirmation, under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made by them authorising the Portmadoc, Beddgelert and South Snowdon Railway Company to reconstruct, construct, and work the railways authorised by the Portmadoc, Beddgelert and South Snowdon Railway Acts, 1901 and 1904, as a light railway under the Light Railways Act, 1896, and authorising the construction of a light railway in the county of Carnarvon, from the termination of the railway authorised by the said Act of 1901 near Beddgelert to Bettws-y-Coed, and amending and consolidating the capital and borrowing powers of the Company, and for other purposes.

**EXTENDING TEMPORARY ORDER** of the Local Government Board; Relief to able-bodied Men, their Wives and Families;—

**PARISH OF POPLAR BOROUGH.**

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Poplar Borough;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order, dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Poplar Union, which is now known as the Parish of Poplar Borough, the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations which are applicable to the administration of outdoor relief to poor persons in the said Parish;

And whereas by an Order, dated the 16th day of January, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), we, the Local Government Board, made temporary provision with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Parish, and by Article III of the Order provided that the Order should operate and have effect until the 30th day of April, 1908;

And whereas it is expedient that such further provision as is hereinafter set forth should be made in relation to the subject-matter of the Order:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We do hereby Order that notwithstanding anything in the Order, the provisions thereof shall be in force and shall have effect until the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

**MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.**

Regulations under Section 9 (1).

**COUNTY OF DENBIGH.**

Urban District of Llanrwst.

To the County Council of Denbigh;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made

by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the Local Authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas We have received and duly considered an application from the County Council of Denbigh for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads and parts of roads situate within the urban district of Llanrwst, in the county of Denbigh:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

**ARTICLE I.**—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads and parts of roads within the urban district of Llanrwst which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

**ARTICLE II.**—These Regulations shall come into operation on the eighth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

**SCHEDULE.**

So much of the main road to Llandudno and Colwyn Bay as extends from its junction with Station-road to the railway bridge;

So much of Station-road as extends from its junction with the main road aforesaid to its termination at Ancaster-square;

Ancaster-square;

Bridge-street, extending from its junction with Pont Fawr to its termination at Ancaster-square;

So much of the main road to Bettws-y-coed as extend from its junction with Pont Fawr to a point in the said main road situate 104 yards or thereabouts south-east of its junction with Conway-terrace.

**MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.**

Warrants and arrests under section 27 of the Bankruptcy Act, 1883.

#### Execution of Warrant.

1.—[84 (a)]. Where a person is apprehended under a warrant issued under section 27 sub-section 2 of the Bankruptcy Act, 1883, the officer apprehending him shall forthwith bring him before the Court issuing the warrant to the end that he may be examined, and if he cannot immediately be brought up for examination or examined the officer shall deliver him into the custody of the governor or keeper of the prison mentioned in the warrant, and the said governor or keeper shall receive him into custody and shall produce him before the Court as it may from time to time direct or order, and subject to such direction or order shall safely keep him.

2.—[84 (b)]. The officer executing a warrant issued under section 27, sub-section 2, shall forthwith, after apprehending the person named in the warrant and bringing him before the Court as in the last preceding Rule mentioned, or after delivering him to the governor or keeper of the prison in the last preceding Rule mentioned, as the case may be, report such apprehension or delivery to the Court issuing the warrant, and apply to the Court to appoint a day and time for the examination of the person so apprehended, and the Court shall thereupon appoint the earliest practicable day for the examination, and shall issue its direction or order to the said governor or keeper to produce him for examination at a place and time to be mentioned in such direction or order. Notice of any such appointment shall forthwith be given by the Registrar to the Official Receiver, trustee, or other person who shall have applied for the examination or warrant.

*Special Provision as to Sheep-Dipping in  
Dartmoor District.*

1.—(1.) The Sheep-Dipping (England) Order of 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") shall in its application to the lands described in the Schedule hereto have effect subject to the provisions of this Order.

- (i.) All sheep (except those exempted by Article 3 of the principal Order) which are on any lands to which this Order applies at any time between the first day of July and the twenty-fourth day of July (including both those dates) in any year during which this Order shall be in operation shall be caused to be dipped between these dates by the owner or person in charge thereof. The dipping shall be carried out on such dates, at such dipping places, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice.
- (ii.) After the twenty-fourth day of July sheep shall not be moved on to any lands to which this Order applies unless the sheep have been previously dipped in the current year under and in accordance with the provisions of this Order or the principal Order, or are exempted by Article 3 of the principal Order.

(2.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by the preceding Article the owner and person in charge of the sheep on the twenty-fourth day of July shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Short Title.*

2. This Order may be cited as the DARTMOOR AND DISTRICT (SHEEP-DIPPING) ORDER OF 1908.

(2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

2.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving information of the existence, or supposed existence, of parasitic mange shall forthwith cause inquiry to be instituted as to the correctness of such information with the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector, or of a veterinary practitioner qualified according to the Act of 1894 to be a Veterinary Inspector.

(2.) The owner and occupier of any premises on which there is a horse affected with, or suspected of, parasitic mange shall give all reasonable facilities for the inquiry by the Local Authority under this Article, and any person failing to give such facilities shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Detention of Animals.*

3.—(1.) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority may serve a Notice (in the Form A set forth in the Schedule to this Order, or to the

like effect) on the occupier of any stable, shed, field or other premises in which there is a horse, ass, or mule, which in his opinion is affected with parasitic mange, and thereupon the following restrictions shall take effect:—

- (i.) The horse, ass, or mule so affected shall not be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises specified in the Notice, except with the written authority, and under the supervision, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and only to some other place of detention; and during the detention it shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, be treated by the owner thereof with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority;
  - (ii.) No other horse, ass, or mule shall be moved out of the stable, shed, field, or other premises, unless on each occasion immediately before the movement it is treated with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority.
- (2.) A Notice under this Order shall remain in force until it is withdrawn by a Notice in writing served on the occupier of the premises by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

*Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.*

4.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:

- (i.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about, any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange:
  - (ii.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be effected:
  - (iii.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect any such place, utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things, at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee, or occupier:
  - (iv.) For requiring the removal by the owner from contact with horses, asses, or mules, of litter used for or about any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange.
- (2.) The mode of disinfection shall be one of those prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (3.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, or to remove any litter, in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, to be cleansed and disinfected, or to remove such litter, and to recover summarily the expenses thereby incurred from such person.

(4.) Where the power conferred by the preceding provisions of this Article is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee, or occupier of the place to be cleansed and disinfected shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

*Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.*

5.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Order.

(2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

*Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.*

6. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences or procedure.

*Exemption of Army Veterinary Service and Veterinary Colleges.*

7. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass, or mule kept in stables of military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Service, or in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

*Offences.*

8.—(1.) If a horse, ass, or mule is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice under this Order, the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the horse, ass, or mule is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of this Order, or of any Regulation made thereunder, the owner and the lessee and the occupier and the person in charge of any place or thing in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any owner, occupier, or person in charge of premises requiring to be cleansed and disinfected fails to give the facilities to a Local Authority required under this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

9. In this Order—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Extent.*

10. This Order extends to the administrative county of Worcester (except the parishes of Conderton, Outsdean, Daylesford, Evenlode, Overbury, and Teddington, transferred by agreement to the county of Gloucester; and the several parishes of Alderminster, Shipston-on-Stour, Tidmington, and Tredington, transferred by agreement to the county of Warwick; but including the parishes of Aston Somerville, Childs Wickham, and Hinton-on-the-Green, transferred by agreement from the county of Gloucester); and also to the county boroughs of Worcester and Dudley.

*Commencement.*

11. This Order shall come into operation on

the eighth day of June, nineteen hundred and eight.

*Short Title.*

12. This Order may be cited as the WORCESTERSHIRE (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER of 1908.

*Application of Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 with Modifications.*

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) shall apply to the Scheduled Area described in the First Schedule hereto, but subject to the modifications hereinafter contained, and such Area shall thereupon cease to form part of any other Area ; Provided that the provisions of the principal Order relating to an Infected Area shall not apply to any part of the Scheduled Area unless such part is for the time being declared by Order of the Board to be, or form part of, a Swine-Fever Infected Area.

*Regulation of Sales and Exhibitions of Swine in Scheduled Area.*

2.—(1.) No market, fair, or sale of swine shall be held in the Scheduled Area except a sale held in accordance with the following conditions :—

- (i.) All the swine exposed at the sale must have been on the premises where the sale is held for a continuous period of twenty-eight days immediately before the date of the sale ; and no pig must have been moved on to those premises within such period, except swine moved temporarily therefrom for purposes of exhibition or moved for breeding, and the swine exposed at the sale must not within the said period have been in

contact with any pig so moved on to the premises within such period ;

- (ii.) The swine must not be affected with swine-fever or have been exposed to the infection of swine-fever during the said period ; and  
(iii.) The sale must not be held in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and the movement of the swine must not have been prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(2.) No exhibition of swine shall be held in the Scheduled Area except with a licence of the Local Authority of the District.

*Revocation of Order.*

3. The Order described in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby revoked, subject to Article 12 (*Effect of Revocation of Orders and Regulations*) of the Animals (Transit and General) Amendment Order of 1904.

*Commencement.*

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Application of Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 with Modifications.*

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) shall apply to the Scheduled Area described in the Schedule hereto, but subject to the modifications hereinafter contained. Provided that the provisions of the principal Order relating to an Infected Area shall not apply to any part of the Scheduled Area, unless such part is for the time being declared by Order of the Board to be, or form part of, a Swine-Fever Infected Area.

*Regulation of Movement of Swine to Markets.*

2.—(1.) Swine shall not be moved into a market, fairground or saleyard from premises in the Scheduled Area unless accompanied by a licence (Form A) granted either by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the swine are to be moved are situate or by an Inspector of the

Local Authority of the District in which the market, fairground or saleyard is situate, and the provisions of paragraphs (2) to (4) of Article 3 of the principal Order shall apply as if repeated in this Article. The Declaration required for this Licence shall be the Declaration (Form B) with the paragraph (b) struck out.

(2.) This Article does not apply to a market or saleyard specially authorised by the Local Authority under the principal Order or under the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904.

*Regulation of Movement of Swine from Markets.*

3.—(1.) The movement of Swine from any market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area shall be subject to the following provisions of this Order.

(2.) In the case of swine moved into the market, fairground or saleyard from premises outside the Scheduled Area with a licence (Form A) the provisions of Article 4 of the principal Order shall apply to the subsequent movement of the swine.

(3.) If the market or saleyard is specially authorised by the Local Authority under the principal Order or under the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, the movement of the swine exposed at the market or saleyard shall be subject to the provisions of the Order under which the market or saleyard is so authorised.

(4.) In the case of any other movement of swine from a market, fairground or saleyard the movement shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(i.) The swine shall be accompanied by a licence (Form C) granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fairground or saleyard is situate.

(ii.) If the place of destination is outside the Scheduled Area it must be a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or the premises from which the swine were moved to the market, fairground or saleyard.

(iii.) The swine shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and only if accompanied by a licence (Form C) authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are detained.

(iv.) Swine moved with a licence under this Article to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(v.) Swine while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from all other swine.

*Regulation of Markets, &c., in Scheduled Area.*

4. No sale of swine shall be held in any market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area unless it is authorised by the Local Authority of the District (which authority the Local Authority are hereby empowered to grant).

*Effect of Licences granted under this Order.*

5. No licence shall be required under the principal Order for the movement into a Scheduled Area of swine which are being moved under and in accordance with a licence granted under this Order.

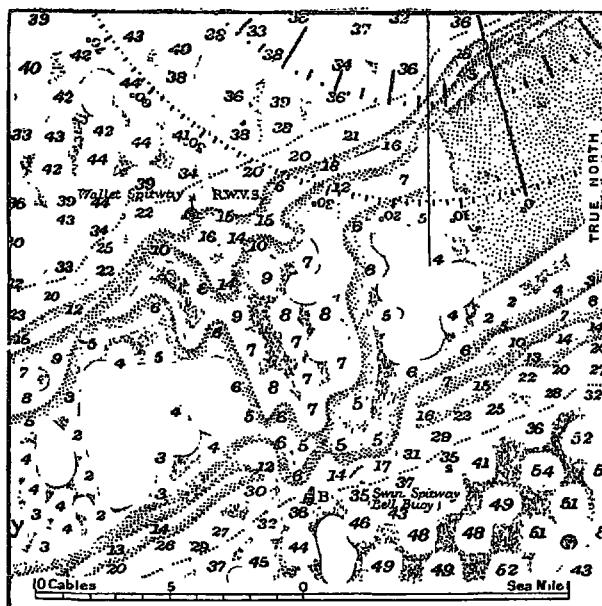
