MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903. Regulations under Section 8. BOROUGH OF KENDAL.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Kendal;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We, the Local Government Board, may, by Regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in Our opinion, be especially dangerous;

And whereas the Town Council of the Borough of Kendal having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the abovementioned sections restricting the driving of motor cars on certain highways and parts of highways situate within the Borough of Kendal (hereinafter referred to as "the Borough"), We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, do hereby, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations;—

ARTICLE I.—A person shall not drive a motor car at a greater speed than ten miles an hour on the highways or parts of highways within the borough which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eight.
