COUNTY OF CARNARVON.

URBAN DISTRICT OF CRICCIETH.

To the County Council of Carnarvon;-And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (bereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per

And whereas the County Council of Carnarvon, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned Sub-section putting the provisions of that Subsection in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the Urban District of Criccieth, in the county of Carnarvon, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the Urban District of Criccieth which are

specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-ninth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

Section 79.—Relating to dangerous riding and driving in any thoroughfare rendering persons so doing liable to a penalty of forty shillings and to be arrested without warrant by any constable who witnesses the offence.

Section 86.—Whereby dealers in old metal or marine store dealers are required to register their names, place of abode, and every place of business, and also enter in a book to be kept for that purpose the description and price of every article purchased with the name, address, and description of the seller. Penalty for non-compliance, five pounds. Duly authorised officer of Local Authority to have free access at all reasonable times to inspect such places of business, and the books required to be kept by this section.






